RESCISSION OF INVESTMENT ADVISERS ACT RULE 202-1

The Commission is rescinding Rule 202-1 under the Investment Advisers Act of 1940. Rule 202-1 excludes from the definition of investment adviser certain persons who offer investment advice to employee benefit plans sponsored by their employers. The effect of the rule has been to prohibit these persons from registering as investment advisers. (Rel. IA-888)

ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

OFFER OF SETTLEMENT ACCEPTED FROM ROBERT D. PETERSON

The Commission accepted an Offer of Settlement from Robert D. Peterson in connection with an administrative proceeding instituted on May 13, 1983 [see Rel. 34-19765, May 13, 1983]. The Commission's Findings and Order Imposing Remedial Sanctions found that Peterson wilfully violated antifraud provisions of the securities laws, including rules of the Municipal Securities Rulemaking Board (MSRB). The Order also found that Peterson aided and abetted violations of Commission and MSRB rules relating to books and records, customer confirmations and required deposits in a "Special Reserve Account for the Exclusive Benefit of Customers." Without admitting or denying the allegations in the Order for Proceedings, Peterson consented to the above findings and to a 90-day suspension from the industry. (Rel. 34-20293)

MANAGEMENT OF MANAGERS EQUITY FUND

ALLIED CAPITAL CORPORATION

An order has been issued by Allied Capital Corporation (Applicant), registered under the Investment Company Act as a closed-end, non-diversified, management investment company, requesting exemptions from Sections 18(d), 21(b), 23(a) and 23(b), Section 17(a)(3) of the Act, and requesting necessary approval under Rule 17d-1. This will permit Applicant to adopt an executive compensation plan providing for the issuance of stock options to certain officers of Allied Investment Corporation, Applicant's subsidiary, and to lend money to such officers for the purposes of facilitating their purchase of Applicant's stock upon exercise of the options. SELF-REGULATORY ORGANIZATIONS

IMMEDIATE EFFECTIVENESS OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Municipal Securities Rulemaking Board has filed a proposed rule change which became effective under Section 19(b)(3)(A) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. The rule change (SR-MSRB-83-14) permits individuals who are not associated with any broker, dealer, or municipal securities dealer, other than by reason of being under common control with or indirectly controlling any broker or dealer which is not a municipal securities broker or municipal securities dealer, to serve on the Board as a public representative. Publication of the proposal is expected to be made in the Federal Register during the week of October 24. (Rel. 34-20327)
