Advocacy: the voice of small business in government

Advocacy Comments on the Department of Health and Human Services, National Toxicology Program's Report on Carcinogens

On November 22, 2011, the Office of Advocacy (Advocacy) submitted a comment letter to the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) discussing Advocacy's views on HHS' National Toxicology Program's (NTP) Report on Carcinogens (RoC). The comment letter was submitted during a request for public comment on the NTP's proposed RoC review process which closes on November 30, 2011. Advocacy's comment letter includes the following points:

- Advocacy shares small business concerns that a lack of rigorous scientific inquiry and
 methodology, procedural inadequacies, and the duplication of assessments will have a
 substantial, negative economic impact on their business. The placement of a chemical in
 a RoC has the potential to substantially stigmatize a chemical post-listing. Identifying a
 chemical's risk correctly is vital because the stigmatism may lead to substantial adverse
 economic impacts for small businesses that use that chemical.
- Advocacy welcomes the NTP's efforts to review the RoC process by inviting public
 comment, but does not believe that the proposed review process makes any substantial or
 necessary changes. In fact, the NTP's removal of peer review and public comment
 opportunities in the proposed review document will further hinder the RoC by decreasing
 the level of transparency.
