### Report to the President and Congress Pursuant to Section 209 of the Consumer Product Safety Improvement Act of 2008

The United States Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC) is submitting to the President, the Congress, and the public this report as required under section 27(j) (15 U.S.C. 2076(j)) of the Consumer Product Safety Act (CPSA) as amended by the Consumer Product Safety Improvement Act of 2008 (CPSIA). The content of this report is specified in the CPSA and CPSIA. This report describes many of the activities performed to protect the public from hazardous consumer products. Readers may also be interested in CPSC's 2009 Performance and Accountability Report, required by the Government Performance and Results Act. All reports are available on CPSC's Web site <a href="https://www.cpsc.gov">www.cpsc.gov</a>.

CPSC (or the Commission), established by Congress in 1972, is the federal regulatory body tasked to protect children and families from unreasonable risks of injuries associated with consumer products. Through the years, the consumer product world has changed dramatically. The production of consumer goods has migrated from the United States to locations all around the world, often in less regulated environments. The number of producers, importers, brokers, distributors and retailers involved in the supply chain has grown exponentially. The entire consumer product world is more complex, and changing rapidly. In recent years, a record number of recalls demonstrated the many challenges of this new consumer product world.

CPSC stands for safety, and has been effective in reducing consumer product-related injury and death rates by using a wide range of strategies to identify and address product safety hazards. These strategies are:

- Hazard Identification and Monitoring: collecting information and monitoring injury and death statistics related to the use of products under CPSC's jurisdiction;
- Safety Standards: participating in the development and strengthening of voluntary safety standards and developing mandatory standards;
- Compliance and Enforcement: enforcing compliance with standards through compliance activities, such as recalls or other corrective actions, and litigating when necessary;
- Public Outreach: educating foreign governments, industry, and consumers about product safety standards and issues, alerting the public to safety hazards, and informing them of safe practices; and
- Intergovernmental Coordination: coordinating on product safety issues with other governmental stakeholders.

The report is organized around the five strategies noted above.

### HAZARD IDENTIFICATION AND MONITORING

The Commission, in fulfilling its mission to protect the public against unreasonable risks of injuries associated with consumer products, collects, reviews and analyzes data on deaths, injuries, and societal costs associated with such products. This section describes the "Incidence of Injury and Effects to the Population" associated with products under the jurisdiction of the Commission. Four tables present summary data by totals and by age groups for:

- o Product-related deaths;
- o Product-related injuries;
- o Percent of emergency room visits resulting in hospitalization; and
- o Estimated costs of injuries.

**Product-Related Deaths** (Table 1). CPSC collects mortality data through contracts with each state. CPSC reviews about 8,000 death certificates each year covering unintentional product-related deaths from all 50 states, the District of Columbia, and New York City. CPSC purchases death certificates that have a high probability of consumer product involvement; therefore these data are a minimal count of deaths. While the deaths and injuries in this table represent product involvement, that involvement does not necessarily indicate causality.

**Product-Related Injuries** (Table 2). Each year, CPSC collects information about product-related injuries through its National Electronic Injury Surveillance System (NEISS). This unique system provides statistically valid national estimates of product-related injuries from a probability sample of hospital emergency rooms (ER) and is the foundation for many CPSC activities. These injury reports not only provide the means for estimating the magnitude of consumer product-related injuries in the United States, but also provide a source for gathering further information concerning the nature and probable cause of the accident. Several foreign governments have modeled their national injury data collection systems after CPSC's system. Annually, NEISS supplies over 360,000 product-related cases from a sample of about 100 hospitals. The hospitals transmit incident information electronically and, in some cases, the data are available within 24 hours after an incident. While the deaths and injuries in this table represent product involvement, that involvement does not necessarily indicate causality.

**ER Cost Estimation** (Tables 3 & 4). To estimate costs of injuries, CPSC employs the Revised Injury Cost Model. The costs reported in this report do not include the costs of consumer product-related injuries that were treated elsewhere, such as in physicians' offices, health maintenance organizations, and freestanding urgent care clinics. Estimates also do not include the economic losses of fatalities associated with the use of consumer products. These losses may be substantial. Furthermore, cost estimates are not available for many acute and chronic illnesses associated with exposure to chemical hazards. The number and cost of these illnesses are expected to be large.

**Product Groups.** Products are aggregated into 15 product groupings (see pgs. 9-10). These products are described in the NEISS Coding Manual (2009), Directorate for Epidemiology, U.S. CPSC. (<a href="http://www.cpsc.gov/neiss/completemanual.pdf">http://www.cpsc.gov/neiss/completemanual.pdf</a>)

**Additional Data.** For products where Commission remedial action has been considered, additional data are collected and analyzed to develop more detailed estimates. Based on interviews with victims or witnesses, the Commission identifies causes of incidents, including the interaction among the person, the product and the environment. Using all the available data, the Commission staff periodically prepares hazard analysis reports for selected products. To learn

### October 1, 2007 - September 30, 2008\*

This table presents the estimates of hospital emergency room treated injuries associated with, but not necessarily caused by, the use of consumer products. It is based on data collected from a statistically selected group of hospitals as part of the Commission's National Electronic Injury Surveillance System (NEISS). The NEISS hospital sample has been updated periodically to take into account changes that have occurred in the NEISS sampling frame of emergency departments over time (e.g., including hospital emergency departments opened after the initial sampling frame was constructed). In addition, over time, there have been modifications to the definition of inscope injuries.

### SAFETY STANDARDS

The Commission reduces consumer product hazards through staff involvement in the development and strengthening of voluntary safety standards and the development of mandatory safety standards. This section presents:

- Mandatory safety standards in effect;
- Voluntary safety standards in which staff participated; and
- Research activities in which staff participated.
- 1) Mandatory Safety Standards: Mandatory standards are usually developed through rulemaking. If a voluntary standard exists, by law, the Commission may not issue a mandatory standard unless it finds that the voluntary standard will not eliminate or adequately reduce the risk of injury or death or that it is unlikely that there will be substantial compliance with the voluntary standard. During the rulemaking process, staff seeks input from all interested parties, including consumers, industry, and other government agencies. The CPSC usually develops performance standards, rather than design standards, to give manufacturers the most flexibility. Examples of mandatory standards under development include portable generators, upholstered furniture, and cribs.

On August 14, 2008, the President signed the Consumer Product Safety Improvement Act of 2008 (CPSIA) into law. The CPSIA directs the Commission to implement numerous rulemakings and other official Commission actions intended to enhance the safety of consumer products. Over 40 separate rules or rulemaking activities were mandated by the CPSIA. Rulemakings, related rulemaking activities, and official actions mandated or initiated by the CPSIA include a catalogue labeling rule, an all-terrain vehicle (ATV) rule, procedures for handling lead exclusions, accreditation procedures for adherence to various consumer product safety standards, and rules relating to twelve categories of durable infant and toddler products.

2) Voluntary Safety Standards: CPSC staff works with organizations that facilitate the development of voluntary standards. Staff participates in the development of voluntary standards at a number of steps in the process. Staff first submits recommendations for new standards, or modifications of existing standards, to voluntary standards organizations. After receiving CPSC staff recommendations, the organizations may conduct technical assessments (as appropriate), publish a proposal for public comment, receive and evaluate comments, or publish a standard. This process may take months or several years. Staff participates in the process by providing expert advice, technical assistance, and information based on data analyses of how deaths, injuries, and/or incidents occurred. CPSC's voluntary standards policy does not permit staff to vote on proposed changes or new standards. Staff's comments are considered, however, throughout the process.

The CPSIA added authority for the Commission in certain cases, to specify by rule that a product or product class that does not comply with a voluntary standard is a substantial product hazard under the CPSA. This will facilitate obtaining corrective actions when products that do not comply with such voluntary standards are found in commerce. The Commission currently is developing rules under this authority.

3) Research Activities: CPSC staff conducts and sponsors many research and study projects in furtherance of its activities to improve product safety and reduce or eliminate potential hazards associated with consumer products. The findings from such projects may be used by

staff to develop and refine positions on voluntary and mandatory product safety standards. Examples include smoke alarms, portable generators and imported drywall.

Further, recent statutes have created standards under the CPSIA including (1) limits on certain phthalates in children's toys and child care articles; (2) standards for portable gasoline containers; and (3) standards for swimming pool and spa drain covers. Congress has also legislated bans on lead content in children's products, butyl and volatile alkyl nitrites and lowered the ban on lead in paint to 90 ppm.

Other CPSIA Rules and Amendments<sup>5</sup>:

#### 1420 Requirements for all terrain vehicles

**Final rule (11/14/2008)** CPSIA required CPSC to publish in the Federal Register as a mandatory consumer product safety standard the American National Standard for Four Wheel All-Terrain Vehicles Equipment Configuration, and Performance Requirements developed by the Specialty Vehicle Institute of America (American National Standard ANSI/SVIA 1-2007).

#### 1303 Ban of lead-containing paint and certain consumer products bearing lead-containing paint

**Final rule.** (8/14/2009) CPSC amended its regulations concerning the ban of lead-containing paint and certain consumer products bearing lead containing paint. Section 101(f)(1) of CPSIA mandates that 0.06 percent lead limit of 16 CFR 1303.1 be reduced to 0.009 percent, effective August 14, 2009.

### 1500.20 Labeling requirement for advertising toys and games.

**Final rule.** (2/10/2009) Section 105 of the CPSIA required the Commission to issue a final rule with respect to advertising for certain toys and games in catalogues and other printed materials. The final rule details requirements regarding the size and placement of the cautionary labeling and the use of abbreviated warnings. The rule exempts catalogues circulated solely between businesses from the rule's requirements, except where the recipient business is one that could be expected to be purchasing the product for the use of children rather than for resale. The Commission provided a grace period of 180 days, or until August 9, 2009, during which catalogues and other printed materials printed *prior to* February 10, 2009 may be distributed without the required cautionary statements.

### 1500.87 Children's products containing lead: inaccessible component parts.

**Final rule.** (8/7/2009) CPSC issued a final rule providing guidance as to what product components or classes of components will be considered to be "inaccessible." Section 101(b)(2)(A) of CPSIA provided that the lead limits shall not apply to any component part of a children's product that is not accessible to a child through normal and reasonably foreseeable use and abuse. Section 101(b)(2)(B) of the CPSIA required the Commission to issue a rule providing guidance with respect to what product components, or classes of components, will be considered to be inaccessible.

