COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENTS

ADVISORY COMMITTEE ON BROKER-DEALER COMPLIANCE ANNOUNCES PRELIMINARY DRAFT OF GUIDE.

The SEC's Advisory Committee on Broker-Dealer Compliance has completed a Preliminary Draft of a Guide to Broker-Dealer Compliance. The Guide is designed to assist management and supervisory personnel of broker-dealers, both large and small, in complying with applicable regulatory standards. The Commission established the Advisory Committee not to suggest an expansion of current rules, but "to educate broker-dealers as to existing requirements and how they may comply with them." (Rel. 34-9835)

The Committee emphasizes that the Guide is not intended to be a compliance manual which can be adopted word for word by a broker-dealer. Rather, it attempts to set forth the major applicable regulatory requirements and to suggest procedures to aid in achieving compliance. It is hoped that the Guide will assist the broker-dealer in preparing or supplementing its own compliance manual and in designing and establishing a compliance program tailored to its particular business and operations.

The Advisory Committee's recommendations are not in final form and may be revised as a result of the suggestions received. The preliminary draft has not been submitted to the Commission for consideration and reflects only the initial views of the Advisory Committee.

The Committee solicits suggestions from the broker-dealer community, the securities industry, the securities bar, the accounting profession and other interested members of the public. Most of the chapters have been prepared in a standard format which consists of three parts: the general requirements describing the applicable laws, rules and regulations; special problems arising in connection with such requirements and suggested procedures to assist in complying with such requirements. The Committee asks that in making suggestions the following questions be considered:

1. Is there any major area of securities regulation not covered by the Guide which should be included?

The Committee is aware that securities law is rapidly developing and, indeed, proliferating and that new areas of concern and interest to broker-dealers continually arise. Many such areas are evident today. The preliminary draft deals with a number of these areas, for example, the regulation of options and tax sheltered programs. These types of securities have recently come into widespread use and are already covered by a definite body of securities law. The Committee recognizes that there are other areas where major regulatory developments may be foreshadowed, such as commodity options, franchises, and pyramid plans. These are not covered in the Guide, however, because in the opinion of the Committee they are not yet in sufficiently broad use by broker-dealers to justify separate treatment.

2. Are there additional special problem areas which should be added?

The Committee has focused on significant problems, especially those which are recent developments or to which the new broker-dealer or, indeed, some established broker-dealer might not be alert.

3. What additional procedures should be considered for inclusion in the Guide?

Suggestions for procedures aimed at insuring compliance should be feasible for adoption by the small broker-dealer and not just by the larger firm.

RULE PROPOSALS AND ADOPTIONS

PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO RULE 17a-7 UNDER INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT, FORM N-1R, AND EDP ATTACHMENT. The SEC has announced a proposal to amend Rule 17a-7 under the Investment Company Act of 1940, Item 2.07 of the Form N-1R, and Item 2.07 of the EDP Attachment to Form N-1R. The proposed amendments would expand the exemptive relief currently afforded by Rule 17a-7. Rule 17a-7 currently exempts from prohibitions of Section 17(a) of the Act purchase or sale transactions between registered investment companies which are affiliated persons, or affiliated persons of affiliated persons, of each other, or between separate series of a registered investment company, provided they meet the criteria included in the rule. Among these is the requirement that the security involved be traded principally on a national securities exchange. The proposed amendments would broaden the terms of this requirement to encompass certain transactions involving certain over-the-counter securities entered on an interdealer quotation system sponsored and governed by the rules of a national securities association. They would also require the inclusion in the N-1R and the EDP Attachment thereto of certain information relating to Rule 17a-7 transactions.

COURT ENFORCEMENT ACTIONS

HAROLD F. SMITHER PLEADS GUILTY. The Seattle Regional Office announced the filing of a fifteen count criminal information in the District Court for Oregon on January 21 against Harold F. Smither of Salem, Oregon, formerly a director and chief executive officer of First California Company, Inc., a broker-dealer headquartered in San Francisco, California. Smither entered guilty pleas to eleven of the counts for securities fraud. Sentencing was deferred pending completion of a pre-sentencing investigation and report. (LR-6218)

ABITRON CORPORATION, OTHERS ENJOINED. The Washington Regional Office announced that on January 17 the Federal Court in Alexandria, Virginia, permanently enjoined Abitron Corporation, Learn-En-Joy, Inc., LNJ Real Estate and Development Corporation, Language Learning Systems, Inc., all of Alexandria, Va., Endel Peedo and Harold Steele Harrison of Arlington, Va., and Bendert H. Mellema of Falls Church, Va., from violations of the registration provisions of the securities laws and permanently enjoined the above defendants and Randfair One Property Associates, also of Alexandria, Va., from violations of the anti-fraud provisions in the offer and sale of stock of the various corporate defendants and limited partnership interests in Randfair One Property Associates. The defendants consented to the court order without admitting or denying the allegations. (LR-6219)

EDWIN PIERCE, BLANCHE PIERCE SENTENCED. The Los Angeles Regional Office announced that on January 8 Edwin Pierce entered a plea of guilty to 13 counts charging him with violations of the provision of the Internal Revenue code prohibiting the concealing of property to avoid payment of taxes, and Blanche Pierce (Mrs. Edwin Pierce) entered a plea of nolo contendere to 10 counts charging her with, among other things, violations of the antifraud provisions of the securities laws.

Mr. and Mrs. Pierce have been the subjects of two indictments returned by the Federal Court in Los Angeles. On August 9, 1972 they were indicted on one count of conspiracy, 8 counts of mail fraud, and 13 counts of concealing property to avoid taxes.

On July 26, 1972, a second indictment charged the Pierces with one count of conspiracy, 14 counts of using manipulative and deceptive devices in the purchase and sale of securities, and 8 counts of mail fraud. The other charges were dismissed. Edwin Pierce was fined \$5,000 on each count of the 13 counts to which he pleaded guilty. He received a three-year suspended sentence and was placed on probation for five years. Mrs. Pierce was fined \$100 on each of the 10 counts to which she entered her plea. (LR-6220)

LOEB, RHOADES & CO. An order has been issued exempting Loeb, Rhoades & Co. and its co-underwriters in a proposed offering of shares of Precious Metals Holdings, Inc. (company), a registered, closed-end, non-diversified management investment company, from Section 30(f) of the Act with respect to their transactions incidental to the distribution of the company's shares. NEW ENGLAND LIFE VARIABLE ANNUITY FUNDS I AND II. An order has been issued to New England Life Variable Annuity Funds I and II and NEL Equity Services Corporation of Boston, Massachusetts permitting an offer of exchange pursuant to Section 11 and granting an exemption from Section 22(d) pursuant to Section 6(c) in connection with an offer of exchange whereby shareholders of various NEL Funds who transfer amounts therein to NEL Variable Annuity Funds would pay reduced sales charges.
