COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENTS

FOIA OFFICER'S DETERMINATION, IN PART AFFIRMED, REVERSED IN PART

The General Counsel sent a letter to Judith A. Kaye, Esq., in response to her appeal of the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) Officer's determination to deny access to information concerning The Westwood Group, Inc. The General Counsel affirmed the FOIA Officer's decision that certain information was exempt from disclosure under FOIA Exemption 7(A). The General Counsel reversed the FOIA Officer's determination to withhold copies of certain Commission rules and releases. The General Counsel released correspondence between Westwood's counsel and the Division of Corporation Finance, but asserted Exemptions 2 and 5 with respect to internal forms, staff notes and drafts and forms describing criteria used in evaluating filings that are in the possession of the Division of Corporation Finance. CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

HALFORD-SMITH ASSOCIATES, INC., OLDFIELD PLANNING CORP., ROBERT F. SMITH PERMANENTLY ENJOINED

The New York Regional Office announced that on March 6 the U.S. District Court of the Eastern District of New York permanently enjoined Halford-Smith Associates, Inc., Oldfield Planning Corp. and Robert F. Smith from violating specific provisions of the Investment Advisers Act and froze their assets pending disgorgement of all fraudulently obtained proceeds. The defendants consented to the order without admitting or denying the allegations in the Complaint.

The Complaint, filed on February 15, 1990, alleges that the defendants defrauded advisory clients of over \$475,000 by falsely representing that embezzled client funds had been invested in annuities and by forging client signatures to redeem a mutual fund investment. The Complaint also alleges that the defendants failed to take proper custody of client funds, to maintain accurate books and records and to properly update disclosure documents filed with the Commission. The complaint further alleges that Oldfield unlawfully operated as an unregistered investment adviser. [SEC v. Halford-Smith Associates, Inc., USDC, EDNY, 90 Civ. 0560] (LR-12409)

ELLIOTT L. BELLEN, GLENN SIESSER ENJOINED

The Atlanta Regional and Miami Branch Offices announced that on January 31 the Honorable Jose A. Gonzalez, Jr., U.S. District Judge for the Southern District of

Florida, preliminarily enjoined Elliott L. Bellen (Bellen) of Boca Raton, Florida, and Glenn Siesser (Siesser) of Highland Beach, Florida. Bellen and Siesser were formerly employed at the Boca Raton office of F.D. Roberts Securities, Inc. (F.D. Roberts), a registered broker-dealer which ceased operations in February 1989.

The judgments enjoin Bell and Siesser from violating the antifraud, registration and recordkeeping provisions of the federal securities laws. Bellen and Siesser consented to the entry of judgments without admitting or denying the allegations in the complaint.

The Commission's Complaint, filed November 20, 1989, alleges that the defendants caused F.D. Roberts to manipulate the market for the securities of Frankel Capital Management, Inc. and Integrated Financial Group, Inc. by, among other things, placing the securities in nominee accounts during the respective initial public offerings, redistributing the securities in the secondary market at artificial price levels, and making numerous misrepresentations and omissions of material facts to investors and prospective investors in the securities. CRIMINAL PROCEEDINGS

FREDERICK A. GROSS, OTHER OFFICER CONVICTED

The Philadelphia Regional Office and the U.S. Attorney's Office for the Eastern District of Pennsylvania announced that, on February 16, a jury convicted Frederick A. Gross, former president and chief executive officer of Systems & Computer Technology Corporation (SCTC), of one count of conspiracy to violate the federal securities laws, and two counts of filing false quarterly reports with the Commission. William Michael Searcy, former senior vice president of SCTC, was convicted of two counts of insider trading and two counts of mail fraud. Searcy was acquitted to charges of conspiracy and filing false quarterly reports. No sentencing date has been scheduled.

Gross was convicted of conspiring to defraud investors by causing overstatements of revenue and profits for the second and third quarters of SCTC's 1984 fiscal year. The insider trading counts against Searcy stem from two sales of SCTC stock in August 1984, several months before the fraudulent scheme was discovered by SCTC's auditors. When facts concerning the scheme became public on December 5, 1984, the value of SCTC's stock dropped 40 percent in one day. The criminal action arose out of the same set of facts as those in the Commission's action, filed on May 3, 1989. [U.S. v. Frederick A. Gross, et al., USDC EDPA, Crim. No. 89-00174] (LR-12413))
