1. General Situation

1.1. A powerful 7.2-magnitude earthquake struck eastern Turkey on Sunday (23 October 2011). The earthquake activity process is still going on. **Totally 1.561 quakes were recorded with magnitudes according to below list:**

- 1.1.1 2 3 magnitude 556 times;
- 1.1.2 3 4 magnitude 832 times;
- 1.1.3 4 5 magnitude 108 times;
- 1.1.4 5 6 magnitude 7 times.

1.2 The death toll reaches **601** people, while the number of injured people reaches **4.100.** The number of alive people who have been rescued by crews from the rubble is **231.**

1.3 A technical committee of 20 personnel from Turkish Presidency and 200 technical personnel from different provinces has started preliminary damage assessment. Up to now, 16.356 buildings and households have been assessed in Van Central district and its villages, Ercis district and its neighborhood. 3.713 of 5.922 buildings have been detected as damaged-nonhabitable, 2209 of them have been detected as damaged-nonhabitable. 5.270 of 8.696 buildings (households) have been detected as damaged-habitable. 3.446 of them have been detected as damaged-habitable. Preliminary damage assessment will continue. Schools are closed in Van and Ercis.



2. National resources available for disaster response and measures taken:

2.1. In total **4.446** search-rescue personnel, **1796** health personnel, 18 search dog, 651 construction machinery and vehicle, **173** ambulance (7 of them air ambulance), **143** generators, **77 reflectors**, **141** portable wc, **43.367** tents, **54 cluster tents**, **109 tents for general usage**, 60 pre-fabricated houses, 11 field hospitals (**6** of them are active), **165.531** blankets, 1.179 quilts, 11.184 food parcel, 37 portable kitchen, 3.051 kitchen set, **6.899** catalytic stoves, **5792** sleeping bags, **2300** Mevlana type pre-fabricated houses, 1 mobile oven and 13 tonnes food packages have been delivered to the region.
