## STATEMENT

on 24 December 1972, while on a bombing mission on the railroad marshaller yords at Thai Nguyen in number 3 aircraft of Ruby cell. I observed a target on my radar scope 8:30 Cleicek, low at 8 miles. I immediately notified the crew and the bryie started closing rapidly. It stabilized at 4,000 yards 6:30 Cleicek low. At this time I locked on the bandit. He started closing very replaity. I called the pilot for evasive action and the EWO for chaft and clares. When the target got to 2,000 yards, I notified the crew that i was firing. I fired at the bandit until it walkeened to 3 times in it tends to then suddenly disappeared from my redar scope at approximately 1,200 yards, 6:30 low. I expended 800 rounds in 7 bursts. I did not of victors but stayed in the scope monitoring for other targets.

## STATEMENT

On the night of 24 December 1972, I was the gunner in the number 2 aircraft in Ruby cell. I observed a bandit at 12,000 yards low. He closed from the 8:30 O'clock position into 6,000 yards at 6:30 low. At this time I called my crew to begin maneuvers. Due to a partially collapsed scope and the proximity of number 3 I did not fire. I went visual and saw the bandit on fire and falling away. Several pieces of the aircraft exploded and the fire-ball disappear so in the undercast at my 6:30 position.