### 1500.91 Children's Products Containing Lead: Proposed Determinations Regarding Lead Content Limits on Certain Materials or Products

**Final rule.** (8/26/2009) The Commission issued a final rule on determinations that certain materials do not exceed the lead content limits specified under section 101(a) of the CPSIA. The effect of the Commission determination is to relieve the material or product from the testing requirement of section 102 of the CPSIA for purposes of supporting the required certification. However, if the material or product changes such that it exceeds the lead limits of section 101(a) of the CPSIA, then the determination is not applicable to that material or product.

#### 1215 Safety Standard for Infant Bath Seats

Notice of proposed rulemaking. (9/3/2009)<sup>6</sup> CPSIA requires the CPSC to promulgate consumer product safety standards for durable infant or toddler products. These standards are to be ``substantially the same as' applicable voluntary standards or more stringent than the voluntary standard if the Commission concludes that more stringent requirements would further reduce the risk of injury associated with the product. The Commission proposed a safety standard for infant bath seats in response to the direction under section 104(b) of the CPSIA.

#### 1216 Safety Standard for Infant Walkers

Notice of proposed rulemaking. (9/3/2009)<sup>6</sup> CPSIA requires the CPSC to promulgate consumer product safety standards for durable infant or toddler products. These standards are to be ``substantially the same as' applicable voluntary standards or more stringent than the voluntary standard if the Commission concludes that more stringent requirements would further reduce the risk of injury associated with the product. The Commission proposed a safety standard for infant walkers in response to the direction under section 104(b) of the CPSIA.

### 1500 Revocation of Regulation Banning Certain Baby-Walkers and Similar Products

**Notice of proposed rulemaking.** (9/3/2009)<sup>7</sup> CPSC proposed revoking certain regulations pertaining to baby-bouncers, walker-jumpers, baby-walkers, and similar products. CPSC is taking this action because the regulations, which originally were issued in 1971, are outdated and do not provide the degree of safety that is provided by currently manufactured baby-walkers that comply with a more effective voluntary standard. This action will eliminate confusion about whether manufacturers should certify that their products comply with these regulations or with the new proposed mandatory safety standard for infant walkers.

### **Voluntary Standards Adopted in 2009**

The following voluntary standards became mandatory in 2009:

- Toy standard: Section 106(a) of the CPSIA mandated that the toy standard ASTM F963-07 be considered to be a consumer product safety standard issued by the Commission under section 9 of the Consumer Product Safety Act effective February 10, 2009.
- Toy standard: On May 11, 2009, the Commission accepted the proposed revisions to ASTM F963-08 with the exception of the proposed revision to the toy chest provision. ASTM F963-08 is the new 2008 version of the toy standard, which contains revisions to several sections. Also, section 106(g) of the CPSIA declared any revision to the toy standard be considered a consumer product safety standard.
- All Terrain Vehicles (ATVs): Section 232 of the CPSIA amended the CPSA to add a new section 42; section 42(a)(1) directed the Commission to publish in the Federal Register ANSI/SVIA-1-2007 relating to ATVs as a mandatory consumer product safety standard. The standard became effective April 13, 2009.

Other voluntary standards made mandatory by Congress and enforced by the Commission in 2009 include:

- Child Resistant Gasoline Containers: The Children's Gasoline Burn Prevention Act enacted in 2008 made ASTM F2517-05 a consumer product safety standard under section 9 of the CPSA.
- Drain Covers: The Virginia Graeme Baker Pool and Spa Safety Act enacted in 2008 made ASME/ANSI A112.19.8 a consumer product safety rule under the CPSA.

### 2) Voluntary Safety Standards

CPSC issues the <u>Voluntary Standards Tracking and Access Report</u> (VSTAR) on a semi-annual basis. The report includes the objective of the standard under development, the name of the employee leading each activity, and the status of the standard. A summary from the 2009 annual report is provided below for convenience. Fifty new, revised, or reaffirmed voluntary safety standards, for which the CPSC staff monitored or provided technical support, were completed during the period from 10/1/08 to 9/30/09. These addressed artificial turf, bath seats, bed rails (2 standards), bicycles (2), blind cords, booster seats, cribs (commercial and non full size), furniture (2), gas cans, generators (portable), heaters (electric), recreational helmets (2), high chairs, infant carriers (frame - 2), infant carriers (handheld), infant carriers (soft - 2), infant gates, infant swings, ladders, playground equipment (home - 2), playground surfacing (4), soccer goals, stationary activity centers, strollers (2), toddler beds, toys, tree stands (5), window guards (2) and youth folding chairs.

In total, the CPSC staff provided technical support (summarized in the VSTAR) or monitored the development of 39 voluntary safety standards. The vast majority of voluntary standards development activities are managed by three standards development/coordinating organizations: ASTM International (previously called the American Society for Testing and Materials), the American National Standards Institute (ANSI), and Underwriters Laboratories Inc. (UL). These standards provide safety provisions addressing potential hazards associated with consumer products found in homes, schools, and recreational areas.

### 3) Research Activities

Commission staff conducts studies and investigates deaths, injuries, diseases and economic loss associated with consumer products. This research is used to identify hazardous products and to design effective strategies to reduce product hazards. In 2009, CPSC staff conducted or participated in the following research:

### Imported Drywall Research

In response to this emerging hazard, CPSC launched an extensive investigation requiring substantial resources to analyze information about imported drywall to determine the nexus between the drywall and the reported health and corrosion issues. As of the end of October 2009, CPSC had received nearly 1,900 incident reports from residents in 30 states about health and corrosion symptoms. CPSC is committed to providing answers and solutions to these homeowners. CPSC has developed an online *Drywall Information Center* (www.DrywallResponse.gov).

- CPSC led an interagency task force to investigate possible health and corrosion risks from imported drywall with support from the Environmental Protection Agency, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention/Agency for Toxic Substances and Disease Registry, the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development, and the Department of Homeland Security. Since the beginning of the investigation, these federal agencies have had weekly calls to discuss and share information about the investigation and to review technical data and test plans.
- CPSC staff has conducted more than 700 telephone interviews with affected homeowners and 809 in-depth investigations.
- CPSC is working closely with the Department of Homeland Security to identify shipments of
  imported drywall. CPSC identified hundreds of thousands of stockpiled boards and notified
  the warehouses where they are stored of CPSC's ongoing investigation. CPSC requested that
  the warehouses notify CPSC if they sell, transfer, or dispose of any drywall from their
  inventory.

Studies conducted so far have discovered certain differences between Chinese and non-Chinese drywall.

- An elemental and chemical analysis of drywall samples shows the presence of elemental sulfur in Chinese, but not in non-Chinese drywall. It also shows higher concentrations of strontium in Chinese drywall than in non-Chinese drywall. Testing conducted over the summer by federal and state agency radiation laboratories found no radiation safety risk to families in homes built with manufactured drywall. The strontium found in this drywall does not pose a radiological risk. (<a href="www.cpsc.gov/info/drywall/TabA.pdf">www.cpsc.gov/info/drywall/TabA.pdf</a>)
- Ongoing chamber emission studies conducted at Lawrence Berkeley National Laboratory found that Chinese drywall emits higher levels of total volatile sulfur compounds than non-Chinese drywall. As specific chemical characterization data becomes available from the chamber testing, CPSC staff plans to conduct a comprehensive exposure and risk assessment. Staff expects to receive data in spring 2010 and to complete the exposure and risk assessment based on that data in the same timeframe. (www.cpsc.gov/info/drywall/TabB.pdf)

A joint federal and state team tested the air quality in 10 homes in Florida and Louisiana to
identify and measure contaminants. Concentrations of two known irritant compounds,
acetaldehyde and formaldehyde, were detected in both homes with and without Chinese
drywall, and at concentrations that could exacerbate conditions such as asthma in sensitive

### Safety Standards for Cribs and Other Durable Infant or Toddler Products

In 2009, the Commission issued an Advanced Notice of Proposed Rulemaking (ANPR) on cribs (full size and non-full size) to address hazards associated with hardware failures. In addition, staff held a Roundtable on Cribs and Other Sleeping Environments for Infants to consult with interested stakeholders, pursuant of section 104 of the Consumer Product Safety Improvement Act of 2008. Staff presented a comparison of requirements in various standards for cribs and solicited input regarding the adequacy of requirements in addressing hazards to infants, including performance requirements to address durability and requirements for warning labels to address hazards with soft bedding. The event provided an opportunity for attendees to present data, ideas, proposals, or concerns about current or future standards as they relate to the infant sleep environment. In June 2010, staff plans to send a briefing package with a draft proposed crib rule to the Commission for its consideration. In addition, in 2010, staff will send briefing packages to the Commission with draft final rules for baby bath seats and infant walkers and with draft proposed rules for toddler beds and bassinets.

### Measurement of Lead in Paint

CPSC staff completed a study to evaluate the use of X-Ray Fluorescence (XRF) technology to measure lead in paint. The scope of the study was expanded to include the use of XRF technology to measure total lead in plastics and staff published the results with those of the lead in paint study in August 2009 on the CPSC Web site at:

#### ASTM F963 Toy Standard Evaluation

Staff evaluated the adequacy of requirements that address hazards in the following six areas: hazardous magnets; toxic substances; toys with spherical ends; hemispheric-shaped objects; cords, straps, and elastics; and battery-operated toys. Staff consulted with representatives from industry and consumer groups at ASTM International subcommittee meetings on the toy safety standard and requested comments in a Federal Register notice concerning the effectiveness of the standard in the six areas. Staff reviewed and compiled the comments and will use this information for selecting priorities to address in the coming years. Several ASTM work groups are already working on revisions to the voluntary standard to address some of the important issues raised in the public comments. Further, staff has contracted for a scientific report (due to be completed in June 2010) on available acute and chronic toxicity studies to assess the migration of metals from products and the toxicological effects of metals, among other things, as part of the work in evaluating the adequacy of soluble metal content restrictions in F963 toy safety standard.

#### Phthalates and Phthalate Substitutes

A contractor report of a toxicity review of five phthalate substitutes was completed and staff completed five toxicity reviews for its report. Staff sent the five toxicity reviews out for scientific peer review. A sixth toxicity review, an update of toxicity data for di-isononyl phthalate, is scheduled to be completed in 2010.

