


# The State of Minority Business:


- In 2002, there were over 41,200 minority firms in Tennessee generating nearly \$5.6 billion in gross receipts.
- These firms also employed over 52,000 workers.
- Minority firms represented 9.3% of all 'classifiable' firms located in the state.
- The number of minority firms in Tennessee increased by 27% between 1997 and 2002, compared to 9% for all 'classifiable' firms in the state.
- Tennessee has the 19<sup>th</sup> largest minority population, numbering more than 1.2 million people or 21.2% of the Tennessee's total population in 2002.


# Percentage of Minority Population, Number of Firms and Gross Receipts Compared to Classifiable Firms, Tennessee – 2002



- In Tennessee, American Indian and Alaska Natives, and Asians have reached parity in their number of firms when compared to their representation in the state's population. Asians have also reached parity in their gross receipts. No other minority group has reached parity.
- If minority business activity in Tennessee matched the state's minority population percentage in 2002, the number of minority firms in the state would have reached about 94,400 and they would have generated over \$33.9 billion in gross receipts and employed nearly 217,000 workers.

Change in number of firms and gross receipts for Native Hawaiian and Other Pacific Islanders, as well as the group's share were not included because data was withheld or suppressed. Population estimates for 2002 were for all ages.

## Minority Firms in Tennessee, by Gross Receipts Size, 2002



- While smaller in number, Strategic Growth Initiative (SGI) minority-owned firms, which have annual receipts of \$500,000 or more, generate a much larger percentage of all the group's revenues and paid employment than firms with receipts under \$500,000.
- In 2002, minority-owned firms with receipts of \$500,000 or more generated about 72% of all receipts grossed by all minority firms in Tennessee and employed 68% of all paid workers employed by minority firms in that state.
- Minority-owned firms in Tennessee were most concentrated in the following industries: other services; health care and social assistance; retail trade; and construction.
