Bonds for private awards are held in trust, the proceeds thereof when received at maturity to be distributed by the Treasury to the claimants. Bonds mature on March 31 and September 30 of each year in the principal amount of RM 20,400,000 each. No payments are to be made on Government awards until all private awards are paid in full.
