This modification is issued to update the following contract Sections: 1) Part II, Section I – Contract Clauses Table of Contents and 2) Part II, Section I – Contract Clauses as follows:

- A. In Section I, Contract Clauses, Table of Contents, the following clause title revision is made to Clause No. I.33 FAR 52.204-11 American Recovery and Reinvestment Act Reporting Requirements: Delete "(MAR 2009)" and replace with "(JUL 2010)".
- B. In Section I, Contract Clauses, delete Clause I.33 FAR 52.204-11 American Recovery and Reinvestment Act Reporting Requirements (MAR 2009), previously incorporated under Modification #44, and replace with the following:
  - CLAUSE I.33. FAR 52.204-11 American Recovery and Reinvestment Act Reporting Requirements (JUL 2010)
- (a) *Definitions*. For definitions related to this clause (*e.g.*, contract, first-tier subcontract, total compensation etc.) see the Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs) available at <a href="http://www.whitehouse.gov/omb/recovery">http://www.whitehouse.gov/omb/recovery</a> faqs contractors.
