RULES AND RELATED MATTERS

AMENDMENTS TO RULES 30-4(a)(7), 19b, AND 17(a) ADOPTED

The Commission adopted an amendment to Rule 30-4(a)(7) of the Rules on Organization, Conduct and Ethics, and Information and Requests (and a conforming amendment to Rule 19b of those rules) to provide the Director of the Division of Enforcement with authority to grant access to the Commission's regulatory files. The amended rule requires the concurrence of the head of the division or office responsible for the files before access may be granted. The Commission also adopted an amendment to Rule 7(a) of the Rules Relating to Investigations to permit officials in the Regional Offices at the level of Assistant Regional Administrator and higher to approve the furnishing of copies of formal orders of investigation to persons testifying or producing documents in investigative proceedings. COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENTS

KATHRYN NATALE NAMED ASSISTANT DIRECTOR, DIVISION OF MARKET REGULATION

Kathryn Natale has recently been named Assistant Director of the Division of Market Regulation. She will be responsible for matters concerning the national market system and the over-the-counter markets. Ms. Natale replaces Michael J. Simon who joined the National Securities Clearing Corporations in late 1986.

Ms. Natale was legal counsel to Commissioner Charles C. Cox., a position she has held since April 1985. As counsel to the Commissioner, she had an opportunity to review many issues pertaining to the national market system and the over-the-counter markets.

Prior to joining the Commission, Ms. Natale was a judicial law clerk for the Honorable William C. Pryor, District of Columbia Court of Appeals. Earlier, she worked as a law clerk for the Board on Professional Responsibility for the District of Columbia and for the D.C. Jail Legal Aid Project.

Ms. Natale received her J.D. from the Antioch School of Law in 1982, where she was Editor-in-Chief of the Antioch Law Journal, and her B.A. in English/Psychology from the City University of New York in 1973.

ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

PROCEEDINGS INSTITUTED AGAINST GARY M. WERTMAN

The Commission issued an Order Instituting Proceedings under Section 15(b)(6) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 and Findings and Order in administrative proceedings against Gary M. Wertman, formerly an assistant branch office manager at Norbay Securities, Inc. The Order suspends Wertman for four months from associating with any broker, dealer, investment adviser, investment company, municipal securities broker, or municipal securities dealer. Thereafter, Wertman is suspended for nine months from holding, being employed in or performing the duties of any supervisory position with any broker, dealer, investment adviser, investment company, municipal securities broker, or municipal securities dealer. Wertman submitted an Offer of Settlement, consenting to the Order without admitting or denying the facts, findings, or conclusions set forth therein.

The Order is based upon a permanent injunction, entered in an action brought by the Commission against Wertman, to which he consented without admitting or denying the allegations of the complaint. The complaint alleged, among other things, that Wertman aided and abetted violations of the securities laws in connection with sales of the stock of Worldwide Ventures Corp. (Rel. 34-24247)

INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

VIKING TAX-FREE FUND, INC.

An order has been issued on an application declaring that Viking Tax-Free Fund, Inc. has ceased to be an investment company. (Rel. IC-15666 - April 7)

TRANSAMERICA LIFE INSURANCE AND ANNUITY COMPANY

An order has been issued granting Transamerica Life Insurance and Annuity Company, et al, exemptions from Sections 26(a)(2)(C) and 27(c)(2) of the Investment Company Act to permit a daily deduction of a charge for mortality and expense risks. (Rel. IC-15667 - April 7)

SALOMON BROTHERS INC.

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until May 4 to request a hearing on an application filed by Salomon Brothers Inc. for an order granting an exemption from all provisions of the Investment Company Act permitting it to issue "stripped" certificates evidencing interests in the principal or interest payments due on certain bonds held in the custody of a major commercial bank. HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

OHIO POWER COMPANY

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until April 20 to request a hearing on a proposal by the following company filed under Release 35-24354, dated March 26: Ohio Power Company - subsidiary of American Electric Power Company, Inc., to redeem the outstanding shares of three series of its preferred stock.

ALLEGHENY POWER SYSTEM, INC.

An order has been issued authorizing Allegheny Power System, a registered holding company, to amend its charter to increase the authorized number of common shares from 55,000,000 to 130,000,000. It is also authorized to solicit proxies with regard to the proposed charter amendment. (Rel. 35-24355 - March 27)

ALLEGHENY GENERATING COMPANY

An order has been issued authorizing Allegheny Generating Company, subsidiary of Monongahela Power Company, The Potomac Edison Company, and West Penn Power Company, to issue and sell to dealers in commercial paper up to \$300 million of short-term promissory notes from April 1, 1987 through March 31, 1989. Such commercial paper will be backed by a funding commitment through a previously authorized \$400 million revolving credit agreement. An exception is granted from the competitive bidding requirements of Rule 50, under Rule 50(a)(5). (Rel. 35-24356 - March 30)

SELF-REGULATORY ORGANIZATIONS

IMMEDIATE EFFECTIVENESS OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Options Clearing Corporation filed a proposed rule change which has become immediately effective. OCC's proposal (SR-OCC-87-4) will allow pledges of long options positions in individual non-proprietary market-maker accounts. (Rel. 34-24302)

APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Commission approved a proposed rule change filed by the American Stock Exchange (SR-Amex-86-24) which authorizes it to issue a new class of trading permits, called "Limited Trading Permits," which enable a holder to trade any Amex options product other than individual stock options. (Rel. 34-24303)

NOTICE OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Philadelphia Stock Exchange filed a proposed rule change under Rule 19b-4 (SR-Phlx-86-8) modifying its procedures regarding position and exercise limit exemptions. Publication of the proposal is expected to be made in the Federal Register during the week of April 6. (Rel. 34-24304)

Companies and individuals must report to the Commission within ten days on Schedule 13D if after the acquisition of equity securities of a public company their beneficial interest therein exceeds five percent. Persons eligible to use the short form (Schedule 13G) may in lieu of filing a Schedule 13D file a Schedule 13G within 45 days after the end of the calendar year in which the person became subject to Section 13(d)(1). Companies and individuals making a tender offer must have on file at the time the tender offer commences a Schedule 14D-1.
