


The State of Minority Business:

California

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
- In 2002, there were more than 915,000 minority firms in California generating over \$195 billion in gross receipts.
- These firms also employed almost 1.3 million workers.
- Minority firms represented 33% of all 'classifiable' firms located in the state.
- The number of minority firms in California increased by 24% between 1997 and 2002, compared to 13% for all 'classifiable' firms in the state.
- California had the largest minority population in the country, numbering about 19 million or 54.3% of the state's total population in 2002.


Percentage of Minority Population, Number of Firms and Gross Receipts Compared to Classifiable Firms, California – 2002



- In 2002, only Asian Americans reached parity in their number of firms as it compares to their representation in the U.S. population. No other minority group reached parity in their number of firms or gross receipts.
- If minority business activity in California matched the state's minority population percentage in 2002, the number of minority firms in the state would have exceeded 1.5 million. They would have generated \$632 billion in gross receipts and employed almost 3.8 million workers.

Statistics for All Minority, Classifiable Firms and all groups do not include publicly-held, foreign-owned and non-profit entities. Classifiable Firms include minority-owned firms. These are firms whose ownership can be classified by race, gender of Hispanic origin. Total numbers for Classifiable Firms represent MBDA estimates. Hispanics may be of any race, because business owners were allowed to identify with more than one race category. Due to the exclusion of tribally held governments in 2002, data for American Indian and Alaska Native firms for 1997 and 2002 are not directly comparable. Population estimates for 2002 were for all ages.

- While smaller in number, minority-owned Strategic Growth Initiative (SGI) firms, which have annual receipts of \$500,000 or more, generate a much larger percentage of all the group's revenues and paid employment than firms with receipts under \$500,000.
- In 2002, SGI firms generated about 77% of all receipts grossed by all minority firms in California and employed 76% of all paid workers employed by minority firms in that state.
- Minority-owned firms in California were also more concentrated in the following industries: other services; health care and social assistance; and professional, scientific, and technical services.
