**NOTICE OF COMMISSION DETERMINATION NOT TO REVIEW AN INITIAL
DETERMINATION EXTENDING THE TARGET DATE BY TWO WEEKS**

SUMMARY: Notice is hereby given that the U.S. International Trade Commission has determined not to review an initial determination (“ID”) (Order No. 22) of the presiding administrative law judge (“ALJ”) extending the target date for completion of the above-captioned investigation by two weeks.

SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION: The Commission instituted this investigation on August 5, 2011, based on a complaint filed by Apple Inc. (“Apple”) of Cupertino, California.⁷⁶ *Fed. Reg.* 47610 (Aug. 5, 2011). The complaint alleges violations of section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended, 19 U.S.C. § 1337, in the importation into the United States, the sale for importation, and the sale within the United States after importation of certain electronic digital media devices and components thereof by reason of infringement of certain claims of U.S. Patent Nos. 7,479,949 (“the ’949 patent”); RE 41,922; 7,863,533 (“the ’533 patent”); 7,789,697 (“the ’697 patent”); 7,912,501; D558,757; and D618,678. The complaint further alleges the existence of a domestic industry. The respondents named in the Commission’s notice of investigation are Samsung Electronics Co, Ltd. of Korea; Samsung Electronics America, Inc. of Ridgefield Park, New Jersey; and Samsung Telecommunications America, LLC of Richardson,

Texas.

On March 9, 2012, Apple filed a motion to terminate the investigation in part with respect to the asserted claims of the '533 patent, claims 1-3, 11, 12, 15, 16, and 21-27 of the '697 patent, and claim 3 of the '949 patent. On April 17, 2012, the ALJ granted the motion pursuant to 19 C.F.R. § 210.21(a)(1) (Order No. 17). No petitions for review were filed. The Commission determined not to review the ID.

On July 12, 2012, the ALJ issued the subject ID, extending the target date by two weeks from February 5, 2013 to February 19, 2013.

No petitions for review of this ID were filed. The Commission has determined not to review the ID.

The authority for the Commission's determination is contained in section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended (19 U.S.C. § 1337), and in section 210.42 of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure (19 C.F.R. § 210.42).
