#### COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENTS

COMMISSION RATE HEARINGS RECONVENED. The SEC announced that it will reconvene on Thursday, August 16, 1973 its public investigatory hearing on commission rate schedules of registered national securities exchanges (Rel. 34-10206 and 34-10245) to consider New York Stock Exchange (NYSE) Exhibit #17. That exhibit, which was submitted on August 2, 1973, was the NYSE's response to a request made at the hearing for the underlying data supporting the estimates and methodology that went into the construction of the inflation cost index appearing on pages 19-31 of the NYSE's report, "The Urgent Need for a Securities Commission Rate Adjustment in an Inflationary Setting," which was presented to the Commission by the NYSE to support, in part, its rate increase proposals. Accompanying NYSE Exibit #17 was a statement from the NYSE which indicated that in reviewing the inflation cost index for purposes of this exhibit, it employed new data sources in some categories and supplemented the data used in other categories in response to questions raised by the Commission's staff.

In order to consider the data furnished by the NYSE fully, the Commission has requested representatives of the NYSE to appear at 10 a.m., Thursday, August 16, 1973 at the Commission's headquarters, 500 North Capital Street, Washington, D.C. to present testimony on the foregoing NYSE Exhibit #17. Interested persons who wish to testify on that date with respect to that exhibit are invited to notify the Hearing Officer (William E. Toomey, Room 632, Securities and Exchange Commission, 500 North Capital Street, Washington, D.C. 20549; telephone (202) 755-1240) as soon as possible. The Commission invites all other interested persons to submit their views on that exhibit, a copy of which is available in the Public Reference Room of the Commission's Headquarters Office and at each of the Commission's Regional and Branch Offices. Alternatively, a copy of that exhibit may be obtained by writing to Dr. William C. Freund, Vice President and Chief Economist, New York Stock Exchange, Inc., Eleven Wall Street, New York, New York 10005. The period for submitting written comments on NYSE Exhibit #17 will expire on Friday, August 31, 1973. All written comments should be directed to Mr. Toomey. (Rel. 34-10337)

TRADING SUSPENDED IN CIC INDUSTRIES DEBENTURES. The SEC announced today the suspension of exchange and over-the-counter trading in the 11% debentures due 1975 of CIC Industries, Inc., a subsidiary of Colorado Interstate Corporation, for the period 10:00 a.m. (EDT) August 14, 1973 through midnight (EDT) August 23, 1973.

The Commission initiated the suspension because of questions which have arisen concerning the financial statements for the fiscal years 1971 and 1972 of Coastal States Gas Corporation (Coastal), the parent company of CIC Industries, Inc., and the accuracy of statements concerning available gas reserves.

The Commission had initiated temporary suspensions of trading in the common and preferred stock of Coastal on June 5, 1973 and on August 8, trading suspensions in all the mortgage bonds, debentures, and preferred stock of Coastal's subsidiaries, Coastal States Gas Producing Company, Colorado Interstate Corporation, and Colorado Interstate Gas Company. The current ten-day trading suspension in the securities of Coastal and its subsidiaries is for the period August 14, 1973 through August 23, 1973. (Rel. 34-10340)

### COURT ENFORCEMENT ACTIONS

THOMAS ROAD BAPTIST CHURCH, COOPERATIVE CHURCH FINANCE, INC. AND JOE H. WEST ENJOINED. The SEC Washington Regional Office announced that on August 10 the Federal court in Lynchburg, Virginia permanently enjoined the Thomas Road Baptist Church of Lynchburg, Virginia, Cooperative Church Finance, Inc. and Joe H. West of Houston, Texas from violations of the antifraud provisions of the Federal securities laws in connection with the offer and sale of bonds of the Thomas Road Baptist Church or any other securities. The court appointed a five man Special Finance Committee to take charge of the business affairs of the Thomas Road Baptist Church and empowered it with specified powers and duties. (LR-6019)

COMPLAINT NAMES MARASOL PROPERTIES, OTHERS. The SEC on August 13 announced the filing of a complaint in the Federal court in the District of Columbia seeking to temporarily restrain and enjoin Marasol Properties, a Spanish syndicate with offices in Washington, D.C. Iberia Immobiliaria Internacional, Inc., of Washington, D.C., Inter-Fed Travel Services Association, Inc., of Washington, D.C., De Ritchie, of Arlington, Va., and Galarents, S.A., a Spanish corporation, from violations of the registration and antifraud provisions of the Federal securities laws in connection with the offer and sale of non-exempt, unregistered securities, namely condominium units coupled with the offer to perform or arrange rental and other services from which an investor would derive a return on his investment and the carrying of such securities through the mails. Marasol Properties, the defendant, should not be confused and has no connection with Marisol Corporation, a Texas corporation registered with the Commission to sell condominium units coupled with an offer to perform and arrange rental and other services. JOEL KLINE PLEADS GUILTY. The SEC Washington Regional Office announced that on August 3 before the Federal court in the District of Columbia, Joel Kline pleaded guilty to one conspiracy to obstruct justice count of a 21 count indictment which charged conspiracy to obstruct justice and perjury in connection with an investigation by the SEC into several companies promoted by Kline. CENTURY INVESTMENT TRANSFER CORP., OTHERS ENJOINED. The SEC New York Regional Office announced that the Federal court in New York enjoined Medwin (also known as Maurice) Benjamin (Benjamin), Fort Lee, New Jersey, Robert Slatko, a Florida attorney, Century Investment Transfer Corp., a Florida corporation and Bachelor Investments Ltd., a Toronto, Canada corporation from violations of the registration, antifraud and broker-dealer registration provisions of the Federal securities laws in connection with the common stock of Satellite Systems Corp., Marlin Investment Co., Aetna Properties, Inc., Syncom, Inc. Satellite Systems Corp., a Texas corporation, was also permanently enjoined from violations of the registration and antifraud provisions in connection with the four named securities. Benjamin consented to the court order without admitting or denying the allegations of the Commission's complaint. Century, Bachelor and Satellite failed to appear through an attorney. Slatko consented to the court order without admitting or denying the allegations of the Commissions's complaint.

"So Ordered" stipulations and undertakings were signed as to Allen G. Kern, Westport, Connecticut, Robert Benjamin (R. Benjamin), New York, N. Y. and Bertram Aber, Westport, Connecticut. Kern R. Benjamin and Aber undertook and stipulated not to violate the registration and antifraud provisions of the Federal securities laws in connection with four named securities or any other security.

Aetna Properties Inc., a Texas Corporation, and C. B. Beal & Co., Ltd., a New York broker-dealer, were also permanently enjoined from further violations of the registration and antifraud provisions of the Federal securities laws in connection with the four named securities. (IR-6017)
