RULE PROPOSALS AND ADOPTIONS

COMMENTS REQUESTED ON RULE 17a-15 JOINT PLAN. The staff of the Division of Market Regulation announced that on March 2, 1973 the New York, American, Midwest, PBW and Pacific Coast Stock Exchanges and the NASD filed a joint plan (the "Plan") with the Commission pursuant to Rule 17a-15 under the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, providing for reporting of prices and volume of completed transactions with respect to securities registered on exchanges. The Plan will be available for public inspection in the Commission's public reference room, and all interested persons may submit written comments on the Plan. All comments should be directed to John M. Liftin, Associate Director, Division of Market Regulation, Securities and Exchange Commission, 500 N. Capitol St., Washington, D. C. 20549, on or before March 23, 1973 and should refer to File No. S7-433.

The staff also announced that the Commission will consider any comments received in connection with its review of the Plan and its determination whether, having due regard for the maintenance of fair and orderly markets, the public interest and the protection of investors, to declare the Plan effective and, if it does so, whether to require any changes thereto or to impose any terms or conditions thereon. Before requiring any changes or imposing any terms or conditions, the Commission will afford the Plan's proponents an opportunity to respond to such proposed changes, terms or conditions. Any such proposed changes, terms or conditions, and any response thereto by the Plan's proponents, will also be made publicly available. (Rel. 34-10026)

TECHNICAL AMENDMENTS TO INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RULES. The Commission today announced the adoption of certain technical amendments to the rules and regulations under the Investment Company Act of 1940 to correct references made to certain sections of the Act which were redesignated by the Investment Company Amendments Act of 1970. The amendments to Rules 2a-1, 2a-2, 7d-1, 19a-1 and 30d-1 are merely technical in nature and do not affect the substance of the amended rules and are necessary in order to correct the Commission's rules and regulations as they appear in Section 270 of Chapter II of Title 17 of the Code of Federal Regulations. The Commission's pamphlet which is sold to the public by the Government Printing Office was recently published with the corrected references to the amended sections of the Act and therefore no further amendments to the printed pamphlet are necessary. COURT ENFORCEMENT ACTIONS

WESTLAND MINERALS CORP., OTHERS ENJOINED. The SEC Washington Regional Office announced on February 27 that the Federal court in Philadelphia permanently enjoined Westland Minerals Corporation of Los Angeles, Calif., Rayco Drilling Company of Cambridge, Ohio, Moray Oil Company, Inc. of LaCygne, Kansas, Dubros, Inc. of LaCygne, Kansas, Moray Producers 1970, Inc. of Los Angeles, Calif. and Charles F. Raymond of Los Angeles, Calif. from violations of the registration requirements and anti-fraud provisions of the Federal securities laws in connection with the offer and sale of investment contracts, participations in profit-sharing agreements, and fractional undivided working interests in oil and gas leases involving oil and gas wells in Kansas and Ohio or any other securities.

The Court further ordered defendants to register Westland Minerals Corporation under certain provisions of the Federal securities laws and to account to the Court and the Commission for proceeds from the sale of securities and from certain loans. The defendants consented to the court order, without admitting or denying the allegations. (LR-5766)
