ENFORCEMENT PROCEEDINGS

WHX CORPORATION - CHARGES DISMISSED

Charges against WHX Corporation (WHX) were dismissed after a hearing before an administrative law judge. WHX is a holding company with subsidiaries that manufacture steel products and invest in securities. WHX had been charged with violations under the Williams Act in connection with its failed 1997 takeover bid for Dynamics Corporation of America.

Williams Act requirements are intended to provide enough time and information for shareholders to make informed decisions about takeover bids and to eliminate discriminatory treatment among those who desire to tender shares. The Williams Act is for the protection of investors and does not favor either the takeover bidder or existing management of the target.

WHX was charged with improperly excluding some shareholders from its tender offer because, initially, it offered to purchase only shares accompanied by voting rights. The law judge found that WHX had informed the Commission of the voting rights condition and attempted to convince the Commission of its validity. The Commission informed WHX that it was not convinced and WHX removed the condition promptly, a few days after the offer commenced. No harm was done during those few days. The law judge concluded that this conduct did not violate the rules and subject WHX to a sanction.

WHX was also charged with making material changes to the offer on the last day without extending it for five business days as required. WHX allegedly changed the offer by waiving three conditions related to the target's anti-takeover defenses when it let the offer expire and bought tendered stock. The law judge concluded, however, that the conditions had already been removed or were inapplicable when the offer expired, so there was no violation. The first, an impairing transaction condition had been removed after management of the target and a friendly bidder undertook such transactions. WHX removed that condition from its offering materials, increased the number of shares it offered to buy, raised the price, and extended the offer's duration. The other two conditions, a poison pill condition and a state anti-takeover provision, were not

applicable when the offer closed, since WHX then owned 13% of the target's stock – under a 20% threshold. The law judge noted that no shareholder of the target complained about WHX's conduct of the offer. (Initial Decision No. 173; File No. 3-9634)

COMMISSION REMANDS PALMWORKS, INC.'S PROCEEDING TO THE NASD

The Commission has remanded the proceeding involving PalmWorks, Inc. to the National Association of Securities Dealers, Inc. in order to allow it to make a determination regarding the eligibility of PalmWorks' securities for continued quotation on the OTCBB.

The Commission had ordered a stay of the NASD's action delisting PalmWorks' securities from the OTCBB pending its determination of the company's application for review but noted in its order that the NASD could request that the proceeding be remanded to it for resolution pursuant to appropriate existing NASD procedures. On September 19, 2000, the NASD informed the Commission that it would allow a NASD hearing panel to determine whether PalmWorks' securities should continue to be quoted on the OTCBB and moved for the PalmWorks proceeding be remanded to it for resolution. The Commission has granted the remand order. (Rel. 34-43423; File No. 3-10200)

COMMISSION GRANTED EMERGENCY RELIEF IN CONNECTION WITH \$156 MILLION INTERNET OFFERING FRAUD

On October 4, the Honorable David O. Carter, United States District Judge of the Central District of California, issued a temporary restraining order halting an ongoing fraud by Ernest F. Cossey (Cossey) and Gary W. Williams (Williams), entities controlled by them (TLC Entities), and Thomas G. Cloud (Cloud) and his company, who were using the Internet to sell the fraudulent securities. The Court: (1) ordered the defendants to immediately cease their fraudulent activities; (2) placed a freeze on the defendants' assets; (3) appointed a temporary receiver over those assets for 10 days pending a hearing to determine the full extent of their fraudulent conduct; (4) ordered an accounting from the defendants; and (5) granted other relief.

The Commission's complaint, filed on October 3, 2000, alleges that since 1998, the TLC entities have raised at least \$156 million from more than 2,600 investors, including numerous senior citizens, purportedly for the purpose of investing in distressed real estate. In fact, Cossey, Williams and the TLC Entities are currently operating an undisclosed Ponzi scheme using client funds to make interest payments. In addition, Cossey and Williams have misused at least \$28.3 million in investor funds. Cloud and his company, Cloud & Associates Consulting, Inc. (C&A) falsely claimed C&A had received no commissions when, in fact, C&A has received at least \$1 million in commissions through July 2000.

The Commission obtained an order temporarily restraining Cossey, Williams, the TLC Entities, C&A and Cloud from committing securities fraud in violation of Section 17(a) of the Securities Act of 1933 (Securities Act), Section 10(b) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 (Exchange Act) and Rule 10b-5 thereunder. The defendants (except Williams) were also temporarily restrained from committing violations of the securities registration provisions of Sections 5(a) and 5(c) of the Securities Act. In addition to the interim relief granted today, the Commission seeks a final judgment against Cossey, Williams, entities they control, Cloud & Associates and Cloud enjoining them from future violations of Sections 5(a) and 5(c) of the Securities Act (except for Williams), Section 17(a) of the Securities Act, Section 10(b) of the Exchange Act and Rule 10b-5 thereunder, ordering them to disgorge all ill-gotten gains, and assessing civil penalties against them. INTERNET OFFERING ACTION FILED AGAINST ROBERT F. MOORE D/B/A THE KINGDOM OF ENENKIO