### **Upholstered Furniture**

In 2009, the staff conducted large-scale open flame testing at National Institute of Standards and Technology (NIST), and prepared a preliminary analysis to accompany smolder testing planned for 2010. NIST completed research and published a technical note on the Standard Reference Material (SRM) cigarettes for use in the planned smolder testing. CPSC posted the NIST report on its Web site and received public comments on the report. Work at NIST has begun on SRM foam development to assist the CPSC staff's testing program; this work is scheduled to be completed in May 2010 and the staff plans to use the resulting data on foam to help refine the Notice of Proposed Rulemaking (NPR). The staff continued research and testing to assess technical concerns and recommendations in the NPR public comments, and to evaluate alternatives on various elements of the proposed rule. ### Carpet and Rug Standards Amendments

In 2009, staff completed a literature review of laundering procedures used in mandatory and voluntary carpet and rug flammability standards. A draft report of the findings was completed.

#### Cigarette, Standard Reference Material (Technical Amendment to 16 CFR Part 1632)

In 2009, NIST work on the SRM cigarette was completed. CPSC staff posted a NIST technical note on development of the SRM cigarette (Technical Note 1627; *Modification of ASTM E2187 for Measuring the Ignition Propensity of Conventional Cigarettes*) on the CPSC Web site to obtain public comment. Staff is reviewing comments and will prepare a briefing package with a draft proposed rule in 2010.

#### **Enhanced Smoke Alarms**

In 2009, CPSC finalized an Interagency Agreement (IAG) with U.S. Fire Administration (USFA) on research for development of enhanced smoke alarms. CPSC staff participated in meetings and teleconferences with USFA and provided technical support for the development of a statement of work for a research contract, which was awarded to Oak Ridge National Laboratory by USFA. Oak Ridge is researching published patents, journals, and other sources to identify technologies that will assist in the development of an advanced smoke alarm.

### Children's Sleepwear Test Manual

In 2009, staff completed a draft Children's Sleepwear Laboratory Test Manual, which is in the clearance process. Staff will finalize the manual and post it on the CPSC Web site in 2010.

#### **Portable Generators**

In 2009: (1) staff continued to manage the contract with the University of Alabama (UA) for the development and durability testing of a prototype low carbon monoxide (CO) emission portable generator. Under a contract modification, UA developed and incorporated a shutoff feature on the prototype generator designed to shut off the engine when performance begins to degrade due to operation in an oxygen depleted environment; (2) NIST conducted numerous performance characterizations needed to establish prototype performance under expected field conditions. NIST began experiments to document performance of a shut-off equipped prototype, the results of which will verify acceptable shut-off performance as well as provide information to UA for further refinement; and (3) staff established an IAG with NIST to develop a method to relate a maximum "acceptable" CO exposure limit profile to the CO emission performance of a portable generator operated in a foreseeable manner. This will result in a reasonable set of performance requirements based solely on health consequences and that are technology independent.

### Vented Gas Appliance CO Sensors

In 2009, staff began drafting its report of test results addressing industry concerns associated with the durability and life span of sensors in a gas furnace application. Staff will complete the draft report in 2010.

### All Terrain Vehicles (ATVs)

In 2009, staff completed the research activities begun in 2008. These included evaluating ATV metrics (e.g., track width, weight, center of gravity, and moment of inertia), vehicle handling, brake performance, maximum speed, tilt table angles, sensitivity to rider lean, as well as a review of speed limiting devices. Staff prepared a draft status report on youth ATV testing activities. The report will be finalized in 2010.

### ATV Data Update

Staff completed development of the draft 2008 Annual Report of ATV-Related Deaths and Injuries in September 2009, as scheduled. The report will be posted on the CPSC Web site in 2010. Additionally, throughout the year, staff provided updated fatality information for the www.atvsafety.gov Web site.

### Consumer Opinion Forum

In 2009, the staff completed an analysis of the Ground Fault Circuit Interrupter Receptacle survey results and drafted a report that described these results. This report is currently undergoing clearance for public dissemination. In 2009, the staff also prepared a new survey related to Clothes Dryer Maintenance. CPSC has cleared this survey for public dissemination and staff plans to launch the survey in 2010.

### Electrocution Data Update

Staff completed a draft report titled 2005-2006 Electrocutions Associated with Consumer Products in September 2009. The report will be posted on the CPSC Web site in 2010.

#### Globally Harmonized System (GHS) for Labeling

The contractor completed a report, A Side-by-Side Comparison of GHS and the Federal Hazardous Substances Act, and submitted it to CPSC staff. Staff is currently reviewing the report.

#### Nanotechnology

Staff signed an IAG with NIST in July 2009 that includes a review of nano FR performance in foam and barriers, and potential releases of these compounds during simulated use conditions. Staff expects that this review will be completed by the end of the 2010 calendar year.

### Nursery Equipment Annual Update

Staff developed the draft annual report *Nursery Product-Related Injuries and Deaths Among Children under Age Five*. The report will be posted on the CPSC Web site in 2010.

In accordance with section 104(b) of the Consumer Product Safety Improvement Act (CPSIA) of 2009, staff also conducted analyses to characterize injury and fatality numbers and hazard patterns associated with infant walkers and bath seats. The memoranda documenting these analyses are available to the public in Notices of Proposed Rulemaking packages.

#### Sensitizers

In 2008, an external peer review of the staff's report on strong sensitizers was completed. Staff revised its report based upon the peer review comments and drafted a report, including recommendations to implement changes in the supplemental definition of "strong sensitizer."

### Pediatric Poisoning Annual Update

In 2009, staff completed and posted to the CPSC Web site the updated annual report *Pediatric Poisoning Fatalities from 1972 through 2006* for children less than five years of age. The report shows that child fatalities have declined substantially since the Poison Prevention Packaging Act became law, from 216 in 1972 to an average of about 29 each year from January 1, 2004, through December 31, 2006.

### Pool and Spa Safety

In 2009, the staff prepared the agreement with CDC to assist CPSC in implementing the grant program. CPSC staff has begun work on determining the eligibility, application submission, and application evaluation criteria for grant applicants. CDC, with CPSC participation, will prepare the funding opportunity announcement about the grant program. It is expected that the announcement will be released to the public in 2010.

### Pool Submersion Annual Update

In May 2009, staff completed and posted the report entitled *Pool and Spa Submersion: Estimated Injuries and Reported Fatalities*, 2009 Report to the CPSC Web site. There were, on average, 3,100 pool and spa related emergency department-treated submersion injuries each year for 2006 – 2008 and 295 pool and spa related fatalities per year for 2004 – 2006 for children younger than five years of age. Approximately 64 percent of the estimated injuries for 2006 – 2008 and 79 percent of the fatalities for 2004 – 2006 for children younger than five occurred at a residence. ### Table Saws (Blade Guards)

In 2009, staff completed testing of a new blade guard system and a blade-contact detection/reaction system and prepared a draft report of its evaluation. The evaluation included a review of basic table saw operations, blade contact scenarios, and traditional blade contact safety equipment. In its evaluation of the new blade guard design and the detection/reaction system, staff included an analysis of system installation, removal, system use, and operability.

### Toys Annual Update

### **COMPLIANCE AND ENFORCEMENT**

CPSC learns about potential product defects from many sources, including incident reports, consumer complaints, the Hotline, and the Web site. In addition, firms are required legally to report potential product hazards or violations of standards to the Commission. The Commission works with companies to remove products from the marketplace when they violate mandatory safety standards or are defective by creating a substantial risk of injury. This section presents:

- Voluntary recall orders taken by importers or manufacturers;
- Letters of Advice to importers and manufacturers; and
- Commission determinations and judicial actions.
- 1) Voluntary Recall Orders Taken by Importers or Manufacturers: Headquarters and field staff identify defective products not covered by regulations through their own investigations of potential product defects. In addition, firms are required by law to report potential product hazards or violations of standards to the Commission. When a recall is necessary, Compliance staff negotiates with the responsible firm. In 2009, CPSC staff completed 465 cooperative recalls (100 percent voluntary) of products that either violated mandatory standards or were defective and presented a substantial risk of injury to the public. If a firm refuses to recall a product voluntarily, CPSC may litigate to require a recall. This section lists the voluntary recalls performed by companies to address possible hazards in 2009.

CPSC developed the Fast Track program to streamline the process of recalls for firms that were willing and prepared to recall their products quickly. Because every defective product presents a risk of injury or death, removing hazardous products from the marketplace faster can prevent more injuries and save more lives. In 2009, 275 of 465 were Fast Track recalls. Recalls under the Fast Track program are conducted without the need for time-consuming hazard analyses and were initiated within 20 days of a firm's report to CPSC over 93 percent of the time in 2009.

- 2) Letters of Advice to Importers or Manufacturers: Imported products are screened at the port by either CPSC or in coordination with U.S. Customs and Border Protection (CBP). For all products regulated by CPSC, the Commission issues a Letter of Advice when there is a violation of a mandatory standard. It advises the company of the violation and the nature of the necessary corrective action (to correct future production, to stop sale and correct future production or to recall, stop sale and correct future production). This section lists the Letters of Advice sent to Importers and Manufacturers in 2009 where the Commission has received a response from the company confirming the violation, the Commission has decided that the company has completed voluntary correction agreed upon for the company to remedy the hazard, or the CBP has seized the product at the port.
- 3) Commission Determinations and Judicial Actions: When companies fail to report as required, CPSC can seek civil penalties in U.S. courts. In 2009, CPSC negotiated out of court settlements in which 38 companies voluntarily agreed to pay \$9.8 million in civil penalties to the U.S. Treasury. Both the number of firms and the dollar amount are the largest in CPSC history. This total is expected to increase in the future because the CPSIA allows CPSC to impose significantly higher penalties. Other tools used for enforcement include legal action under either section 12 or section 15(c) or 15(d), federal court actions pursuant to the statutes CPSC administers and pursuit of criminal cases where appropriate. Enforcement and litigation activities are listed in several tables in this section of the report.

In addition, firms are required by law to report potential product hazards or violations of standards to the Commission. ### PC Notebook Computer Batteries Recalled Due to Fire and Burn Hazard

In cooperation with the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC), about 35,000 (with an additional 65,000 batteries sold worldwide) Lithium-Ion Batteries manufactured by Sony Energy Devices Corporation, of Japan, and used in Hewlett-Packard, Toshiba and Dell Notebook Computers, were recalled. These lithium-ion batteries can overheat, posing a fire and burn hazard to consumers.

