Recommended Indicators of Family Readiness Program Success

RECOMMENDED SELECTION CRITERIA:

The winning unit should show evidence of strong unit Family Readiness efforts. For example:

- Command involvement in the Family Readiness Program
- Innovative development of Family Readiness programs and initiatives
- Community linkage to broaden support and resources available to Guard/Reserve families
- Total Force focus providing support to military families regardless of Service affiliation

EXAMPLES OR EVIDENCE OF FAMILY PROGRAM SUCCESS:

- Command Involvement
 - o Specific examples of command support for Family Readiness
- <u>Innovative Development</u>
 - o Introduction of new or improved Family Programs, services, and/or communication
 - o Ability to contact a high percentage of unit spouses (or other appropriate/designated Family member) with Family Support information
 - o Measurable ability to distribute critical Family program information (e.g., welcome packages, Family Readiness information, education briefs to families, creative use of social media, and command communications to members/families)
 - o Readiness shown by a high-percentage of DEERS enrollment
 - o Member satisfaction on post-deployment or exit surveys
 - o Effectively communicating the availability of Quality of Life programs
 - o Families successfully contact emergency POCs during unit deployments

• Community Linkage

- Evidence of "bridges built" between the Family Readiness Program and local community, such as outreach to:
 - o Faith communities
 - o Veteran Service Organizations
 - o Local government and schools
 - o Behavioral health providers
 - Medical resources
 - o Child Care providers
 - o Household services (e.g., plumbers, electricians, mechanics, etc.)

• Total Force Focus

- o Family Readiness programs that ensure Guard/Reserve families are seamlessly integrated into the Total Force
- o Delivery of support services to the Total Force (unit and individual support given regardless of service branch)
- o Guard/Reserve Family Readiness personnel establish clear working relationships with Active Component Family Readiness contacts
