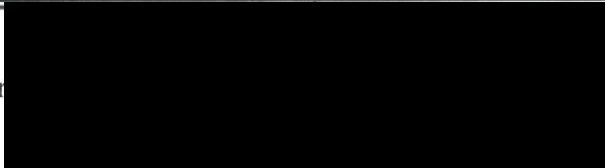

Dr. Daniel P. Ahn is the chief commodities economist at Citigroup in New York. He is responsible for fundamental and quantitative research of commodity markets, their relationship with the global macroeconomy and other asset classes, and the development of commodity investment solutions.

Previously, he worked at Lehman Brothers and Barclays Capital, and was most recently the chief US economist at Citadel Investment Group.

He is also an adjunct Assistant Professor at Columbia University School of International and Public Affairs. Dr. Ahn is also an adjunct Research Fellow at the Council of Foreign Relations in New York.

He has held research and teaching positions at Harvard University, the John F. Kennedy School of Government, and the National Bureau of Economic Research.

His academic research specializes in international and behavioral finance and the economics of national security, and is forthcoming in leading journals. His policy research has been cited in US Congressional testimony and by the US Vice President's Office.

He received his A.B. in economics and finance with honors from Princeton University. Subsequently, he received his Ph.D. in economics from Harvard University.
