NOTICE OF COMMISSION MEETINGS

U.S. SECURITIES AND
EXCHANGE COMMISSION

Following is a schedule of Commission meetings which will be conducted pursuant to provisions of the Government in the Sunshine Act. In general, the Commission expects to follow a schedule of holding closed meetings on Tuesdays, and open meetings on Thursday morning. Meetings on Wednesday, and if necessary on Thursday afternoons, will be either open or closed according to the requirements of agenda items under consideration. The Commission will not normally meet on Mondays or Fridays.

Visitors are welcome at all open meetings, insofar as seating is available.

Meetings will be held in the Commission Meeting Room on the eighth floor of the Commission's headquarters building at 500 North Capitol Street, Washington, D.C. All visitors are required to sign in and obtain passes at the Reception Desk in the lobby. Persons wishing to photograph or videotape Commission meetings must obtain permission in advance from the Secretary of the Commission. Persons wishing to tape record a Commission meeting should notify the Secretary's office 48 hours in advance of the meeting.

CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

ASSET MANAGEMENT CORPORATION, OTHERS ENJOINED

The Chicago Regional Office announced that on September 10 and 17 final judgments of permanent injunction by consent were entered by the Honorable William E. Steckler against Asset Management Corporation, Asset Development Company, Inc., Asset Securities, Inc., Buddy C. Stanley, Harold Franklin, Shirley Dixon, and Pocahontas Coal Processors, Inc. The injunctions were issued in connection with the sale of securities in the form of limited partnership interests of A.M. Coal Partners-1976 A through E and/or the sale of promissory notes of Pocahontas Coal Reserves of W. Va., Inc. The injunctions prohibit the defendants from future violations of the registration and antifraud provisions of the securities laws. In addition, Asset Development, Inc., Harold Franklin, and Shirley Dixon provided the court with accountings of all of the proceeds they received from the sale of the securities. (SEC v. Asset Management Corporation, et al., S.D. Ind., Civil Action No. IP 78-34-C). (LR-8889)

VERLAND THAYNE WHIPPLE, OTHERS ENJOINED

The Los Angeles Regional Office announced that on June 22 a final judgment and order of permanent injunction enjoining Verland Thayne Whipple of Los Angeles, California, and three entities he controls, namely International Film Corporation, International Film Enterprise and General Film Corporation, from further violations of the registration and antifraud provisions of the securities laws. The complaint alleged that Whipple organized and directed the sale of unregistered limited partnership interests and promissory notes in a fraudulent motion picture tax shelter scheme. Whipple and the above entities consented to entry of permanent injunctions without admitting or denying the allegations set forth in the Commission's complaint. (SEC v. International Film Corporation, et al., USDC, Los Angeles, Civil Action No. CV-77-1775-AAH). (LR-8890)

WILLIAM THOMAS SPELLER, SPELLER OIL CORPORATION ENJOINED

The Fort Worth Regional Office announced that on September 19 Judge Adrian Spears of the U.S. District Court for the Western District of Texas, Midland-Odessa Division, entered an order of permanent injunction against William Thomas Speller of Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, and Speller Oil Corporation of Tyler, Texas. The order enjoins the defendants from violating the registration provisions of the Securities Act. The defendants consented to the order without admitting or denying the allegations of the complaint. The order also, by consent of the parties, dismissed with prejudice, the remaining allegations of the complaint, namely, that the defendants had violated the antifraud provisions of the Securities Act and Exchange Act. (SEC v. William Thomas Speller, et al., W.D. TX/Midland-Odessa Div., MO-77-CA-050). (LR-8891)
