

- Draft report: 37 states' responses
 - 50 responses in phase 2 (w/ DC)!
- New information has been added
 - Species Matrix
 - Legislature vs. Commission for laws
 - disease testing
 - Number of permits issued
- Version 1.01 is FINAL pending last formatting and edits



Preliminary Findings



- State approaches and regulations vary considerably
- 100% allow scientific/educational use
 - with restrictions (limits, seasons, etc.)
 - 98% (49/50) require permit
 - Of those, 94% (46/49) require reporting

Preliminary Findings: Commercial Use

- 84% (42/50) allow some commercialization
 - 78.6% (33/42) have reporting requirements
 - 8 states unequivocally prohibit commercialization
- Turtle-specific (unprotected turtles):
 - 67.3% (33/49) allow some commercial harvest
 - 6 states have no limits/exclusions
 - 63.6% (28/49) allow some turtle farming
 - 8 (4) share regulatory authority w/ State Ag Dept
 - 25 states allow some wild augmentation of brood stock

Preliminary Findings: Personal Use



- 96% (48/50) allow some personal or hobby collection
 - 58.3% (28/48) require permit
 - 10 states have reporting requirements
- Turtle-specific (unprotected turtles):
 - 67.3% (33/49) allow some personal collection of turtles
 - 6 states have no limits/exclusions

- Determine their state's relative status
- Identify other states' approaches
- Facilitate communication & collaboration among states to address challenges in regulating herpetofauna use
- Modify existing regulations as necessary

Quick reference for

- Law Enforcement, Biologists & Policy-makers
- Species
 - Neighboring states' policies/protections
 - Endangered, Threatened & SGCN
 - Native vs. non-native
 - Identify which species can be collected

Preliminary Recommendations



- Apply the North American Model to herpetofauna
 - Regulate commercialization
 - Instate reporting requirements for commercial and personal collection
 - Review/monitor reporting data for sustainable harvest
- Review and analyze reporting data from existing permits for commercial harvest
- Prioritize monitoring, baseline population surveys for native herpetofauna sensitive to overharvest
- Propose additional regulations or increased fines for native herpetofauna sensitive to overharvest
- When laws exist for non-commercialization, eliminate distinction between captive bred and wild-caught animals

NEED for CAPACITY



- Only ~1/3 of states have full-time herpetologists
- Law Enforcement staff
 - Large patrol areas
 - May lack herp-specific expertise
