Miriam Perlberg serves as the Senior Director for Cybersecurity Policies on the National Security Staff, reporting to the Cybersecurity Coordinator.

Most recently, she was the Associate Director for Strategy, Programs and Performance for Data Acquisition at the National Security Agency, responsible for aiding the Data Acquisition Leadership Team both in developing and executing its access, collection, and exploitation strategy and in establishing mechanisms and measures to assess the associated operational and technical performance. Ms. Perlberg began government service with NSA as a mathematician, but left civilian service to accept a commission in the United States Navy. Her 23-year Navy career culminated in assignments as the Commanding Officer of the Naval Security Group Activity, Sabana Seca, Puerto Rico; on the staff of the Chief of Naval Operations; as the Chief of NSA's Information Warfare Support Center; and as the Director of Intelligence (J2) of United States Strategic Command's Joint Task Force – Computer Network Operations. Following retirement from the Navy, Ms Perlberg returned to NSA, serving in assignments in Tailored Access Operations, as the Data Acquisition Strategist, and, on a rotational assignment, as the Director, Joint Interagency Cyber Task Force in the Office of the Director of National Intelligence.

Ms. Perlberg graduated from Georgetown University with a Bachelor of Science in mathematics. She was awarded a Master of Arts in National Security and Strategic Studies from the United States Naval War College and a Master of Science in Administration from Central Michigan University.