### DYMO Recalls Power Adapters Sold with DYMO® Printers Due to Burn Hazard

In cooperation with the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC), DYMO, of Stamford, Conn., is voluntarily recalling about 17,000 DYMO® LabelWriter® Power Adapters used with printers. The power adapters can fail, causing the printer to overheat. This can pose a burn hazard to consumers.

### Fit & Fresh<sup>TM</sup> Mixers Recalled by MEDport LLC Due to Laceration Hazard

In cooperation with the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC), MEDport LLC, of Providence, R.I., is voluntarily recalling about 54,500 Fit & Fresh<sup>TM</sup> Smooth Blend Mixers. While placing the cup on or off the base of the mixer, the mixer can be unexpectedly turned on, activating the blade. This can pose a serious laceration hazard to consumers.

Homelite Consumer Products Announce Recall to Repair Chain Saws Due to Chain Brake Failure In cooperation with the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC), Homelite Consumer Products Inc., of Anderson, S.C., is voluntarily recalling about 370,000 Homelite Chain Saws. The chain brake can fail to stop the chain on its first application, posing a risk of laceration to consumers.

### Wooden Toys Recalled by Earth Friendly Due To Choking Hazards

In cooperation with the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC), Earth Friendly LLC, of Beaverton, Ore., is voluntarily recalling about 1,000 Wooden Toys. Small parts can detach and break from the toy, posing a choking hazard to young children. In addition, the size of the rattle handle violates voluntary rattle standards.

### Halloween Figurines Recalled by Coyne's & Company for Lead Hazard

In cooperation with the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC), Coyne's & Company Inc., of Minneapolis, Minn., is voluntarily recalling about 14,000 Casper the Friendly Ghost® Halloween Mini-Figurines. The recalled Halloween figurines contain high levels of lead in the paint.

### Ghost Tealight Holders Recalled by Trade Associates Group and Crate & Barrel Due to Fire and Burn Hazard

In cooperation with the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC), Trade Associates Group Ltd., of Chicago, Ill., and Crate & Barrel, of Northbrook, Ill., are voluntarily recalling about 30,000 Ghost Tealight Holders. The recalled tealight holder can ignite posing a fire and burn hazard to consumers.

### Cybex International Recalls Treadmills Due to Fall Hazard; Can Speed Up Unexpectedly

In cooperation with the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC), Cybex International Inc., of Medway, Mass., is voluntarily recalling about 19,000 Cybex Treadmills. The treadmills can speed up unexpectedly while in use due to a malfunction with the lower control board, posing a fall hazard to consumers.

### <u>Serta International Recalls Mattresses Due to Violation of Federal Mattress Flammability Standard</u>

In cooperation with the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC), Serta International Mattress Co., of Hoffman Estates, Ill., is voluntarily recalling about 6,100 Serta Zipper-Covered Foam Core Mattresses. The mattresses fail to meet the mandatory federal open flame standard for mattresses, posing a fire hazard to consumers.

### Power Adapters Used with Notebook Computers Recalled by Battery-Biz Due To Burn Hazard

In cooperation with the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC), Battery-Biz Inc., of Camarillo, Calif., is voluntarily recalling about 1,300 Duracell 130W Combo Power Adapters used with notebook computers. The adapters can fail and overheat. This can pose a burn hazard to consumers.

### Gaming System Batteries and Recharging Station Recalled by LeapFrog Due to Burn Hazard

In cooperation with the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC), LeapFrog Enterprises Inc., of Emeryville, Calif., is voluntarily recalling about 35,500 Rechargeable Batteries and Recharging Station for Didj Custom Gaming System. The rechargeable batteries included with the Recharging Station can overheat if the gaming system is placed into the recharging base upside down, posing a burn hazard to consumers.

Shimano American Corp. Recalls Wheels for Bicycles; Flat Tire Can Pose Injury Risk to Riders In cooperation with the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC), Shimano American Corp., of Irving, Calif., is voluntarily recalling about 275 Shimano Dura Ace Carbon Clincher Wheels for Bicycles. Rim surface and spoke hole plugs on the wheel can cause a puncture to the inner tube, resulting in a flat tire. This can cause the rider to lose control and fall.

### YMCA Trading Recalls Lighters Due to Potential Burn Hazard to Children

In cooperation with the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC), YMCA Trading Inc., of Maspeth, N.Y., is voluntarily recalling about 24,000 "Gas Match" and "Ready, Aim...Fire" Multi-Purpose Lighters. The multi-purpose lighters fail to meet federal safety standards because they might not contain a child-resistant mechanism, posing a potential fire and burn hazard to young children.

### <u>Murray Riding Lawn Mowers Recalled By Briggs & Stratton Power Products Group Due to Fire and Burn Hazards</u>

In cooperation with the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC), Briggs & Stratton Power Products Group LLC, of Wauwatosa, Wis., is voluntarily recalling about 2,100 Murray Front Engine Riding Lawn Mowers. The two-piece fuel tanks on the riding mowers can separate at the seam, causing fuel to leak. This can pose fire and burn hazards to consumers.

### Fiesta Recalls to Inspect and Repair Gas Grills Due to Fire and Burn Hazards

In cooperation with the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC), Fiesta Gas Grills, of Dickson, Tenn., is voluntarily recalling about 47,000 Blue Ember Gas Grills. The gas grills can be assembled improperly exposing the gas burner hoses to excessive heat, posing fire and burn hazards to consumers.

### Rage Wireless Guitars Used with Popular Video Gaming System Recalled Due to Chemical Burn Risk

In cooperation with the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC), Performance Designed Products LLC, of Sherman Oaks, Calif., is voluntarily recalling about 57,000 Rage Wireless Guitars. A circuit board defect can cause AA batteries used in the guitar to leak if the batteries are installed incorrectly, posing a risk of chemical burns to consumers.

Infant Death Prompts Recall to Repair 985,000 Delta Enterprise Drop Side Cribs; Missing Safety Pegs Can Cause Entrapment and Suffocation Hazards

The U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC), in cooperation with Delta Enterprise Corp., of New York, New York., is announcing the voluntary recall to replace missing safety pegs involving 985,000 drop side cribs. Failure to use or install safety pegs can cause an entrapment and suffocation risk to infants and toddlers.

<u>Infant Death Prompts Recall To Repair 600,000 Drop Side Cribs By Delta Enterprise; Spring Peg Failure Can Cause Entrapment and Suffocation Hazards</u>

The U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC), in cooperation with Delta Enterprise Corp., of New York, N.Y., is announcing the voluntary recall today of about 600,000 drop side cribs. The crib's drop side can detach when the spring peg is not engaged, which can cause an entrapment and suffocation risk to infants and toddlers.

<u>Infant Death Prompts Recall of Convertible Cribs by Playkids USA; Crib Poses Entrapment and Suffocation Hazards</u>

The U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC), in cooperation with Playkids U.S.A. of Brooklyn, N.Y., is announcing today a voluntary recall of about 2,000 convertible cribs. The sides of the convertible crib are made of a mesh that expands, creating a gap between the mattress and the side through which an infant can slip. This poses suffocation and entrapment hazards for young children.

### My Way Corp. Recalls Baby Walkers Due to Stairway Fall Hazard

In cooperation with the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC), My Way Corp., of San Juan, Puerto Rico, is voluntarily recalling about 800 Baby Walkers. The walkers violate the baby walker voluntary standard and can fit through a standard doorway and are not designed to stop at the edge of a step. Babies using these walkers can be seriously injured or killed.

### Fujifilm Recalls Battery Chargers Due to Shock Hazard

In cooperation with the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC), Fujifilm U.S.A. Inc., of Valhalla, N.Y., is voluntarily recalling about 5,300 BC-50 Battery Chargers. The plastic portion of the unit's power plug can crack or detach, posing an electrical shock hazard to consumers.

### Toy Boats Recalled Due to Burn Hazard

In cooperation with the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC), Dollar General Merchandising Inc., of Goodlettsville, Tenn., is voluntarily recalling about 200,000 Battery Operated Toy "Speed Boats". The two battery terminals can come into contact with each other, causing the battery to overheat, posing a burn hazard to consumers.

### Bar Magnets Recalled by Home Science Tools Due to Violation of Lead Paint Standard

In cooperation with the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC), Home Science Tools, of Billings, Mont., is voluntarily recalling about 400 Alnico Bar Magnets. Surface paints on the magnets contain excessive levels of lead, which violates the federal lead paint standard.

#### Wireless Headset Batteries Recalled by GN Netcom Due to Fire Hazard

In cooperation with the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC), GN Netcom Inc., of Nashua, New Hampshire, is voluntarily recalling about 525,000 (an additional 675,000 were sold outside the U.S.) GN9120 Wireless Headsets. An internal short circuit in the lithium-ion polymer batteries can cause the batteries to overheat, posing a fire hazard.

### Portable Generators Recalled by General Power Products Due to Fire Hazard

In cooperation with the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC), General Power Products LLC, of Loveland, Ohio, is voluntarily recalling about 13,000 Portable Generators. The generator's fuel valve can be damaged by the cover plate during shipment and cause a fuel leak and fuel spillage during use, posing a fire hazard to consumers.

### Gas Vent Dampers Recalled by Effikal Due to Carbon Monoxide Hazard

In cooperation with the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC), Effikal LLC, of Orion, Mich., is voluntarily recalling about 45,000 Automatic Gas Vent Dampers. The automatic gas vent damper could fail, and if the blocked vent switch does not activate, the vent could leak carbon monoxide (CO). This poses a risk of CO poisoning to consumers.

Hasbro Inc. Recalls to Repair Nerf Blasters; Child's Skin Can Get Caught in Plunger of the Toy

In cooperation with the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC), Hasbro Inc., of Pawtucket, R.I., is voluntarily recalling about 330,000 Nerf<sup>TM</sup> N-Strike Recon Blasters. The blaster's plunger can pull the user's skin during firing of the toy blaster resulting in injury to the face, neck, and/or chest.

### Rack Room Shoes Recalls Girls' Sandals Due to Choking Hazard

In cooperation with the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC), Rack Room Shoes Inc., of Charlotte. N.C., is voluntarily recalling about 11,000 pairs of Girls' Sandals. The ornamental flowers on the sandals can detach, posing a choking hazard to young children.

