As part of this, we make sure they are not affiliated with the actual project, have no other conflict of interest, etc.

However, for some really high impact products (such as the global warming/polar bear report), we go totally with outside review... though that can take substantial time.

In this case, because USGS has no authorship or technical link to this product, I see no issues with tapping into USGS for reviewers. Your call, though.
