The purpose of the General Counsel Tracking System is to provide automated means of tracking the workload of the OGC, including that of each OGC staff member; and it tracks important milestone actions such as court filing dates for pending litigation. It permits the sharing of information among DoDEA OGC staff members, including documents related to current and past matters, cases, grievanced, arbitrations, and legal advice related to matters currently being worked on as well as previously addressed. Occasionally, PII may be input into the database by an attorney, generally when a document is attached to the attorney's report. When included, the PII may contain information about the litigants or party raising an issue and may include name, duty location, address and phone number, position, age, date of birth, and such matters as are germain to resolving the issue(s), including the names and addresses of witnesses.

(2) Briefly describe the privacy risks associated with the PII collected and how these risks are addressed to safeguard privacy.

To address the risk of unauthorized access to and use of the PII collected information, access to the system is password protected. Users of the system have or do not have privileges to access certain records, depending on the team to which the user belongs and the role that the user is assigned. Data input into the system is often redacted of PII when that information is not essential to identify the issue being addressed.