<u>CPSC and Chance Rides Manufacturing Announce Recall to Inspect and Repair YO-YO</u> Amusement Rides

In cooperation with the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC), Chance Rides Manufacturing Inc. (CRM), of Wichita, Kansas is voluntarily recalling to inspect and repair about 85 YO-YO amusement rides across the country.

Coby Electronics Recalls Rechargeable Batteries Sold with Portable DVD/CD/MP3 Players Due to Fire Hazard

In cooperation with the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC), Coby Electronics Corp., of Lake Success, N.Y., is voluntarily recalling about 13,000 Rechargeable Batteries sold with portable DVD/CD/MP3 players. The rechargeable batteries can overheat, posing a fire hazard to consumers.

Outdoor Playset Gliders Recalled by Backyard Play Systems Due to Fall Hazard; New Assembly Instructions Provided

In cooperation with the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC), Backyard Play Systems LLC, of Monroe, Mich., is voluntarily recalling about 500 Heartland/Yardline/Backyard Play Systems Outdoor Playset Gliders. Some of the gliders were shipped with assembly instructions that did not inform consumers to tighten all lock nuts during assembly, including those attached by the manufacturer. As a result, some lock nuts were not fully fastened during assembly which could cause the glider to detach, posing a fall hazard to children.

<u>Children's Necklaces, CD and MP3 Players Sold at Limited Too and Justice Stores Recalled by Tween Brands Due to Violation of Lead Paint Standard</u>

In cooperation with the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC), Tween Brands Inc., of New Albany, Ohio, is voluntarily recalling about 12,000 Children's Ball and Heart Necklaces, Portable CD and MP3 Players. Surface coatings on these products could contain excessive levels of lead, violating the federal lead paint standard.

Game Chairs Recalled by Brunswick Bowling & Billiards Corp. Due to Fall Hazard

In cooperation with the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC), Brunswick Bowling & Billiards Corp., of Lake Forest, Ill., is voluntarily recalling about 1,700 "Colonial" Folding Game Chairs. The retaining washers on the legs can loosen, causing the chair to become unstable. This poses a fall hazard to consumers.

### John Jaques & Son Recalls Lawn Dart Games Due to Risk of Puncture

In cooperation with the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC), John Jaques & Son Ltd., of Edenbridge, England, is voluntarily recalling about 35 Lawn Dart Games. The darts in the games pose a puncture hazard to young children. Lawn darts were banned in December 1988 to protect children from skull, face and eye puncture wounds.

### Viessmann U.S. Recalls Boilers Due to Fire Hazard

In cooperation with the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC), Viessmann Manufacturing Co. Inc., of Canada, is voluntarily recalling about 4,600 Vitodens 200 Boilers. The boiler can leak gas, posing a fire hazard to consumers.

### Pottery Barn Recalls Wooden Hammock Stands Due to Fall and Laceration Hazard

In cooperation with the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC), Pottery Barn, of San Francisco, Calif., is voluntarily recalling about 30,000 Wooden Hammock Stands. When used outdoors, the wood in the hammock stand can deteriorate over time and break, posing a risk of falls and lacerations to consumers.

### BRP U.S. Inc. Recalls Youth All Terrain Vehicles Due to Collision Hazard

In cooperation with the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC), BRP U.S. Inc., of Sturtevant, Wis., is voluntarily recalling about 1,200 Model Year 2008-2009 Can-Am® Youth ATVs. If the rider is ejected and the cord strap is pulled, the shutoff switch can fail to disable the engine. The ATV can operate uncontrolled, until the engine returns to idle, and cause a collision with bystanders, vehicles or other objects. This poses a serious risk of injury.

### Stainless Steel Pots Recalled by Ocean State Jobbers Due to Burn Hazard

In cooperation with the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC), Ocean State Jobbers Inc., of North Kingstown, R.I., is voluntarily recalling about 7,000 Century Cookware Stainless Steel Stockpots. The stainless steel pots have metal handles that can detach during use, posing a serious burn hazard to consumers.

### JCPenney Recalls Arizona® Newborn and Infant Pants Due to Choking Hazard

In cooperation with the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC), JCPenney Co., of Plano, Texas, is voluntarily recalling about 24,000 Arizona® Newborn and Infant Denim Pants. The metal snap at the waist can detach posing a choking hazard to infants.

### <u>Heavy Duty Acidic Cleaner Recalled by DuPont Due to Leaking Cap; Poses Risk of Severe Skin</u> Irritation

In cooperation with the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC), DuPont, of Wilmington, Del., is voluntarily recalling about 20,000 Heavy Duty Acidic Cleaner Bottles. Pressure can build up in a full or nearly full bottle of the acidic cleaner when it is stored in elevated temperatures over an extended period of time, which can result in the cleaner leaking from underneath the cap. If the product comes into contact with skin, it can cause severe skin irritation.

### <u>Candela Recalls Candles Due to Fire and Burn Hazards; Sold Exclusively at Anthropologie</u> Stores

In cooperation with the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC), Candela Group, of New York, N.Y., is voluntarily recalling about 225 Anthropologie Tin Candles. The candle flames could flare up out of the tin container during the burning of the last half inch of wax, posing a fire and burn hazard.

### ImagiPLAY Recalls Bead Maze Toys Due to Laceration Hazard

In cooperation with the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC), ImagiPLAY, of Boulder, Colo., is voluntarily recalling about 500 Bead Maze Toys. The trees on the toys can detach, exposing a metal screw. This poses a laceration hazard to young children.

### Watts Water Technologies Recalls Rotor and Shaft Assemblies Due to Fire Hazard

In cooperation with the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC), Watts Water Technologies Inc., of North Andover, Mass., is voluntarily recalling about 15 EDP 3112 Rotor and Shaft Assemblies. If the assembly was installed in a fire suppression system and remained in a closed position, sufficient water might not have been available in the event of a fire. This posed a fire hazard to consumers.

### Near Strangulation of Child Prompts Recall to Repair Window Blinds by Green Mountain Vista

In cooperation with the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC), Green Mountain Vista Inc., of Williston, Vt., is voluntarily recalling about 7,300 Insulated Black-Out Roller Shades and Insulated Roman Shades. The black-out roller shades and insulated roman shades have a continuous looped bead chain that when not attached to the wall or floor, hangs loosely by the blind, posing a fatal strangulation hazard to children.

### Strangulation Death of a Child Prompts Recall of Roman Blinds; Sold Exclusively at IKEA

In cooperation with the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC), about 670,000 IRIS and ALVINE Roman Blinds (an additional 4.8 million were sold outside of the United States), sold exclusively by IKEA Home Furnishings, of Conshohocken, Pa., are being voluntarily recalled. Strangulations can occur when a child places his/her neck in an exposed inner cord on the backside of the roman blinds.

### Brownie's Third Lung Recalls Air Compressors Due to Drowning Hazard

In cooperation with the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC), Brownie's Third Lung, of Fort Lauderdale, Fla., is voluntarily recalling about 1,000 Air Compressors. The air compressor's components can fail, which could cause a stoppage of air flow. This poses a risk of drowning to users.

### Target Recalls Dive Sticks Due to Impalement Hazard

In cooperation with the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC), Target, of Minneapolis, Minn., is voluntarily recalling about 365,000 Dive Sticks. The recalled dive sticks could remain in an upright position, posing an impalement hazard to young children. CPSC banned pre-weighted dive sticks in 2001.

### <u>Children's Hooded Jackets with Drawstrings Recalled by R&D International Due to Strangulation Hazard</u>

In cooperation with the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC), R&D International Inc., of Salida, Colo., is voluntarily recalling about 1,500 Young Colors Children's Hooded Jackets. The jackets have drawstrings through the hood and at the waist. Children can get entangled in the drawstrings that can catch on playground equipment, fences or tree branches. In February 1996, CPSC issued guidelines to help prevent children from strangling or getting entangled on the neck and waist drawstring in upper garments, such as jackets and sweatshirts. From 1985 through June 2008, CPSC received reports of 27 deaths and 70 non-fatal incidents involving the entanglement of children's clothing drawstrings.

### GE Recalls to Inspect and Repair Wall Ovens Due to Fire and Burn Hazards

In cooperation with the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC), GE Consumer & Industrial, of Louisville, Ky., is voluntarily recalling about 244,000 GE®, GE Profile<sup>TM</sup>, Monogram® and Kenmore® Wall Ovens. The extreme heat used in the self-clean cycle can escape, if the wall oven door is removed and incorrectly re-attached by the installer or the consumer. This can pose a fire and burn hazard to consumers.

### <u>Lithium-Ion Batteries Used with Bicycle Lights Recalled By DiNotte Lighting Due to Burn</u> Hazard

In cooperation with the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC), DiNotte Lighting, of Hampton, NH, is voluntarily recalling about 1,700 DiNotte Lighting Lithium-Ion batteries used with bicycle lights. A loose wiring connection and improper venting can cause the battery to overheat, posing a burn hazard to consumers.

In cooperation with the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC), Cobra Electronics, of Chicago, Ill., is voluntarily recalling about 8,000 Children's Two-Way Radios. The rechargeable batteries in the radios can leak electrolyte, posing a chemical burn hazard to consumers.

### Swim 'N Score Dive Sticks Recalled by Modell's Due to Risk of Impalement Injury to Children

In cooperation with the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC), Modell's Sporting Goods, of New York, N.Y., is voluntarily recalling about 130 CORAL Swim 'N Score Pool Stix. Children can fall or land on these dive sticks in shallow water and suffer impalement injuries. Eye and other facial injuries are also possible. In April 2001, CPSC banned certain types of dive sticks.

### JA-RU Recalls Toy Trains Due To Choking Hazard

In cooperation with the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC), JA-RU Inc., of Jacksonville, Fla., is voluntarily recalling about 18,000 My Little Train Classics Toy Trains. The recalled toy contain small parts which can detach, posing a choking hazard to young children.

### Lighted Showcases Recalled by Seventh Avenue Due to Fire Hazard

In cooperation with the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC), Seventh Avenue, of Monroe, Wis., is voluntarily recalling about 700 5 Tier Lighted Showcases. The lighted showcase's plug adaptor can overheat and melt the adaptor's plastic housing, posing a fire hazard. Off-Road Motorcycles Recalled by American Honda Motor Due to Risk of Swing Arm Weld Failure

The necklaces pose a strangulation hazard.

