ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

U.S. SECURITIES AND
EXCHANGE COMMISSION

SHELLEY COHEN SANCTIONED

The Commission has accepted an Offer of Settlement from Shelley Cohen of N. Miami, Florida and issued its Order Making Findings and Imposing Remedial Sanctions (Order) under Section 15(b)(6) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 against Cohen. Cohen, in her Offer of Settlement, consented to the entry of the Commission's Findings and Order without admitting or denying any of the matters contained therein.

In its Order, the Commission found that Cohen violated Section 17(a) of the Securities Act of 1933 and Section 10(b) of the Exchange Act and Rules 10b-5 and 10b-6 in connection with trading in the common stock and warrants of Intercontinental Diamond Corporation in 1980.

Based on the Order and Offer of Settlement, Cohen was suspended from association with any broker-dealer for 60 business days, barred from any position of supervision with any broker-dealer and had certain other limitations placed on her activities. (Rel. 34-19942) [see LR-10053]

NEIL STEPHENS INVESTMENT CORP. BROKER-DEALER REGISTRATION REVOKED; OTHERS BARRED

In connection with administrative proceedings instituted by the Commission on March 25 under the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, Neil Stephens Investment Corp. (Registrant), a broker-dealer registered under Section 15(b) of the Exchange Act and a member of the National Association of Securities Dealers, Inc., and Neil Stephens Associates, Inc., Bernard Cohen and Neil L. Cohen, associated persons of Registrant, failed to answer the Order for Public Proceedings and Notice of Hearing that instituted these proceedings and, therefore, are in default.

On the basis of the Order, the Commission found that the associated persons wilfully violated and wilfully aided and abetted violations of Sections 5(a), 5(c) and 17(a) of the Securities Act of 1933; Sections 10(b), 15(a) and 17(a) of the Exchange Act and Rules 10b-5 and 17a-3; and Sections 203(a) and 206(1) of the Investment Advisers Act of 1940; and Registrant had associated with it such respondents who violated the provisions listed above.

The Commission ordered that the registration of Registrant be revoked and that the associated persons be barred from being associated with any broker or dealer. (Rel. 34-19990)

CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

COMPLAINT FILED AGAINST SHELLEY COHEN

The Commission announced on July 5 the filing of a complaint in the U.S. District Court for the District of Columbia against Shelley Cohen of N. Miami, Florida. The complaint charges Cohen with violations of the antifraud provisions of the Securities Act of 1933 and the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. Simultaneous with the filing of the complaint and without admitting or denying the allegations contained therein, Cohen consented to the entry of an order permanently enjoining her from further violations of the antifraud provisions.

The complaint alleges that the antifraud violations occurred between April and October 1980 in connection with trading in the common stock and warrants of Intercontinental Diamond Co. and involved, among other things, solicitation of purchases of Diamond common stock by Cohen and certain other persons closely associated with Diamond. CRIMINAL PROCEEDINGS

WILLIAM G. EVANS INDICTED

The Chicago Regional Office and the U.S. Attorney for the Western District of Missouri announced that on June 21 a grand jury sitting in Kansas City, Missouri indicted William G. Evans on three counts of mail fraud and three counts of securities fraud. The indictment alleges that while employed as a bank vice president, Evans used fraudulent guarantee letters and escrow receipts purportedly issued by his employer to defraud Shearson/American Express of over \$100,000. Acting without authority from the bank, Evans executed a number of options transactions through Shearson, while assuring it that the bank had collateralized his positions. Evans then converted the premiums generated to his own use.

In an earlier civil action filed by the Commission, Evans consented to the entry of an injunction. (U.S. v. William G. Evans, No. 83-00081-01-CR-W-6, W.D. Mo., filed June 21, 1983). (LR-10052)

HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

NORTHEAST UTILITIES

An order has been issued regarding Northeast Utilities, a registered holding company, and its subsidiaries authorizing the issuance and sale of short-term notes to banks and commercial paper to a dealer in commercial paper and capital contributions and open account advances to the subsidiaries. (Rel. 35-22990 - June 29)

NEW ENGLAND POWER COMPANY

A supplemental order has been issued authorizing and releasing jurisdiction over a proposal by New England Power Company and New England Energy, Inc. (NEEI), subsidiaries of New England Electric System, whereby a joint venture of NEEI and Keystone Shipping Company will issue and sell up to \$27 million of long-term bonds guaranteed by the U.S. Maritime Administration to partially finance the construction and acquisition of a coal collier by the joint venture. (Rel. 35-22991 - June 30)

NEW ENGLAND ELECTRIC SYSTEM

An order has been issued authorizing New England Electric System (NEES), a registered holding company, and one of its subsidiaries, New England Power Company (NEP), to implement one component of a general financing plan for NEP, during the period July 1, 1983 to December 31, 1984, namely: capital contributions from NEES to NEP in an amount not to exceed \$100 million. Jurisdiction has been reserved, pending completion of the record, over the remaining components of the plan which include the issue and sale by NEP of preferred stock and bonds. (Rel. 35-22992 - June 30)

SELF-REGULATORY ORGANIZATIONS

IMMEDIATE EFFECTIVENESS OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGES

The following stock exchanges have filed proposed rule changes which became effective under Section 19(b)(3)(A) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934: The Chicago Board Options Exchange, Incorporated (SR-CBOE-83-19) to provide for changes in fees applicable to stock index options transactions, booth rental, phones, badges and fingerprinting. (Rel. 34-19919); and The New York Stock Exchange, Inc. (SR-NYSE-83-22) to require that an order imbalance trading halt be approved and supervised by two Floor officials or one Floor Governor. (Rel. 34-19928)

Publication of the proposals are expected to be made in the Federal Register during the week of June 27 and July 4, respectively.

TRUST INDENTURE ACT RELEASES

CITICORP

An order has been issued under the Trust Indenture Act of 1939 on an application of Citicorp that the trusteeship of United States Trust Company of New York under four existing, previously qualified indentures and a Pooling and Servicing Agreement under which certificates evidencing interests in a pool of mortgage loans have been issued, are not so likely to involve a material conflict of interest as to make it necessary to disqualify the Trust Company as trustee. MISCELLANEOUS

UNITED STATES MUTUAL REAL ESTATE INVESTMENT TRUST

An order has been issued granting the application of United States Mutual Real Estate Investment Trust, as Sponsor, and Detroit Bond & Mortgage Investment Co., as Servicer, pursuant to Section 12(h) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, for an exemption from certain provisions of Section 13 and from the operation of Section 16 of that Act.
