COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENTS

SOURCES SOUGHT FOR SEC EXPERIMENTAL "PAPERLESS" ELECTRONIC FILING, STORAGE AND RETRIEVAL SYSTEM

The Commission is seeking expressions of interest relative to possible establishment of a "paperless" system for the dissemination and analysis of corporate disclosure documents. In a "sources sought" announcement published in the government's Commerce Business Daily, the Commission said it is seeking to explore the use of computers in meeting its needs to make information publicly available and to manage information internally. The Commission contemplates that an experimental system would be designed to test the feasibility of allowing companies to file documents "computer-to-computer," and allowing the Commission's staff and members of the public to retrieve information from such documents on the same basis. The system would provide: (1) access by investors, via computer terminals, to any document filed with the Commission; (2) efficient and effective filing and storage of documents; and (3) information retrieval for purposes of Commission review.

Interested persons are encouraged to respond by letter outlining the availability, structure, cost and feasibility of possible prototype systems, as well as the role the SEC should assume in developing and administering the system. ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS INSTITUTED AGAINST EDWARD P. WOLFRAM, JR.; OFFER OF SETTLEMENT ACCEPTED

The Commission announced the institution of public administrative proceedings against Edward P. Wolfram, Jr., formerly the managing partner of Bell & Beckwith, a registered broker located in Toledo, Ohio. Simultaneous with the institution of proceedings, the Commission accepted an Offer of Settlement submitted by Wolfram, wherein he admitted the allegations and findings in the Order: that he wilfully violated and aided and abetted violations of Section 17(a) of the Securities Act of 1933 and Section 10(b) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 and Rule 10b-5 thereunder; that he wilfully aided and abetted violations of Sections 15(c)(3) and 17(a) of the Exchange Act and Rules 15c3-1, 15c3-3, and 17a-3 thereunder; and that he was a general partner and the managing partner of a registered broker-dealer for which a trustee was appointed pursuant to the Securities Investor Protection Act. Wolfram consented to the entry of an order barring him from association with any broker, dealer, municipal securities dealer, investment adviser, investment company or affiliate thereof. CRIMINAL PROCEEDINGS

INDICTMENT RETURNED AGAINST EDWARD P. WOLFRAM, JR.

J. William Petro, U.S. Attorney for the Northern District of Ohio and the Chicago Regional Office announced the return of a five-count indictment against Edward P. Wolfram, Jr., formerly the managing partner of Bell & Beckwith, a registered broker-dealer located in Toledo, Ohio. Wolfram was charged with four counts of

securities fraud in violation of Section 17(a) of the Securities Act of 1933 and one count of providing a false document to a representative of the Commission in violation of Section 1001 of Title 18 of the United States Code. The maximum penalty for each of the five counts is five years imprisonment and a \$10,000 fine. (U.S. v. Edward P. Wolfram, Jr., USDC ND OH, CR 83-36). (LR-9952) [see Rel. 34-19653]
