COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENT

SEC ISSUES INTERPRETATION OF RULE 15c3-3. Due to a number of requests for interpretations of various provisions of Rule 15c3-3 which the Commission adopted on November 10, 1972 to be effective January 15, 1973 concerning the obligation of a broker-dealer to maintain reserves with respect to customer funds and to obtain physical possession or control of customers' securities, the Commission released today certain of the Division of Market Regulation's interpretations of the Rule in the interest of assisting brokers and dealers in complying with the Rule's provisions. These interpretations which are controlling at this time include: (a) refinement of the definition of terms "customer" and "excess margin securities;" (b) discussion of the provision permitting same day receipt and redelivery (turnaround); (c) explanation of the time at which customers' securities become available to the broker-dealer for delivery; (d) elaboration of records necessary to establish that customers' securities are in the broker-dealers possession or control; (e) discussion of when a broker-dealer may borrow securities to meet a deficiency; (f) permission for broker-dealers to "net" aggregate customer debits and credits in interim computations; and (g) permission for broker-dealers to make certain allocations where its records are not sufficient to make specific identification of customer's transactions. COURT ENFORCEMENT ACTION

FIRST EASTERN INVESTMENT CORP., OTHERS ENJOINED. The SEC New York Regional Office announced that on December 11 the Federal court in Trenton, N.J., had permanently enjoined First Eastern Investment Corp., of Red Bank, N.J., Jack S. Skakandy, president, Yens Joseph Nelson, Jr., former vice president, and Thomas M. Flaherty, treasurer, from violations of the net capital requirements of the Federal securities laws and First Eastern, Skakandy and Flaherty from violations of the bookkeeping and supplemental operational and financial provisions. Burton Perskin was appointed as SIPC trustee. The defendants consented to the court order and to the appointment of the trustee without admitting or denying the allegations. (LR-5680)

HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

THE COLUMBIA GAS SYSTEM. The SEC has issued an order authorizing The Columbia Gas System, Inc. of Wilmington, Delaware and its wholly-owned subsidiary companies to effectuate certain intra-system financial transactions, the stated objective of which is to coordinate and make maximum use of the System's internal flow of cash. The proposed transactions, covering the year 1973, include (a) the prepayment by subsidiary companies with excess cash accumulations of a portion of their long-term notes held by the parent company; (b) open account advances by the parent to such subsidiaries if required by the latter after prepayment of notes; and (c) discharge of such advances by reinstatement of notes previously prepaid. NORTHEAST UTILITIES. The SEC has issued an order authorizing Connecticut Light and Power Company of Berlin, Connecticut, subsidiary of Northeast Utilities, to make a \$75,000 capital contribution to its wholly-owned nonutility subsidiary, The Shelton Canal Company, in order for Shelton to meet its unexpected capital and maintenance expenses in 1972. CENTRAL AND SOUTH WEST CORPORATION. The SEC has issued an order upon an application of Central and South West Corporation, and one of its electric utility subsidiary companies, West Texas Utilities Company, authorizing the proposed amendment of the charter of the subsidiary to increase the par value of its common stock and the transfer from earned surplus to common stock capital account of the appropriate amount. DELMARVA POWER & LIGHT COMPANY and JERSEY CENTRAL POWER & LIGHT COMPANY. The SEC has issued an order regarding Delmarva Power & Light Company, Wilmington, Del. holding company, and Jersey Central Power & Light Company, Morristown subsidiary of General Public Utilities Corporation, authorizing the proposed guaranties of loans of a nonaffiliated coal company. (Rel 35-17835)

MAINE YANKEE ATOMIC POWER CO. The SEC has issued an order authorizing Maine Yankee Atomic Power Co., Augusta, Maine subsidiary of both Northeast Utilities and New England Electric System, to issue and sell \$15,000,000 first mortgage bonds and 150,000 shares of preferred stock. Proceeds will be used to pay short-term bank loans and notes to sponsors incurred for construction expenditures. (Rel 35-17831)

INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

CAPEX CORPORATION. The SEC has issued an order to permit modification of certain existing agreements among Continental Capital Corporation, Greater Washington Investors, Inc., Greater Washington Industrial Investments, Inc. (all closed-end investment companies) and Capex Corporation and an investment by Western Investment Associates in Capex Corporation. (Rel. IC-7600)

