- 1. Delete C5.4.3.2.3. in its entirety.
- 2. Add the following as the fifth row in Table C11.T7., EDA Legislation Summary.

## 3. Revise paragraph C11.5.6. as follows:

C11.5.6. <u>Blanket Order Excess Defense Article (EDA) Transfers</u>. Blanket order EDA cases and/or lines may be established only for non-SME consisting of spare parts and/or components, clothing, basic field equipment, and office equipment, supplies, furniture, or other non-SME items as approved by DSCA (Programs Directorate). Blanket order cases and/or lines for packing, crating, handling, and transportation (PCH&T) may also be written in conjunction with EDA transfers of similar, non-SME items when the purchaser requests these services. These LOAs must identify the end-item application. Items on blanket order EDA FMS cases/lines are transferred in accordance with the purposes of FAA, section 502 (reference (b)); AECA, section 4 (reference (c)), and the requirements of FAA, section 516 (reference (b)).
