MULTIJURISDICTIONAL DISCLOSURE SYSTEM WITH CANADA

The Commission is publishing today the multijurisdictional disclosure system for Canadian issuers that was approved by the Commission on May 30, 1991. A parallel multijurisdictional disclosure system for U.S. issuers adopted by the Canadian provinces and territories is attached as an appendix to the Commission's release. Both the U.S. and Canadian systems will be effective on July 1, 1991.

The multijurisdictional disclosure system approved by the Commission will allow eligible Canadian companies to make public offerings of securities in Canada and the United States using the disclosure documents required by their home country. The system also will allow certain Canadian companies to comply with the Commission's periodic reporting, tender offer and trust indenture requirements by compliance with Canadian requirements.

In conjunction with the system, the Commission also approved changes to its rules and forms that will allow all Canadian companies to register and report to the Commission on the same basis as companies from any other foreign country. As a result, Canadian foreign private issuers will be exempt from the Commission's proxy requirements and Section 16 share ownership reporting and short-swing profit recapture provisions. ORDER OF EXEMPTION FROM PROVISIONS OF RULES 10b-6 and 10b-13

The Commission released today an order of exemption from the provisions of Rules 10b-6 and 10b-13 under the Exchange Act for the Canadian Multijurisdictional Disclosure System in connection with cash tender and exchange offers made in reliance on Rules 13e-4 (g) or 14d-1(b), subject to certain conditions. ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

MICHAEL FORD CONSENTS TO PERMANENT SUSPENSION WITH THE RIGHT TO APPLY FOR REINSTATEMENT AFTER FOUR YEARS

On June 17, the Commission issued an Opinion and Order Pursuant to Rule 2(e) of its Rules of Practice finding Michael R. Ford, CPA, to have engaged in improper professional conduct in connection with his audit of Unocam, Inc. for the fiscal year ended March 31, 1987. The Order finds that Ford violated GAAS and the SEC independence requirement in his audit of Unocam.

The Commission has determined to accept Ford's Offer of Settlement in which he agreed to be permanently denied the privilege of appearing and practicing before the Commission, with the right to apply for reinstatement after four years, and to other ancillary relief imposing professional association requirements. Ford consented to the Opinion and Order without admitting or denying the findings made in such Order. (Rel. 34-29316)

PROCEEDINGS INSTITUTED AGAINST ARTHUR DEMARTINE

The Commission instituted public administrative proceedings under the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 against Arthur L. DeMartine of Homosassa, Florida, a former branch manager of a broker-dealer registered with the Commission. Simultaneously with the institution of these proceedings, DeMartine has submitted an Offer of Settlement which the Commission has accepted. The order finds that DeMartine violated the antifraud provisions of the federal securities laws by providing investors with fictitious account statements which falsely indicated purchases and sales in securities, when, in fact, DeMartine was misappropriating those investors' funds.

DeMartine consented to the Order which bars him from association with any broker, dealer, municipal securities dealer, investment adviser or investment company. (Rel. 34-29317)

SELF-REGULATORY ORGANIZATIONS

APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Commission approved a proposed rule change filed by the National Association of Securities Dealers (SR-NASD-91-12) under Rule 19b-4 to amend the OTC Bulletin Board Service to require that quotations for non-foreign issues entered into the system be firm. (Rel. 34-29261)

PROPOSED RULE CHANGES

Proposed rule changes have been filed under Rule 19b-4 by the following: Delta Government Options Corporation (SR-DGOC-91-02) which would modify the meaning of "expiration date" for the purpose of DGOC options (Rel. 34-29307); Chicago Board Options Exchange (SR-CBOE-91-18) which describes the procedures of the CBOE's intraday trade match system. (Rel. 34-29322); and Participants Trust Company (SR-PTC-91-07) which relates to the establishment of margin levels for certain GNMA's. (Rel. 34-29323).

A proposed rule change has been filed under Rule 19b-4 by the Philadelphia Stock Exchange (SR-PHLX-91-16). The proposal would require options specialists to activate the Automatic Execution (Auto X) feature of the PHLX'S Automated Options Market system within three minutes of concluding an opening or reopening rotation of an options. The proposal also provides that options specialists may only disengage Auto-X under extraordinary circumstances with the prior approval of two Floor Officials (Rel. 34-29324).

Two proposed rule changes have been filed under Rule 19b-4 by the National Association of Securities Dealers: SR-NASD-91-26 to amend the Rules of Practice and Procedure of the Small Order Execution System to allow market makers to decline preferencing by order entry firms (Rel. 34-29339); and SR-NASD-91-20 to create a uniform standard of duty among NASD members to forward material to beneficial owners furnished by the NASDAQ company that is the issuer of the securities (Rel. 34-29344).

Proposed rule changes have been filed under Rule 19b-4 by the following: New York Stock Exchange (SR-NYSE-91-20) to relieve Competitive Options Traders and options specialists of certain of their Exchange obligations with respect to the maintenance of price continuity and depth upon the declaration of a "fast market" (Rel. 34-29345); and International Securities Clearing Corporation (SR-ISCC-91-01) to permit qualified ISCC members, utilizing standardized input and output format, to obtain through ISCC, foreign clearing, settlement and custody services offered by a bank selected by ISCC (Rel. 34-29351).

Publication of the proposed rule changes is expected in the Federal Register during the week of June 17.

ACCELERATED APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGES

The Commission approved, on an accelerated basis, proposed rule changes filed by the following: Pacific Stock Exchange (SR-PSE-91-20) to extend PSE's ten-up pilot program until November 15, 1991 (Rel. 34-29325); and Chicago Board Options Exchange (SR-CBOE-91-16) to extend approval of a CBOE fee for delayed trade match submissions for an additional six-month period (Rel. 34-29341).

IMMEDIATE EFFECTIVENESS OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The National Association of Securities Dealers filed a proposed rule change (SR-NASD-91-29) under Rule 19b-4 which became effective upon filing. The proposed rule change requires deletion of language from Part VI of Schedule D to the By-Laws that was inserted when a temporary exemption to the firm quote rule was approved for market makers receiving orders from competing market makers. The exemption expired on June 1. (Rel. 34-29349)
