Instrument Flight Rules (IFR) Charts

Low Altitude Chart

- Aeronautical information for navigation below 18,000 feet MSL.
- Depicts: air traffic services, airports with an instrument approach, Victor routes and RNAV T routes with associated route data, cruising altitudes, reporting points, and air traffic control reporting points.
- In addition, charts include: limits of controlled airspace, special use areas,
 Military Training Routes, Off Route
 Obstruction Clearance Altitudes, and radio aids to navigation.

High Altitude Chart

- Aeronautical information for navigation at or above 18,000 feet MSL.
- Depicts: jet routes and RNAV Q routes
 with associated route data, cruising
 altitudes, reporting points, and Navigation
 Reference System waypoints.

Area Chart

- Shows congested terminal areas and are included with subscriptions to any conterminous U.S. Low set.
- Coverage includes: Conterminous U.S.
 Low Altitude Charts,
 Alaska Low Altitude Area
 Charts, and Caribbean
 Area Charts.
