

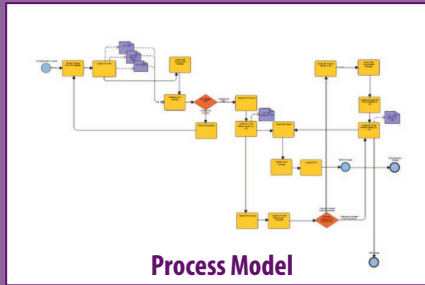

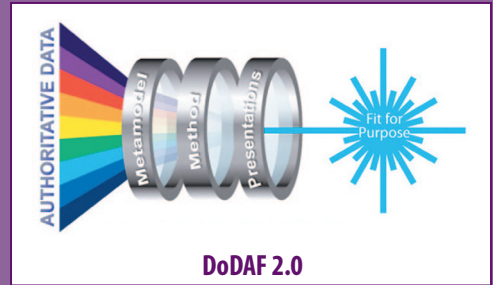

### EA "At a Glance"

November 1, 2010

EA "At a Glance" is a beginner's guide to EA with an emphasis on the fundamentals of architecture. This half-day introductory class is geared toward individuals looking to learn basic EA concepts. Participants learn what EA is, why it's developed in an organization, and how it's applied to solve real-world problems.

**Who Should Attend?** – New architects, architecture managers or managers of EA related disciplines (Portfolio Management (PFM), Investment Review Board (IRB), Acquisition, Business Process Reengineering (BPR)) will gain a broader understanding of EA and the specific transformation initiatives to which it can be applied.

### Managing EA Programs

November 2, 2010

Managing EA Programs is a full-day class for individuals who manage new or existing EA programs at their DoD organization. Presentations from experienced EA managers cover the key aspects associated with building and maintaining an architecture that effectively fits the purpose of the organization. The class also covers EA federation, the relationships between the Department of Defense Architecture Framework (DoDAF) and other government architecture frameworks, and the most common tools used to develop EA.

**Who Should Attend?** – New EA managers or managers of EA-related disciplines (PFM, IRB, Acquisition, and BPR) will gain a broader understanding of how architecture information can be applied to help solve various business challenges.

### Transitioning to a DoDAF V2.0 Architecture

November 3, 2010

The half-day Transitioning to a DoDAF V2.0 Architecture class focuses on the newest version of DoDAF and highlights the differences between DoDAF V1.5 and DoDAF V2.0. In addition to the new data meta-model and the new and/or revised viewpoints, much of the class will discuss the concept of "Fit For a Purpose" Architecture: what it is, how it is acquired, and how it is used.

**Who Should Attend?** – Enterprise Architects or EA managers who have already developed a DoDAF V1.5 compliant architecture will learn what DoDAF V2.0 changes mean for their architecture and how best to transition.

Personnel and Readiness Information Management (P&R IM) hosts the quarterly Human Resources Management (HRM) Enterprise Architecture (EA) Collaboration Forum to share information on current initiatives, support HRM EA federation, and champion the integration, standardization, and interoperability of HRM EA products.