# Ryobi Corded Circular Saws Sold Exclusively at Home Depot Recalled By One World Technologies Inc. Due to Laceration Hazard

In cooperation with the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC), One World Technologies Inc., of Anderson, S.C., is voluntarily recalling about 12,400 Ryobi Corded Circular Saws. The return spring on the circular saw's lower blade guard can break, posing a laceration hazard to consumers.

## Rashti & Rashti Expands Recall of Infant Garments Due to Choking Hazard

In cooperation with the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC), Rashti & Rashti, of New York, N.Y., is voluntarily recalling about 16,000 Taggies<sup>TM</sup> Sleep'n Play Infant Garments (an additional 6,200 were recalled on July 1, 2008). The snaps on these garments can detach, posing a choking hazard to young children.

# Eddie Bauer Play Yards with Rocking Bassinets Recalled by Dorel Juvenile Group Due to Suffocation Hazard

In cooperation with the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC) and Health Canada, Dorel Juvenile Group Inc., of Columbus, Ind., is voluntarily recalling about 71,000 (in the United States) and about 5,600 in Canada Eddie Bauer Soothe & Sway Play Yards. The play yard's rocking bassinet attachment can tilt even when secured by straps in the non-rocking mode or can stay tilted without returning to a level sleeping surface while in the rocking mode, causing an infant to roll to the corner or side of the bassinet. The infant can then become wedged in the corner or pressed against the side or bottom of the bassinet, posing a risk of suffocation or positional asphyxiation.

## Gothic Cabinet Craft Recalls Bunk Beds Due to Fall Hazard

## Off-Road Motorcycles Recalled by KTM North America Due to Front Fork Failure

The front fork inner tube on the off-road motorcycles can crack and separate from the fork axle, posing a risk of injury or death to the operator.

## Commercial Freezers Used in Grocery Stores Recalled By Unilever Due to Fire Hazard

pieces of the plastic Quick Hitch back towards the boat. If this occurs, an individual can be struck and seriously injured.

<u>Violation of Federal Mattress Flammability Standard Prompts Recall of Mattresses by Foamorder.com</u>

In cooperation with the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC), Foamorder.com, of San Francisco, Calif., is voluntarily recalling about 140 Natural Sense Foam Blocks with Cotton Cover (Mattresses). The foam blocks with cotton covers (intended to be used as mattresses) fail to meet the mandatory federal open flame standard for mattresses, posing a fire hazard to consumers.

#### Polaris Industries Recalls ATVs Due to Fire Hazard

In cooperation with the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC), Polaris Industries Inc., of Medina, Minn., is voluntarily recalling about 4,700 2009 Model Year Polaris All-Terrain Vehicles (ATVs). The valve assembly can fail in freezing temperatures, causing oil to leak into the exhaust system. This could pose a fire and burn hazard to the rider.

Stamina Products Recalls Elliptical Machines; Provides New Warning and Assembly Instructions In cooperation with the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC), Stamina Products Inc. of Springfield, Mo., is voluntarily recalling about 11,000 Elliptical Cross Trainers. Stamina modified the warning/assembly instructions in the owner's manuals to emphasize that the elliptical pedal shafts must be securely tightened to the cranks. If not securely tightened, the pedal shafts could become loose from the cranks, which could result in serious injury to the user and/or damage to the product.

# Fiesta Recalls to Repair Gas Grills Due to Fire, Burn Hazards

In cooperation with the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC), Fiesta Gas Grills, of Dickson, Tenn., is voluntarily recalling about 88,000 Blue Ember Gas Grills units in the United States (and 25,000 in Canada). The hose of the gas tank can get too close to the firebox and be exposed to heat, posing a fire hazard to consumers.

## Heating System Thermostats Recalled by OJ Electronics Due to Shock Hazard

The shoe has decorative wheels that can detach, posing a choking hazard to young children.

Elliptical Exercise Gliders Recalled by Thane Due to Fall Hazard; New Instructions to Be Provided

In cooperation with the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC), Thane International Inc., of La Quinta, Calif., are voluntarily recalling about 48,000 Orbitrek Elite and Orbitrek Elite Magnetic Elliptical Exercise Gliders. The written instructions incorrectly identify the proper location of the spring washer. An incorrectly installed spring washer can put undue stress on bolts, causing them to loosen, which poses a fall hazard to consumers.

In cooperation with the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC), Applica Consumer Products Inc., of Miramar, Fla., is voluntarily recalling about 9,800 Black & Decker® Thermal Coffeemakers. The coffeemakers can overheat and melt, posing a burn hazard to consumers.

## Remote Switches Recalled by Woodstock International Due to Fire Hazard

In cooperation with the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC), Woodstock International, of Bellingham, Wash., is voluntarily recalling about 450 Shop Fox Dust Collection Remote Switches. An incorrectly sized wire inside the remote switch can overheat, posing a fire hazard to consumers.

<u>Homelite</u>, <u>Husky and Black Max Generators Recalled Due to Fire Hazard; Sold Exclusively at Home Depot and Sam's Club Stores</u>

In cooperation with the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC), Homelite Consumer Products Inc., of Anderson, S.C., is voluntarily recalling about 51,750 Homelite, Husky and Black Max Brand Generators. The fuel gauge can leak excessive amounts of gasoline, posing a fire hazard to consumers.

#### Little Tikes<sup>TM</sup> Recalls Children's Toy Workshop Sets and Trucks Due to Choking Hazard

In cooperation with the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC), Little Tikes, of Hudson, Ohio, is voluntarily recalling about 1.6 Million Little Tikes<sup>TM</sup> Workshops Sets and Trucks. The recalled workshop sets and trucks have oversized, plastic toy nails that can pose a choking hazard to young children.

# Exercise Units Recalled by Nautilus Due to Fall Hazard

The battery pack can overheat, posing a burn or fire hazard to the consumer.

## Target Recalls Circo Booster Seats Due to Fall Hazard

## Spalding In-Ground Basketball Hoops Recalled By Russell Brands Due to Impact Hazard

In cooperation with the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC), Russell Brands LLC, of Alexander City, Ala., is voluntarily recalling about 1,700 Spalding In-Ground Basketball Hoops. The bolts at the base can fail, causing the unit to fall. This poses a risk of serious injury to consumers.

# <u>Increasing Injuries Prompt Black & Decker to Reannounce Recall of Trimmers/Edgers Due to Laceration and Burn Hazards</u>

In cooperation with the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC), Black & Decker (U.S.) Inc., of Towson, Md., is voluntarily recalling about 200,000 Black & Decker GH1000 Grasshog XP String Trimmer/Edgers. The flame guards on the recalled replacement torch fuel containers can malfunction and cause the containers to melt while the torch is in use, posing a fire hazard to consumers.

# IMI Cornelius Recalls Juice Dispensers Due to Fire Hazard

This can result in leaking flue gases, posing a risk of carbon monoxide poisoning to consumers.

Molded rubber pieces on the sole of the recalled shoes can detach, posing a choking hazard to infants and young children.

# Furnaces Recalled by Northwest Manufacturing Due to Fire Hazard

In cooperation with the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC), Northwest Manufacturing Inc., of Red Lake Falls, Minn., is voluntarily recalling about 600 WoodMaster AFS 900 Outdoor Furnaces. The temperature gauge can fail and cause fire in the fuel storage hopper, posing a fire and burn hazard to consumers.

## Garlic Press/Slicers Recalled by Trudeau Corporation Due to Laceration Hazard

In cooperation with the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC), Trudeau Corporation, of Canada, is voluntarily recalling about 22,000 Trudeau Garlic Duo Slicers. The garlic duo's slicer blades can break during use, posing a laceration hazard to users.

## Bicycle Chains and Chain Connector Links Recalled by SRAM Due to Fall Hazard

In cooperation with the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC), SRAM LLC, of Chicago, Ill., is voluntarily recalling about 24,000 10 Speed SRAM Bicycle Chains with PowerLock connector links. The recalled PowerLock connector links, used on bicycle chains, are brittle and can crack, allowing the chain to separate from the bicycle and posing a fall hazard to the rider.

# O'Neill Children's Hooded Sweatshirts with Drawstrings Recalled by La Jolla Sport Due to Strangulation Hazard

In cooperation with the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC), Jolla Sport USA Inc., of Irvine, Calif., is voluntarily recalling about 2,300 Children's Hooded Fleece Sweatshirts. The recalled sweatshirts have a drawstring through the hood, which can pose a strangulation hazard to children. In February 1996, CPSC issued guidelines to help prevent children from strangling or getting entangled on the neck and waist drawstrings in upper garments, such as jackets or sweatshirts.

# <u>Children's Animal Masks and Pendants Recalled by Team Work Trading Due to Risk of Lead Exposure</u>

The DVD player's circuit board can overheat, posing a fire and burn hazard to consumers.

# 2) Letters of Advice to Importers or Manufacturers

Imported products are screened at the port by either CPSC or in coordination with U.S. Customs and Border Protection (CBP). For all products regulated by CPSC, the Commission issues a Letter of Advice when there is a violation of a mandatory standard. It advises the company of the violation and the nature of the necessary corrective action (to correct future production, to stop sale and correct future production or to recall, stop sale and correct future production). This section lists the Letters of Advice sent to Importers and Manufacturers in 2009 where the Commission has received a response from the company confirming the violation, the Commission has decided that the company has completed voluntary correction agreed upon for the company to remedy the hazard, or the CBP has seized the product at the port. This list presents both the violation and action to be implemented by the company listed. Many imported products were seized at the ports by CPSC and CBP.

## 3) Commission Determinations and Judicial Actions

When companies fail to report as required under section 15 of the CPSA, CPSC can seek civil penalties. The Commission has the authority to compromise any civil penalty or file suit in federal court seeking a civil penalty. In 2009, CPSC negotiated out of court settlements in which 38 companies voluntarily agreed to pay \$9.8 million in civil penalties to the U.S. Treasury. Both the number of firms and the dollar amount are the largest in CPSC history. This total is expected to increase in the future because the CPSIA allows CPSC to impose significantly higher penalties.

