

Q:

The SGA places a limit (40 percent) in the number of participants that can receive related assistance services? Could you clarify what that means?

A:

The SGA states that the number of participants receiving related assistance services should be limited to 40 percent or less **of the total number of participants**(emphasis added). **To clarify, the number of participants receiving related assistance services ONLY cannot exceed 40 percent of the total number of participants enrolled in the program.**

The NFJP is primarily a job training program whose purpose is to assist eligible migrant and seasonal farmworkers and their families prepare for jobs that provide stable, year-round employment, within or outside agriculture. Therefore, the majority of participants served through the program should be receiving employment and training services to assist them towards that goal.
