The purpose of the matching programs is to verify the eligibility of DoD Medicare eligible persons to continue to receive DoD medical (i.e., TRICARE) benefits. By law, such benefits may only be provided if the person is eligible for Medicare Part A and is enrolled in Medicare Part B. Because Medicare information can only be obtained from HHS, matching must occur irrespective of the associated costs or anticipated benefits if DoD is to make eligibility determinations as mandated by Congress.
