

1. General Situation

- 1.1. A powerful 7.2-magnitude earthquake struck eastern Turkey on Sunday (23 October 2011). The earthquake activity process is still going on. Totally 1.139 quakes were recorded with magnitudes according to below list:
- 1.1.1 2 3 magnitude 307 times;
- 1.1.2 3 4 magnitude 621 times;
- 1.1.3 4 5 magnitude 95 times;
- 1.1.4 5 6 magnitude 6 times.
- 1.2. The death toll reaches **570** people, while the number of injured people reaches **2.555**. The number of alive people who have been rescued by crews from the rubble is 187.
- 2. National resources available for disaster response and measures taken:
- 2.1. In total **4.136** search-rescue personnel, 904 health personnel, 18 search dog, 651 construction machinery and vehicle, 147 ambulance (7 of them air ambulance), **86** generators, 77 projecters, 95 portable wc, **34.520** tents, **54 public shelter tents, 67 general reasons tents,** 60 pre-fabricated houses, 11 field hospitals (4 of them are active), **135.822** blankets, **1.179 quilts,** 11.184 food parcel, 37 portable kitchen, 3.051 kitchen set, **6.798** catalytic stoves, **5609** sleeping bags, 1 mobile oven and 13 tonnes food packages have been delivered to the region.

- 4. Assistance provided by EAPC nations:
- 4.1 According to the Armenian Ministry of Emergency Situations an Armenian plane delivered 40 tonnes of emergency supplies including tents, sleeping bags and blankets on 27 October.
- **4.2** Azerbaijan Government sent 3 IL-76 planes with rescue teams of the Ministry of Emergency Situations and necessary equipments to Van.
 - First plane with 145 personnel of rescuers arrived Turkey on 23 October
 - Other 2 plains with 250 tents, 3000 blankets, 2700 sleeping bags (700 of them are field sleeping bags), 2 kitchen set and 66 more rescuers have been sent to Van on 24 October.

On 27 October Azerbaijan Government sent a convoy of 40 trucks with 1000 tents (each of them is 24 sq. m.), more than 2000 blankets, 40 kitchen set to Van and is expected to arrive in Van on 28 October.

- 4.2 Great Britain has pledged emergency tents for more than 5.500 people whose homes were destroyed.
- 4.3 Romanian assistance consisting of 100 family tents, 5 persons capacity each (weighting 15.57 tones, volume 33 cub. m.) transported by a military aircraft belonging to the Ministry of Defense of Romania.
- 4.4 Slovak Republic offers 10 family tents. Slovakia is ready to transport the material within 48 hours by their own means of transport to the relevant EU country which organizes transport to Turkey.
- 4.5 Total list of International Assistance to Turkey till 27 October:
- 4.5.1 Azerbaijan a search-rescue team with 140 personnel, 1.250 tents, 700 sleeping bags, 40 generators, 5.000 blankets, 40 kitchen set;
- 4.5.2 Bulgaria 200 tents, 800 blankets, 133 stoves;
- 4.5.3 Egypt 300 tents;
- 4.5.4 France 490 tents:
- 4.5.5 Israel 5 pre-fabricated houses;
- 4.5.6 Kazakhistan 60 tents, 300 blankets, 60 stoves;
- 4.5.7 Russia 284 tents;
- 4.5.8 Ukraine 4 general reasons tents;
- 4.5.9 UN OCHA 400 tents.

- 5. Points of Entry / Delivery:
- 5.1. Donated materials are to be transported by land to an "Assistance Delivery Center", which is being set up in Van and a second one in Erzurum Airport for air transportation. It is important that assistance is delivered directly to these centers. Assisting countries should apply to the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Turkey.