The Commission filed an action against Robert F. Moore, individually and doing business as The Kingdom of Enenkio, of Honolulu, Hawaii. The complaint, filed in the United States District Court for the District of Hawaii, alleges that Moore, a resident of Honolulu, Hawaii, is holding himself out to be the head of State of The Kingdom of Enenkio. The complaint alleges that Moore is currently conducting a \$1 billion offering of "Enenkio Gold War bonds" on an Internet Web site (www.Enenkio.org), through e-mail solicitations sent worldwide, and in postings to various Internet bulletin boards. Enenkio asserts ancestral tribunal rights to Wake Island and atolls in the Marshall Islands chain and claims an intention to develop its territories. According to the complaint, the Kingdom of Enenkio is not recognized in any international forum as a sovereign state nor is it a corporate or statutory entity. The complaint alleges that Moore's offering materials represent that the bonds will pay a compound interest rate of ten percent after 5 years. The complaint also alleges that Moore represents that the bonds are "backed by gold reserves, guarantees, real property or other assets." However, according to the complaint, Moore has no gold reserves and no security, real property or otherwise, exists for the bonds. The complaint further alleges that the bonds have not been registered with the Commission and no exemption for registration applies.

Judge Susan Mollway granted an emergency temporary restraining order against Moore. Judge Mollway's order enjoined Moore from violating the antifraud and securities registration provisions of the federal securities laws, required Moore to provide an accounting, and froze Moore's assets pending determination of the matter on the merits. INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

WM VARIABLE TRUST, ET AL.

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until October 30 to request a hearing on an application filed by WM Variable Trust (Trust), and WM Advisors, Inc. (Adviser), for an order pursuant to Section 6(c) of the Investment Company Act for exemptions from the provisions of Sections 9(a), 13(a), 15(a) and 15(b) of the Act and Rules 6e-2(b)(15) and 6e-3(T)(b)(15) thereunder. Applicants seek exemptive relief to the extent necessary to permit shares of any current or future investment portfolios of the Trust and shares of any other investment company or portfolio that is designed to fund insurance products and for which Adviser or any of its affiliates may serve in the future as investment adviser, investment manager, investment sub-adviser, manager, principal underwriter, sponsor or administrator (Future Trusts) to be sold to and held by separate accounts funding variable annuity and variable life insurance contracts issued by both affiliated and unaffiliated life insurance companies; qualified pension and retirement plans outside of the separate account context; and the Trust's or Future Trusts' investment advisor (representing seed money investments). VANGUARD INDEX FUNDS, ET AL.

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until October 31 to request a hearing on an application filed by Vanguard Index Funds, *et al.* for an order exempting applicants from Sections 2(a)(32), 17(a)(1) and (a)(2), 18(f)(1), 18(i), 22(d), and 24(d) of the Investment Company Act and from Rule 22c-1 under the Act. The order would permit each of certain registered open-end management investment companies whose portfolios consist of the component securities of certain indices to issue a new class of shares with limited redeemability. The requested order would permit transactions in the shares of the new classes at negotiated prices in the secondary market and would allow dealers to sell the shares to secondary market purchasers unaccompanied by a prospectus, when prospectus delivery is not required by the Securities Act of 1933. The requested order also would permit certain affiliated persons of the investment companies to deposit securities into, and receive securities from, the investment companies in connection with the purchase and redemption of aggregations of shares of the new classes. DOMINION RESOURCES, INC., ET AL.

A supplemental order has been issued authorizing a proposal by Dominion Resources, Inc., a registered holding company, and its wholly owned subsidiary, Consolidated Natural Gas Company, also a registered holding company, to sell Virginia Natural Gas to AGL Resources, Inc. for a purchase price of \$550 million. DOMINION RESOURCES, INC., ET AL.

An order has been issued authorizing a proposal by Dominion Resources, Inc., a registered holding company, and its wholly owned subsidiary, Consolidated Natural Gas Company (CNG), also a registered holding company, for CNG to pay dividends out of paid-in-capital, and for DRI to restructure its nonutility businesses. (Rel. 35-27242)

SCOTTISH POWER PLC, ET AL.

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until October 31 to request a hearing on a proposal by Scottish Power plc, a foreign registered public utility holding company, its electric utility subsidiary, PacifiCorp, and their respective subsidiaries, to engage in various financing transactions and intrasystem transactions. Publication of the proposal is expected in the Federal Register during the week of October 9. (Rel. 34-43417)

DELISTING GRANTED

An order has been issued granting the application of the Philadelphia Stock Exchange to strike from listing and registration call and put option contracts issued by The Options Clearing Corporation with respect to certain underlying securities. (Rel. 34-43424)
