Integrated Care Models: Creating and Implementing More Coordinated, Person-Centered Care

The *Value-Based Purchasing Medicaid and CHIP Learning Collaborative* (MAC Collaborative) was established by the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) to work with states to advance the development and implementation of Integrated Care Models (ICMs). These emerging models have the goal of improving the quality and cost of care for Medicaid beneficiaries by replacing incentives for quantity and volume with new incentives that reward quality and value. CMS' recent State Medicaid Director letters (SMDL 12-001 and 12-002 released on July 10, 2012) discuss the policy considerations for ICMs and identify the regulatory pathways states can take in creating these new models.

This webinar will profile Minnesota's efforts to develop an ICM with a focus on how the state and CMS have worked together to further an ICM approach in the context of existing authorities. It will outline considerations to help states: (1) conceptualize and articulate key concepts for proposed ICM programs; and (2) initiate discussions with CMS regarding the proposed ICM program. The session is open to all interested states and federal agencies, and additional audiences as appropriate.
