


The State of Minority Business:

New Mexico

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Change in Number of Firms and Gross Receipts for Firms in New Mexico 1997 - 2002


- In 2002, there were nearly 40,000 minority firms in New Mexico generating about \$6 billion in gross receipts, and employing between 50,000 to 99,999 workers.
- The number of minority firms in New Mexico increased by 5% between 1997 and 2002, compared to 3% for all 'classifiable' firms in the state.
- Minority firms represented 30% of all 'classifiable' firms located in the state.
- New Mexico had the 23rd largest minority population in the country, numbering about 1.0 million or 56% of the state's total population in 2002.


Percentage of Minority Population, Number of Firms and Gross Receipts Compared to Classifiable Firms, New Mexico – 2002



- In New Mexico, only Asian Americans have reached parity in their number of firms and gross receipts when compared to their representation in the state's population. No other minority group has reached parity in the number of firms and gross receipts.
- If minority business activity in New Mexico matched the state's minority population percentage in 2002, the number of minority firms in the state would have exceeded 74,000 and they would have generated over \$21 billion in gross receipts and employed more than 168,000 workers.

Minority Firms in New Mexico by Gross Receipts Size, 2002



- While smaller in number, Strategic Growth Initiative (SGI) minority-owned firms, which have annual gross receipts of \$500,000 or more, generate a much larger percentage of the group's revenues and paid employment than firms with receipts under \$500,000.
- In 2002, minority-owned firms with receipts of \$500,000 or more generated about 75% of all receipts grossed by all minority firms in New Mexico and employed 73% of all paid workers employed by minority firms in that state.
- Minority-owned firms in New Mexico were also more concentrated in the following industries: other services; health care and social assistance; construction; and retail trade.

S = Estimates are suppressed when publication standards are not met. Total percentages for minority firms may exceed 100% because some firms may be classified under more than one industry. In this analysis, SGI firms are minority firms which generate \$500,000 or more in annual gross receipts.
