ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

JUSTIN S. COLIN CITED

Public administrative proceedings have been ordered under the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 against Justin S. Colin, former principal of Colin, Hochstin Co., whose withdrawal as a registered broker-dealer became effective on November 20, 1982. The Order for Public Proceedings alleges that Colin wilfully aided and abetted violations of the net capital, customer protection, bookkeeping, financial reporting and supplemental reporting provisions of the Exchange Act. A hearing will be scheduled to determine whether the allegations against Colin are true, and if so, to decide what, if any, remedial action under the Exchange Act is appropriate. (Rel. 34-19766)

CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

MINI-COMPUTER SYSTEMS, INC. ENJOINED

The Commission announced that on May 18 the U.S. District Court for the District of Columbia entered a Final Judgment of Permanent Injunction against Mini-Computer Systems, Inc. (MCS), of Elmsford, New York, restraining and enjoining it from failing to file timely periodic reports and ordering it to comply with certain undertakings. The Commission's complaint, which was filed on March 24, alleged that MCS, as part of a continuing course of conduct extending over several years, failed to file and file timely with the Commission certain annual and quarterly reports required to have been filed. MCS, consenting to the entry of the Court's judgment, admitted that it had filed reports in an untimely manner on six separate occasions. (SEC v. Mini-Computer Systems, Inc., U.S.D.C. CRIMINAL PROCEEDINGS

JOHN R. BROMLEY SENTENCED

The Los Angeles Regional Office announced that on May 16, in Phoenix, Arizona, John R. Bromley was placed on three years probation and directed to perform 320 hours of community service during that period.

On March 4, pursuant to a plea agreement, Bromley entered guilty pleas to the three counts of an information charging him with being an accessory after the fact to securities fraud violations of Heritage Trust Company. The Court sentenced Bromley to two one-year terms and one two-year term to be served concurrently. However, execution of the sentence was suspended. Pursuant to the plea agreement, the government dismissed an indictment returned against Bromley and his wife in Phoenix on February 7, 1980. (U.S. v. John R. Bromley, CR-80-019-PHX-WEC, D. Ariz.).
