Particular attention will be paid to reviewing the technology submission and certification process, procedural requirements, and significant technical issues and requirements.

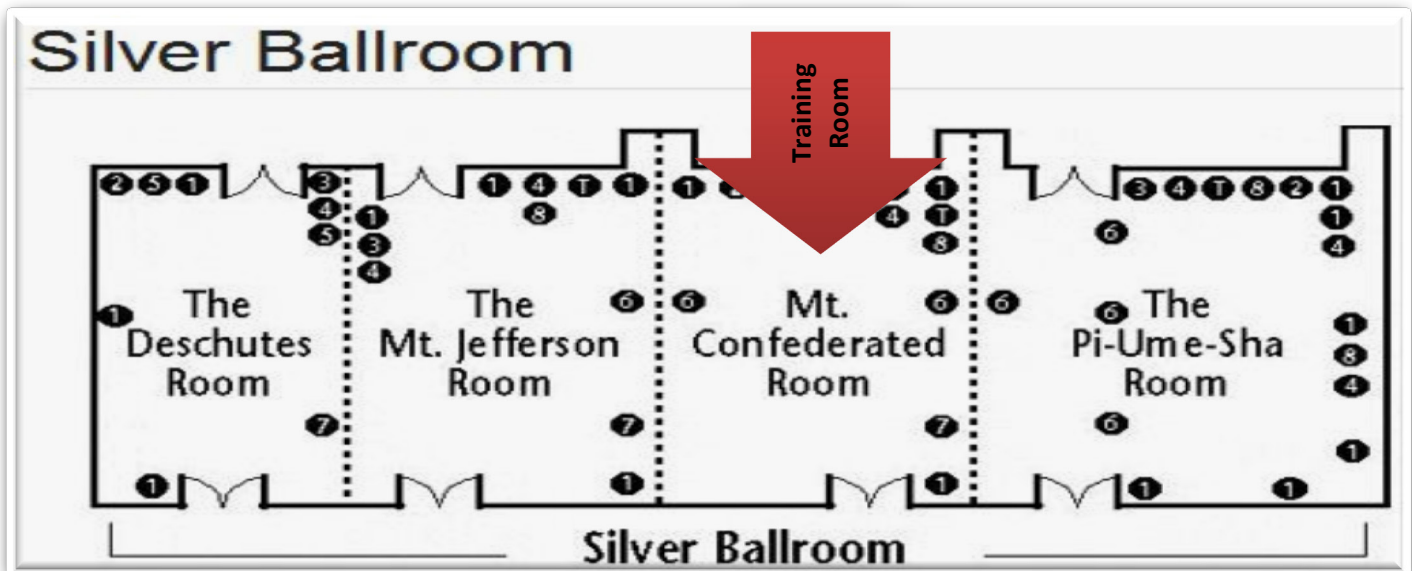