AMERICAN EUROPEAN SECURITIES CO. The SEC has issued an order declaring that American Securities Company, of Southport, Conn., has ceased to be an Investment Company. (Rel IC-7583)

INVESTORS CAPITAL EXCHANGE FUND, INC. The SEC has issued an order declaring that Investors Capital Exchange Fund, Inc. of Boston, Massachusetts, has ceased to be an investment company. (Rel IC-7585)

AMERICAN EXPRESS INVESTMENT CO. The SEC has issued an order permitting American Express Investment Management Company, of San Francisco, and the Funds for which it is the principal underwriter, to offer to persons who have redeemed any one, or any portion of any one of their Fund accounts a one-time privilege to reinvest within 15 days without any sales charge. (Rel IC-7587)

MASSACHUSETTS INVESTORS TRUST. The SEC has issued an order declaring that Dr. Bruce S. Old, a proposed director or trustee of Massachusetts Investors Trust, Massachusetts Investors Growth Stock Fund, Inc., Massachusetts Income Development Fund, Inc., Massachusetts Capital Development Fund, Inc., and Massachusetts Financial Development Fund, Inc., all of Boston, will not be an "interested person" by reason of his status as an officer of Arthur D. Little, Inc., which is the parent of First Cambridge Corporation, a registered broker-dealer. (Rel IC-7588)

PASCO, INC. The SEC has issued an order exempting Pasco, Inc. from several provisions of the Act to permit the company to enter into financing arrangements necessary for the purchase by the company of certain oil-producing properties of the Atlantic Richfield Company. The order exempts Pasco, Inc. from the provisions of the Act relating to asset-coverage and other requirements for closed-end companies which issue senior securities; from those permitting only one class of senior security representing indebtedness; and from those requiring shareholder approval of changes in the company's policy respecting borrowing and the issuance of senior securities. JOHN HANCOCK MUTUAL LIFE INSURANCE CO. The SEC has issued a notice giving interested persons until January 23 to request a hearing on an application of John Hancock Mutual Life Insurance Company ("John Hancock"), and John Hancock Variable Account C, a management investment company registered under the Act, for an order permitting (1) sales of variable annuity contracts to be made with other than the usual sales loads and administrative expenses when such contracts are purchased with proceeds derived from other John Hancock products; (2) periodic purchase payments on variable annuity contracts to be held in banks, but not in trust; and (3) assets of the Account to be held in John Hancock's vault. (Rel. IC-7591)

NATIONAL INVESTORS CORPORATION. The SEC has issued an order exempting National Investors Corporation New York mutual fund, from the provisions of Section 22(d) of the Act to the extent necessary to permit National to issue its shares, without sales charges, in exchange for the assets of Elmarwin Corp., an Iowa corporation. (Rel IC-7592)

CANADIAN FUND, INC. The SEC has issued an order declaring that Canadian Fund, Inc., of New York, has ceased to be an investment company. (Rel IC-7593)

THE NEWPORT FUND. The SEC has issued an order declaring that the Newport Fund, Inc., of Los Angeles, California, has ceased to be an investment company. (Rel. IC-7594)

AGE FUND. The SEC has issued an order granting an application of Age Fund, Inc., Wincap Fund, Winfield Growth Fund, Inc., and Winfield Distributors, Inc., all of San Mateo, California, for an order exempting applicants from Section 22(d) of the Act so as to permit shares of the Funds to be sold without sales charges upon the exercise of reinvestment privileges which the Funds propose to offer to redeeming shareholders. FIRST INVESTORS FUND, INC. The SEC has issued an order granting an application of First Investors Fund, Inc., First Investors Fund for Growth, Inc., First Investors Discovery Fund, Inc., First Investors Fund for Income, Inc., First Investors Management Company, Inc., and First Investors Corporation, all of New York, for an order exempting applicants from Section 22(d) of the Act so as to permit shares of the Funds to be sold without sales charges upon the exercise of reinvestment privileges which the Funds propose to offer to redeeming shareholders. BROAD STREET INVESTING CORPORATION. The SEC has issued an order upon application of Broad Street Investing Corporation, National Investors Corporation, Union Capital Fund, Inc., Whitehall Fund, Inc., and Union Service Distributor, Inc., all of New York, exempting applicants from Section 22(d) of the Act so as to permit shares of the Funds to be sold without sales charges upon the exercise of reinvestment privileges which the Funds propose to offer to redeeming shareholders.
