Activity Update

- Contact Center 24/7 as of October 19
- Adobe Reader versions released
 - Version 8.1.7 and 9.2
 - Grants.gov compatible versions
 - \bullet 8.1.1 8.1.7
 - 9.0 9.2



FY 09 Year in Review

- March 3, 2009 completed transition to Adobe
- April 27 highest applications received: 8,392
- Accomplished 6 system builds
 - Implemented 67 system enhancements
 - Incorporated the registration process into Grants.gov
- System validating applications in less than three minutes
 - Service Level is 48 hours



FY 09 Year in Review

- Conducted 72 interactive sessions reaching 6,930 community stakeholders
- Began Technical Augmentation Design (Boost)
- Conducted self assessment for security



Technical Augmentation Design "Boost"

- Increase network performance
- Increase system capacity to handle larger number of applications
- Additional & upgraded hardware
- Increased system monitoring



Technical Augmentation Design "Boost"

Benefits

- Additional hardware and software enhancements
 - Further stabilize and increase reliability at higher volume levels
- Ensures capacity to handle growth

Schedule

- Award of contract modification September 3, 2009
 - Completion of Phases 1 4: 2nd Quarter FY2010
 - Completion of Phase 5 (last phase): Early 3rd Quarter FY 2010



Security Assessment

- Certification & Assessment (C&A) on HHS systems mandatory to obtain Authority To Operate (ATO)
 - Grants.gov self assessment complete
 - Ten areas need to be addressed
 - System build needed to implement required security updates
 - Formal C&A to be done during the Boost after the build
 - Targeting 2nd quarter FY 10



Applicant Tips

- Common rejection errors
 - Incorrect DUNS# on SF424
 - AOR not authorized
 - Attachment Names with spaces or special characters
 - Special Characters in forms
- Ensure registration process is complete



Applicant Tips

- Accidentally submit multiple applications for the same opportunity
 - Call the Agency PoC listed on the opportunity
- Check Application Criteria
 - Cannot submit unsolicited proposals
- Submit early enough to make corrections if needed



Applicant Tips: Forms

- Identify your nine digit ZIP code
- Collect all information for project/ performance site locations



Applicant Tips: System-to-System (S2S)

- Certificate installation requests
 - Submit using the Certificate Request
 Form on the web site
- Existing certificate nearing expiration
 - Submit your renewal request at least 2 weeks prior to the expiration date



Applicant Perspective: Forms

- Option to view/print the entire application
- Understandable error messages
- Ability to see all errors in an application with "check package for errors"
- Auto-fill succeeding budget periods with data from previous years
- Functionality to work on any budget year or key person at any time



Applicant Perspective: Forms

- Allow double-clicking to open forms
- Application-related identification information in the 2nd to 4th system-generated messages
- Allow users to enter standard institutional data from a master profile or reuse old applications
- Allow simultaneous multiple users



Applicant Perspective: Forms

- Allow for the addition of any number of budget periods, sub-awards, and key persons in forms
- Create work-around for (or fix) the bug to allow removal of single key person
- Require all agencies to use forms and fields in the same way



Applicant Perspective: S2S

- Provide style sheets for the Adobe forms
- Provide a stable and robust test environment that is available 24 hours a day
- Mirror all active opportunity packages in the testing environment for improved testing
- 90-day lead-time for new/modified forms



Applicant Perspective: S2S

- Error messages must clearly communicate the issue
- Status of current development and infrastructure work made public
- System performance metrics made available real time
