Background

Project Description

- 3 year research plan and timeline (pages 4 through 11)
 O Design final research and development program
 - \odot Conduct competitive sub-grant competitions
 - Work closely with EAC and NIST to develop funding solicitations, manage award approval process, issue subgrants, negotiate and oversee deliverables
 - \odot Disseminate findings and tested recommendations

 \odot Ensure delivery of key findings by early 2012

- Minimum of 63% of total budget \rightarrow sub-grantees for research
- Funds for direct research by intermediary capped at 15%
- Matching funds not required, but encouraged

Eligibility

- Section III(A)
- Who can/cannot apply
- Identify only one organization as the lead