## **PUBLIC OUTREACH**

The Commission warns the public about product related hazards through print, electronic, radio and broadcast media; and its Hotline, Web site, and other outreach activities. Also, the Commission meets with stakeholders to discuss matters related to the mission of the CPSC. This section presents many of the activities used to present safety information to consumers and industry in 2009 through:

- Consumer outreach:
- Dissemination of technical information; and
- Cooperation between Commission officials and stakeholders.
- 1) Consumer Outreach: CPSC alerts the public through recall alerts, print news releases, video and radio news releases, public service announcements, publications, national and local television appearances, the Hotline, listservs, the Internet (<a href="www.cpsc.gov">www.cpsc.gov</a>, <a href="www.recalls.gov">www.recalls.gov</a>, <a href="www.cpsc.gov/about/cpsia/cpsia.html">www.recalls.gov</a>, <a href="www.atvsafety.gov">www.atvsafety.gov</a>), the CPSIA Web page (<a href="www.cpsc.gov/about/cpsia/cpsia.html">www.cpsc.gov/about/cpsia/cpsia.html</a>), and other outreach activities. Furthermore, the Commission has launched CPSC 2.0 to keep the public informed, with the opportunity to participate in the safety discussion on issues that affect you directly, through Social Media efforts on <a href="YouTube">YouTube</a>, <a href="Twitter">Twitter</a>, <a href="Flickr">Flickr</a>, and official Blog site, <a href="OnSafety">OnSafety</a>.

The *Neighborhood Safety Network (NSN)* is a grassroots outreach program that provides timely lifesaving information to about 5,600 organizations and individuals who, in turn, share CPSC'ssafety posters and news alerts with underserved consumers who might otherwise never hear or receive the information from CPSC.

The "Drive to One Million" campaign was started in 2007. The goal is to have at least one million consumers sign up to receive, free of charge, potentially life-saving information electronically through CPSC's e-mail notification system including Spanish translations. Consumers can receive notice of recall information as it is released by signing up at www.cpsc.gov/cpsclist.aspx.

CPSC's Web site has grown rapidly from 13.7 million visits 4 years ago to about 40 million visits in 2009. This increase is due, in part, to the successful introduction of new technology that allows instantaneous release of information. CPSC now posts recalls and press releases in a format that allows TV stations and other media to obtain the information from CPSC's Web site and, in seconds, have the information posted on their Web sites.

The Hotline receives consumer complaints and provides information on product hazards and recalls to the public. The Clearinghouse provides injury data to staff and the public and provides manufacturers with consumer complaints, reported incidents, and investigations involving their products.

In December 2008, the Virginia Graeme Baker Pool and Spa Safety Act became effective. CPSC will be awarding a contract to implement a national information and education program targeting pool operators and owners, pool industry stakeholders, including state and local officials, and the general public through national and local media. It will focus efforts on providing messages for general pool safety with an emphasis on drowning prevention and the hidden dangers of drain entrapment.

- 2) Dissemination of Technical Information: As part of CPSC's research activities and other support work, the Commission develops many technical reports and presentations to present findings and share ideas. These documents are very useful to other researchers and industry. The reports listed here (on pages 119 and 120) were developed in 2009 and are located on CPSC's Web site.
- 3) Cooperation between Commission Officials and External Stakeholders: In the course of the year, the Commissioners and staff at the CPSC held meetings with consumers, industry and the public on matters related to the mission of the CPSC. A list of meetings of "substantial interest" for 2009 is provided in this report. CPSC's Meetings Policy defines "substantial interest" as concerning "any issue that is likely to be the subject of a regulatory or policy decision by the Commission." The Meetings Policy requires CPSC staff and Commissioners to: (1) announce meetings in advance on the Public Calendar, (2) hold meetings that are open to the public unless certain specified exceptions apply, and (3) submit meeting summaries to the Office of the Secretary. # Informed the public about the Consumer Product Safety Improvement Act (CPSIA) through:

**Summarizing CPSIA:** In 2009, staff prepared: summaries of 19 sections of CPSIA, a timeline of the rulemakings required in CPSIA, and responses to 88 frequently asked questions to explain the various CPSIA provisions.

**Developing guidance:** Staff developed two guidance documents, a Web page for small businesses, and produced a document for retailers and resellers of children's products. Staff also prepared, and the Commission approved the issuance of, draft guidance on which products are subject to the requirements in section 108 of CPSIA.

Furthermore, staff wrote six general counsel advisory opinions, guidance documents for General Certification as to Conformity and Statement of Commission Enforcement Policy on section 101 Lead Limits (effective February 10, 2009); and three stays of enforcement for two products under the lead rule and for accreditation requirements for certain children's products.

**Producing Public or Web-cast meetings:** Staff held 12 public meetings to discuss the requirements of CPSIA with stakeholders. All meeting links are available on CPSC's Web site <a href="https://www.cpsc.gov">www.cpsc.gov</a>.

# Alerted the public to imported consumer product hazards through:

**Consumer outreach:** In 2009, there were 530 million views of CPSC safety messages through television (TV) appearances and video news releases (VNRs) related to import safety campaigns and recalls for products such as toys, window blinds, and cribs.

**Public information efforts on imports:** In July, the Chairman conducted a national morning show interview during which she discussed two Chinese made products – cribs and floats – that posed entrapment and drowning hazards to children, respectively. The Chairman discussed the steps CPSC was taking to ensure that products such as cribs and baby floats are made safer.

In August, CPSC provided the national press with a statement regarding the Chairman's visit to the Port of Hong Kong, during which she discussed the positive impact that effective screening and enforcement overseas can have on the work of CPSC port inspectors in the U.S.

**Outreach on emerging hazard with imported drywall:** CPSC developed an online *Drywall Information Center* (<a href="www.DrywallResponse.gov">www.DrywallResponse.gov</a>), which provides the latest information on technical developments, news about the investigation, monthly updates, and a way for homeowners to report incidents to CPSC. Additionally, CPSC established an e-mail distribution (listsery) to disseminate noteworthy developments directly to interested parties.

## Alerted the public to fire-related hazards through:

**Consumer outreach:** There were 117 million views of CPSC safety messages related to fire hazards in 2009 through TV appearances, interviews, VNRs, and Web publications. Topics that generated the most coverage included the Maytag recall of refrigerators, the fireworks safety press conference, and holiday decorating safety.

#### **Public information efforts:**

**Fireworks** - CPSC launched the fireworks safety campaign on June 30, 2009, with a national press release, a video news release, and a national news conference on the National Mall in front of the U.S. Capitol featuring the CPSC Chairman; Assistant Attorney General for the Civil Division of the Department of Justice; Assistant Commissioner, Office of Trade for Customs and Border Protection within the Department of Homeland Security; and a representative from the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives. The video news release reached over 38 million viewers. The Chairman and CPSC staff conducted major media interviews including: CNN, ABC News, CBS News, FOX News, AP-TV, WAMU and WTOP radio, and Univision. CPSC staff also notified local and national media.

**Halloween -** In October, CPSC staff issued safety tips for a safe "trick or treat." Staff distributed to local and national media the news release that reminded parents and caregivers to keep safety in mind when selecting Halloween costumes, decorations, and treats. ABC's Good Morning America and other television news programs reported on Halloween safety tips issued by CPSC.

**Holiday Hazards -** In December, CPSC issued a news release announcing the "Do's and Don'ts" of holiday decorating. The news release included tips on selecting a fresh tree and preventing fires related to holiday decorations, which cost society millions of dollars in property damage. Staff distributed the safety message to safety partners in the Neighborhood Safety Network (NSN). National print and television media, including the CBS Early Show, the Washington Post, and New York Times picked up the safety message from the news release.

**Home Heating -** CPSC released a home heating safety podcast highlighting the safe use of space heaters, cooking equipment, the installation of smoke and CO alarms, and the recommendation for a professional inspection of all fuel-burning appliances. Later in the winter season, CPSC released a press release warning of deadly fire and carbon monoxide hazards with home heating and urged precautions with space heaters, fireplaces, stoves, and ovens.

**Smoke Alarms -** In two national news press releases (October 2008 and March 2009), CPSC featured the need for consumers to have working smoke alarms. An audio podcast on home heating safety in December 2008 and several articles published in *The Safety Review*, the Commission's newsletter (October 2008, January 2009, and February 2009), highlighted smoke alarms.

## Alerted the public to carbon monoxide hazards through:

**Consumer outreach:** In 2009, there were 4 million views of CPSC carbon monoxide (CO) safety messages by consumers through TV appearances, VNRs and the Commission's e-publications.

#### **Public information efforts:**

**CO Alarms -** Coinciding with daylight savings time in March 2009, staff issued a press release designed to increase carbon monoxide awareness that prominently featured the need for consumers to have working CO alarms. Staff provided information on CO alarms in conjunction with generator safety and other pertinent safety information relevant to storm recovery efforts. Additionally, there was an article in the January 2009 issue of *The Safety Review*, the Commission's newsletter, featuring CO alarms and a December 2008 audio podcast.

**Home Heating -** In 2009, as winter arrived marking the beginning of the home heating season, CPSC released a home heating safety podcast highlighting the need for annual routine professional maintenance of fuel burning appliances, including gas appliances to guard against fires and carbon monoxide poisoning. In the podcast, and also in a press release later in the winter season CPSC highlighted the importance of installing smoke and CO alarms, making sure they had fresh batteries, and recommended an annual professional inspection of all fuel-burning appliances.

**Portable Gas Generators -** In 2009, CPSC issued a press release coinciding with Daylight Saving Time reminding consumers never to use a generator inside their home in addition to advising them to change smoke and CO alarm batteries.

**Natural Disaster Preparedness -** In 2009, CPSC addressed CO poisoning hazards through the dissemination of print news releases. Also, in anticipation of potentially harsh weather conditions, staff translated CO warning door hanger cards into Spanish to achieve a wider reach to Hispanic communities.

# Alerted the public to children's and other hazards through:

**Consumer outreach:** In 2009, 550 million viewers were reached with CPSC safety messages related to children's and other hazards including pool safety, toy safety, and CPSIA, through TV appearances, VNRs, and e-publications.

#### **Public information efforts:**

**Drive to One Million -** In 2009, messages encouraging consumers to sign up for the "Drive to One Million" campaign were incorporated in all safety materials which were disseminated through mass media, the CPSC Web site, social media, and numerous national events and conferences at which CPSC staff participated. Staff used public and trade events to enlist subscribers by allowing them to sign up on the spot electronically. About 23,000 new subscribers signed up for recall alerts in 2009 bringing the total to over 280,000. Also, CPSC conducted outreach to large employers in the Mid-Atlantic states with positive responses from: Capitol One, General Dynamics, Marriott Corporation, Pepco, the American Red Cross, and Sprint. These employers have agreed to post messages about the recall alert subscription in company employee e-mail listservs and newsletters. In addition, CPSC field staff shared information about

recall alerts during visits to state and local contacts and while participating in state and local events.

