


The State of Minority Business:

Iowa


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
- In 2002, there were nearly 5,500 minority firms in Iowa generating about \$1.1 billion in gross receipts.
- These firms also employed 10,000 to 24,999 workers.
- Minority firms represented 2.4% of all 'classifiable' firms located in the state.
- The number of minority firms in Iowa increased by 4% between 1997 and 2002, compared to 3% for all 'classifiable' firms in the state.
- Iowa had a small minority population, numbering about 231,000 or 8% of the state's total population in 2002.






- In lowa, no minority group has reached parity in their number of firms or gross receipts when compared to their representation in the state's population.
- If minority business activity in Iowa matched the state's minority population percentage in 2002, the number of minority firms in the state would have exceeded 18,000 and they would have generated over \$6.4 billion in gross receipts and employed more than 43,800 workers.

Minority Firms in Iowa by Gross Receipts Size, 2002



- While smaller in number, Strategic Growth Initiative (SGI) minority-owned firms, which have annual receipts of \$500,000 or more, generate a much larger percentage of all the group's revenues and paid employment than firms with receipts under \$500,000.
- In 2002, minority-owned firms with receipts of \$500,000 or more generated about 75% of all receipts grossed by all minority firms in Iowa and employed 78% of all paid workers employed by minority firms in that state.
- Minority-owned firms in Iowa were also more concentrated in the following industries: health care and social assistance; other services; retail trade; and accommodation and food services.

S = Estimates are suppressed when publication standards are not met. Total percentages for minority firms may exceed 100% because some firms may be classified under more than one industry. In this analysis, SGI firms are minority firms which generate \$500,000 or more in annual gross receipts.
