This is in response to your August 7 letter indicating your experience with a [REDACTED] gas oven.

The Consumer Product Safety Commission has no specific authority to advise consumers as to their recourse in a case of possible unfair assessment of charges by a retailer.

The primary function of the Commission is to protect the public against unreasonable risks of injury associated with consumer products. Accordingly, we are concerned with the potential hazard presented by the gas leak from your oven's control. In order that we may contact the responsible firm and take appropriate action, we request that you provide us with the oven's name or model number, serial number, style, date of purchase, and any other information that you may have available.
