ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

PROCEEDINGS INSTITUTED AGAINST DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION FOR ISRAEL

The Commission instituted public administrative proceedings against Development Corporation for Israel (DCI), a broker-dealer registered with the Commission with headquarters in New York City. Simultaneous with the institution of the proceedings, the Commission accepted an offer of settlement from DCI. As part of its offer of settlement, DCI, without admitting or denying, consented to findings that from at least January 1982 to the present, it wilfully violated certain currency reporting and recordkeeping provisions of the securities laws. DCI violated these provisions by failing to file currency transaction reports with the Internal Revenue Service for transactions in which DCI received more than \$10,000 in currency from its customers and by failing to properly record these currency transactions. The Commission also found that DCI failed to obtain certain customer information and to maintain certain records. DCI also failed to reasonably supervise its employees.

As part of its offer of settlement, DCI also consented to a censure of the firm by the Commission, and to an order requiring DCI to comply with its undertaking to file delinquent currency transaction reports and to implement certain procedures designed to preclude future violations. CRIMINAL PROCEEDINGS

KAY A. DRIGGS PLEADS GUILTY

The U.S. Attorney's Office for the District of Utah, the Denver Regional Office, and the Salt Lake City Branch Office announced that on November 18 Kay A. Driggs of Provo, Utah, pled guilty to an Information charging one count of violating the antifraud provisions of the Securities Act of 1933. The Information charged that: Driggs along with Veldon D. Taylor, in the name of their partnership, T & D Management Company, defrauded investors in the offer and sale of promissory notes and money management agreements related to the pooling and investing of investors' funds in commodities; Driggs falsely represented to investors that Taylor and T & D had experienced an average of 65 to 70 percent profits from commodities investments over the past eight years when in fact he knew the partnership and Taylor had experienced large aggregate losses during the last two to three years; and Driggs, directly and indirectly, guaranteed investors a return on their investment ranging from 24 to 40 percent annually, and failed to disclose that there were no profits from which to pay returns on investments and that such returns as were being paid were being paid directly from investors' funds. Sentencing was set for January 6, 1984, before the Honorable David K. Winder, U.S. District Judge. (U.S. v. Kay A. Driggs, USDC, UT, CR-83-93-W). (LR-10217)

HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

NEW ENGLAND POWER COMPANY

An order has been issued authorizing New England Power Company (NEP), subsidiary of New England Electric System, to execute a loan agreement and to issue and sell General and Refunding Mortgage Bonds totaling \$20,750,000. These transactions will be conducted in the financing of pollution control facilities through the issuance of tax-exempt pollution control bonds by the Industrial Development Authority of the State of New Hampshire. NEP has also been authorized to sell an additional \$79 million in mortgage bonds to finance pollution control facilities at its Salem Harbor plant. Jurisdiction has been reserved over the rates and terms of such additional bonds. (Rel. 35-23146 - Dec. 2)

COLUMBIA GAS SYSTEM, INC.

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until December 26 to request a hearing on a proposal by Columbia Gas System, Inc., a registered holding company, to guarantee and/or indemnify its subsidiaries in certain situations. (Rel. 35-23147 - Dec. 2)

MIDDLE SOUTH ENERGY, INC.

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until December 27 to request a hearing on a proposal by Middle South Energy, Inc., subsidiary of Middle South Utilities, Inc., to enter into installment sales agreements with Claiborne County, Mississippi, in the financing of pollution control facilities at Grand Gulf Nuclear Electric Generating Station through the issue and sale by the County of up to \$80 million in pollution control revenue bonds. (Rel. 34-20437); and The Chicago Board Options Exchange, Incorporated (SR-CBOE-83-38) to permit the introduction of consecutive month expiration dates for single-industry index options. TRUST INDENTURE ACT RELEASES

HOSPITAL CORPORATION OF AMERICA, INC.

An order has been issued under the Trust Indenture Act of 1939 on an application by Hospital Corporation of America, Inc. that the trusteeship of Commerce Union Bank of Nashville, Tennessee under three existing indentures of the Company which are qualified under the Act and five existing indentures of various governmental issuing authorities, which latter indentures have not been qualified under the Act in reliance upon Section 304(a)(4) thereof and which latter indentures the Company or a wholly-owned subsidiary thereof is contractually obligated to make payments upon, is not so likely to involve a material conflict of interest as to make it necessary to disqualify the Bank from acting as trustee under any such indenture. Persons eligible to use the short form (Schedule 13G) may in lieu of filing a Schedule 13D file a Schedule 13G within 45 days after the end of the calendar year in which the person became subject to Section 13(d)(1). Companies and individuals making a tender offer must have on file at the time the tender offer commences a Schedule 14D-1.