**All Terrain Vehicle (ATV) Safety -** In 2009, staff conducted ATV outreach by utilizing grassroots communications, such as the Rapid Response program. The media has been receptive to this initiative, which has resulted in numerous interviews with local TV and radio stations as well as newspapers and trade magazines. The ATV Safety Web site had nearly 221,000 visits in 2009.

Baby Safety Month - In 2009, CPSC highlighted baby safety in a variety of ways throughout the year as well as during Baby Safety Month in September. Several national press releases were issued on major baby safety topics including the recall of over five million drop side cribs, baby safety gear, toys, drawstrings, window coverings, and furniture tip-over hazards. Also, CPSC drew attention to baby safety hazards by producing and distributing video news releases through the recalling firms, reaching tens of millions of viewers. In addition, CPSC partnered with Kids In Danger and Safe Kids Worldwide, both non-profit organizations, to disseminate baby safety information through the use of the Neighborhood Safety Network (NSN) poster - Safe Sleep for Babies. Moreover, staff updated and disseminated specific publications to emphasize baby safety including "Childproofing Your Home," and "Baby Safety Checklist." The Chairman and public affairs staff conducted numerous interviews on baby safety topics through a full spectrum of media: on national television morning shows, such as The Today Show, CBS Early Show, and ABC Good Morning America; through local television networks and evening news broadcasts; with multiple radio stations; print media, including parenting magazines and newspapers; and in on-line publications.

**Bicycle/Helmet Safety** - In 2009, CPSC released bicycle safety and bicycle helmet safety information to the public through national press releases, press conferences, NSN posters, a podcast, and a nationally distributed radio Public Service Announcement (PSA). CPSC highlighted bicycle helmet safety during two press conferences, Holiday Toy Safety in November 2008 and CPSC Back to School Safety in September 2009. Staff distributed information on helmet and bicycle safety tips through two NSN posters. CPSC's partner agency – National Highway Traffic Safety Administration – further facilitated distribution of the NSN posters. Staff distributed a helmet safety radio PSA nationally to 107 radio stations, reaching 90 of the top 100 markets, with audience figures reaching almost 10 million listeners.

**In-Home Drowning Prevention -** In 2009, staff disseminated a press release to all major media contacts warning parents of the hazards bathtubs, bath seats, buckets, and other products present to young children. Staff also produced a video news release (VNR) in English and Spanish using footage that explicitly showed the dangers associated with young children around water containers in and around the home. Staff posted the VNR on CPSC's social media page, *On Safety*, and on You Tube.

**Poison Prevention -** During Poison Prevention Week, CPSC warned consumers that 9 out of 10 unintentional poisonings occur in the home. To further promote the poison prevention message, CPSC staff created a podcast with recorded safety tips, participated in the Poison Prevention Week Council's media event at the National Press Club in Washington, DC, and issued a safety message to the Neighborhood Safety Network (NSN). Staff conducted interviews with Reuters Health and Despierta America, a Spanish-language news program on Univision, to bring attention to this matter.

**Product Tip-Over -** In September 2009, in partnership with Nationwide Children's Hospital of Columbus, Ohio, CPSC launched a multi-media campaign to alert parents to the dangers of televisions, heavy furniture, and freestanding ovens tipping over and crushing young children. The campaign included a powerful PSA featuring the mother of a victim, a doctor from Nationwide Children's Hospital, and a dramatic demonstration of a tipover incident. Also, CPSC staff produced a VNR, a podcast, a poster and a safety alert. Staff featured the campaign on CPSC's new social media site, allowing consumers to view the PSA on You Tube. Media coverage included an interview on Despierta America on Univision, reaching over 800,000 viewers.

**Safety Publication Update** - In 2009, staff updated the *Baby Safety Checklist* and *Childproofing Your Home*, both in English and Spanish. Staff also developed additional materials for water safety, drowning prevention, and furniture tipover safety during the year. Staff developed a process to review CPSC publications annually. Staff identifies publication candidates for revision; identifies the technical and communication staff with the appropriate expertise; develops a schedule; and works as a team to update the language, photos, and graphics in the publications.

Smart Holiday Shopping / Toy Safety - CPSC launched its annual holiday toy safety press release and press conference in November 2008. CPSC was accompanied by representatives from U.S. Customs and Border Protection and Safe Kids Worldwide at an event in Washington, DC. CPSC reminded parents to be diligent when making holiday shopping choices and provided toy safety tips on selecting gifts, a list of the top five toy hazards, and disseminated a Holiday Toy Safety NSN poster. Messages emphasized CPSC's Web site, <a href="www.cpsc.gov">www.cpsc.gov</a>, and <a href="www.cpsc.gov">www.cpsc.gov</a>, and encouraged consumers to sign-up to get direct e-mail notifications. Also, CPSC staff conducted local television, radio, on-line, and print media interviews to distribute toy safety information.

**Resale Round-Up -** In 2009, CPSC launched an outreach campaign to educate thrift and resale storeowners and employees as well as individual resellers of used products both online and at yard sales. CPSC created and distributed the *CPSC Handbook for Resale Stores and Product Resellers*, NSN posters in English and Spanish, an 8-minute instructional video for resale stores, and handbooks with recalled nursery products and toys. CPSC partnered with the Salvation Army, Goodwill, National Association of Retail & Thrift Shops, and Safe Kids Worldwide to help disseminate the literature and videos and to host in-store resale store seminars. CPSC staff and eight states conducted in-store resale safety seminars to help the stores comply with the new law; and 206 resale and consignment stores participated. The seminars will continue into 2010.

# Informed the public about the Virginia Graeme Baker Pool and Spa Safety Act (PSSA) through:

Consumer outreach: In 2009, CPSC staff participated in numerous print, TV and radio interviews where more than 80 million TV viewers were reached. In addition, CPSC staff cohosted a pool and spa safety media event with members of Congress, the family of a victim of an entrapment incident, and the American Red Cross. Several National TV interviews, including a Today Show segment featuring the Chairman, were posted on <a href="https://www.poolsafety.gov">www.poolsafety.gov</a> to help visitors understand the issues surrounding the new safety law. Wal-Mart aired CPSC's "Quickly and Quietly" PSA in hundreds of stores, in July and August of 2009, on their in store TV channel. An article in the May 2009 issue of *The Safety Review* (the Commission's newsletter) informed readers about the dangers of entrapment and the need for new drain covers and other devices at

public pools. This newsletter is posted on the CPSC's Web site and e-mailed to the Commission's listsery (300,000 recipients).

Conducted a public information and education campaign: In May 2009, staff created a new Web site, <a href="www.poolsafety.gov">www.poolsafety.gov</a>, which serves as the main location for information about the Pool & Spa Safety Act. The site has separate sections of information geared towards different audiences: pool owners and operators, the pool and spa industry, state and local officials, the public, and the media. Also, staff provided the media with safety messages coordinated with reports of drowning incidents, through CPSC's Rapid Response system. Rapid Response provides the media with timely educational materials about drowning prevention for use in follow-up stories when incidents are still in the public's mind. Staff updated the Neighborhood Safety Network page on drowning prevention to include new publications and new data on drowning.

Conducted drain entrapment hazards information and education efforts: In 2009, CPSC staff spoke before three groups of state and local health officials; participated in six industry Webinars, conference calls, and other electronic activities with pool and spa community stakeholders; and developed presentations for industry events and online viewing (a PowerPoint presentation detailing the VGB Act and an update of another presentation). Also, staff prepared and disseminated, to the national media, a press release on the release of two epidemiology reports on entrapment incidents and children's drowning. Staff updated posters on pool safety and created a new brochure, in English and Spanish, for groups and organizations concerned with children's safety, drowning, and entrapment prevention. Staff shared hard copies of these with stakeholders and posted the publications on the Web sites <a href="www.cpsc.gov">www.cpsc.gov</a> and <a hre

## INTERGOVERNMENTAL COORDINATION

The Commission works with many agencies over the course of a year. This section describes the significant coordination CPSC has had with other governmental organizations. Specifically, this section provides information on: 1) major state supported safety initiatives (Virginia Graeme Baker Pool and Spa Safety Act and All-Terrain Vehicles); 2) the Commission's efforts coordinating with state and local programs; and 3) significant communication with other governmental agencies and offices, including any notification under section 218 of the CPSIA. In 2009, no state or local official has filed a written notice to the Commission under section 218 of the CPSIA.

## 1) Major State Supported Safety Initiatives

**Virginia Graeme Baker Pool and Spa Safety Act:** In 2009, the CPSC, through the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) / National Center for Injury Control and Prevention (NCIPC), entered into an Interagency Agreement to implement sections 1405 and 1406 of the Virginia Graeme Baker Pool and Spa Safety Act (VGB Act). The VGB Act establishes a grant program for which states that have a statute requiring pools and spas to meet specific antientrapment and barrier requirements are eligible to apply.

**All-Terrain Vehicles (ATVs):** As noted on CPSC's Web site, <u>www.atvsafety.gov</u>, 44 states have passed ATV safety laws, with each statute tailored to meet the needs of its particular region and constituency. These laws include requirements for various safety practices of ATV riding, such as helmet use, training, licensing, and/or age restrictions.

## 2) State and Local Programs

Section 29(a) of the Consumer Product Safety Act requires that the Commission establish a program to promote federal-state cooperation for the purpose of carrying out the Act. The goal of the program is to reduce consumer product related deaths and injuries by leveraging CPSC resources through cost-effective cooperation with state and local governments. In 2009, activities included the following:

- Assigning compliance and enforcement activities to the states. The table on the next page provides the number of CPSC assignments to state officials made during the year,
- Supporting states through technical assistance and participation in conferences.
- Monitoring industry's compliance to CPSC mandatory laws,
- Engaging in outreach and dissemination of information through multiple venues such as journal, print and electronic media; presentations and sharing product safety research,
- Hosting the annual training meeting for state designees,
- Working to meet or exceed annual performance goals. In 2009, state partners conducted product safety activities, including recall checks and inspections, and completed 96 percent within 90 days or less of assignment.
