

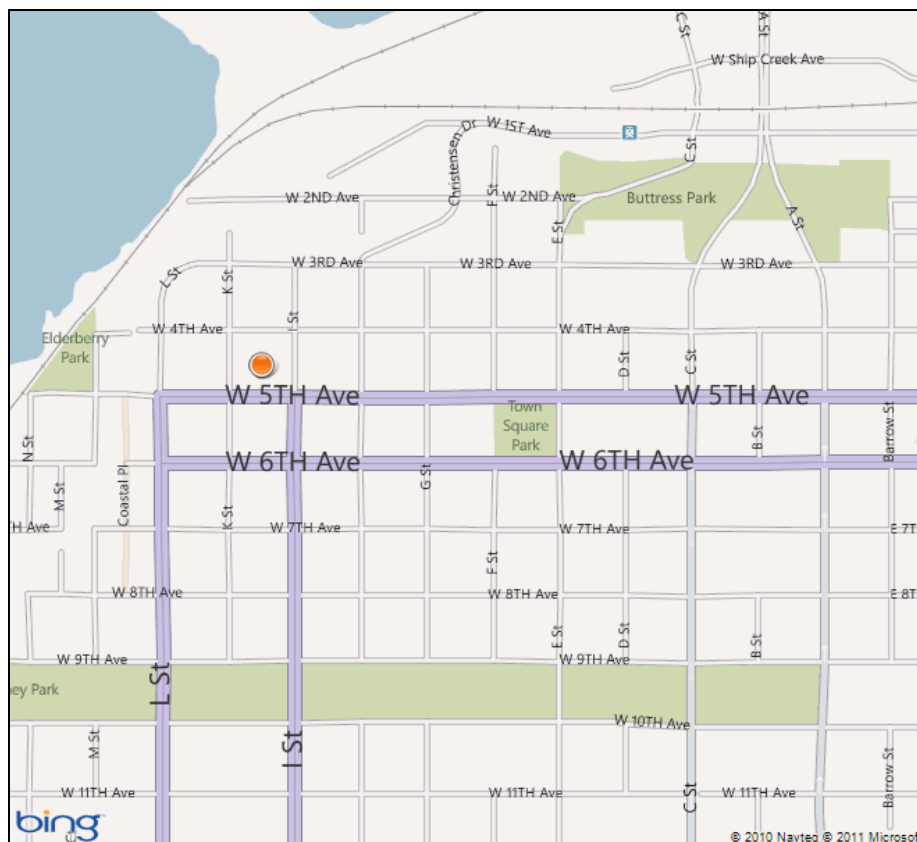
# 106 Essentials Course: Anchorage, AK

“The Section 106 Essentials” will be held on Tuesday and Wednesday, July 10-11, 2012

**Important note:** Classes are filled on a first come/first served basis of registrations received with payment at the Advisory Council on Historic Preservation (ACHP). You must be confirmed by the ACHP to be admitted to class.

**Registration:** Payment may be made by on-line credit card registration or by check or SF 182. Go to: <http://www.achp.gov/106essentials.html> to register.

**Course Location and Accommodations:** The course is being held at The Captain Cook, 939 West 5<sup>th</sup> Avenue, Anchorage, AK 99501 (<http://captaincook.com/>). A limited block of rooms has been secured for attendees for Monday and Tuesday, July 9 and 10 at the government rate of \$181 for a single occupancy plus applicable state and local taxes. **It is recommended that you make your reservations early, as the rooms are likely to sell out. Reservations must be made by June 11, 2012.** Reservations made after that date will be accepted on a space available basis at whatever rate is available at the time of the reservation. **To reserve your room**, call the reservation department at 1-800-843-1950 and state that you are with the Advisory Council on Historic Preservation and ask for the rate of \$181.



**Traveling to Anchorage:** The Anchorage International Airport (ANC) is 6.2 miles, 13 minutes from the hotel.

**Hotel and Local Information:** All Hotel guestrooms offer majestic views of the Cook Inlet, Chugach Mountains, Anchorage cityscape or Mt McKinley. A sense of history envelops the Hotel Captain Cook. Captain James Cook was a British explorer and cartographer whose three major voyages took him around the southern tips of Africa and South America, to Easter Island and, on his final voyage, along Alaska's majestic coastline. On these voyages, he and his crew documented the people, animals and flora and fauna that many had never seen before. In June of 1778, while looking for a Northwest Passage to Hudson Bay, he and his crew on the HMS Resolution dropped anchor in Turnagain Arm—within sight of the spot where the Hotel Captain Cook stands today. An earthquake in 1964 leveled much of downtown Anchorage, and many in town were hesitant to rebuild. Walter J. Hickel was more optimistic and had already been investing in Alaska's future for decades, building hotels and business centers as well as serving as Alaska's governor, all with an eye to making Alaska the American gateway to the Pacific Rim. The Hotel has prospered and expanded with the times: the first Tower opened in 1965, followed by Tower II in 1972 and Tower III in 1978.

**Registration:** Registration will be located outside the conference room on Tuesday at 8:00 a.m. Plan to stop by the registration desk to check in and to pick up your course notebook and other course materials.

**Schedule:** *The Section 106 Essentials* course runs from 8:30 a.m. to approximately 4:30 p.m. each day. Short breaks will be given in the morning and afternoon with a longer break for lunch.

**Meals:** Light morning fare and an afternoon snack are provided each day. The cost of this food is included in your registration fee. All other meals are on your own.

**Attire for Training Course:** Attire for the course is casual. Also, please keep in mind that hotel meeting rooms tend to be cool, so plan to bring a sweater or jacket.

**Cancellations:** Registrants who cancel at least 14 days prior to the start of the course will receive a full refund minus a 15% processing fee. No refunds will be given for cancellations made fewer than 14 days before the start of the course; however, substitutions may be made at no cost up until three days before the course begins. All cancellations must be made in writing.
