## COURT ENFORCEMENT ACTIONS

## U.S. SECURITIES AND EXCHANGE COMMISSION

### BLAIR & ASSOCIATES, INC., OTHERS ENJOINED

The Fort Worth Regional Office announced that on February 2 the Federal District Court at Shreveport, Louisiana, entered orders of permanent injunction against Blair & Associates, Inc. and George E. Blair, and an order of preliminary injunction against Julian F. Martin, all of Shreveport. The defendants consented to the orders without admitting or denying the allegations made in the Commission's complaint, which was filed on January 19. (SEC v. Blair & Associates, Inc., et al., W.D. La., Civil Action No. CI-77-0059-S). (LR-7773)

### TOWER BROKERAGE, INC., OTHERS ENJOINED

The Fort Worth Regional Office announced that on January 19 Federal District Judge Frank G. Theis at Wichita, Kansas granted the Commission's motion for preliminary injunction against Tower Brokerage, Inc. and Hugh Bell, both of St. Petersburg, Florida; Richard T. Heagy of Memphis, Tennessee; and Theodore DuBowik of Phoenix, Arizona enjoining them from future violations of the antifraud provisions of the securities laws. Judge Theis also granted the Commission's motion for preliminary injunction against Roman A. DiMeo of Santa Ana, California, enjoining him from future violations of the registration, antifraud and trust indenture qualification provisions of the securities laws.

On January 18 Judge Theis issued a default order preliminarily enjoining Vern Hunt and the Vern Hunt Company, both of West Covina, California, from future violations of the antifraud provisions of the securities laws.

On November 29, 1976 defendants James J. Russ and Astro Products of Kansas, Inc., both of Memphis, Tennessee, consented, without admitting or denying the Commission's allegations, to the entry of a permanent injunction enjoining them from future violations of the registration, antifraud and trust indenture qualification provisions of the securities laws. (SEC v. Astro Products of Kansas, Inc., et al., District of Kansas, CA-76-359-C6). (LR-7774)

### KENNETH M. WILSON ENJOINED

The Fort Worth Regional Office announced that on November 3 Federal District Judge Eldon B. Mahon at Fort Worth, Texas entered an order of permanent injunction by consent against Kenneth M. Wilson, Arlington, Texas, enjoining him from violations of the registration and antifraud provisions of the securities laws. Wilson consented to the entry of the order of permanent injunction without admitting or denying the allegations contained in the Commission's complaint which was filed October 1, 1976. The complaint alleged that Wilson and six other defendants violated the registration and antifraud provisions in the offer and sale of fractional undivided working interests in oil and gas leases located in Eastland and Palo Pinto Counties, Texas, issued by Hughes Oil & Gas, Inc. and Energy Industrial Development, Inc. (SEC v. Hughes Oil & Gas, Inc., et al., N.D. Tex., CA-76-284). (LR-7775)

### TIME-WESTERN CORPORATION, E. M. (MIKE) RIEBOLD ENJOINED

The Chicago Regional Office announced that on February 2 Federal District Judge John W. Oliver, at Kansas City, Missouri, entered a final judgment permanently enjoining Time-Western Corporation and E.M. (Mike) Riebold from violations of the registration and antifraud provisions of the securities laws. Entry of this relief was by consents filed by the defendants in which they neither admitted nor denied the allegations in the Commission's complaint. Riebold was formerly the Chairman of the Board of Time-Western Corporation of Albuquerque, New Mexico. (SEC v. Time-Western Corporation E.M. (Mike) Riebold, U.S.D.C., Western District of Missouri, Civil Action No. 76-CV-748-W1). (LR-7776)

TEMPORARY RESTRAINING ORDER ENTERED AGAINST  
FIRST PITTSBURGH SECURITIES CORPORATION, OTHERS

The Washington Regional Office announced that on February 1 the Federal District Court in Pittsburgh, Pa., entered an order temporarily restraining defendants First Pittsburgh Securities Corporation (FPSC), a Pennsylvania corporation and registered broker-dealer, GEBCO Investment Corporation (GEBCO), a Pennsylvania corporation, Fidelity Loan and Investment Corporation (FLIC), a small loan company and subsidiary of GEBCO, Plaza Development Corporation (Plaza), a subsidiary of GEBCO, and Creative Development Corporation (Creative), a Pennsylvania corporation and subsidiary of GEBCO, all located in North Versailles, Pa., Edward Boyer (Boyer), of Ft. Lauderdale, Fla., variously president, officer, or director of GEBCO, Plaza, Creative, FLIC and FPSC since at least 1972; Dolores Tubbs (Tubbs), of North Huntingdon, Pa., secretary of FLIC and a stockholder of FPSC; Salvatore F. Geswaldo (Geswaldo), of Pittsburgh, Pa., president of FPSC and former vice-president and a stockholder of GEBCO; Carl Benson (Benson) of Pittsburgh, Pa., Donald Kohl (Kohl) of Monroeville, Pa., and Bernard Golling (Golling), of Pittsburgh, Pa., all registered representatives and shareholders of FPSC, from further violations of the registration and antifraud provisions of the securities laws in the offer and sale of securities of FLIC, limited partnership interests in Meadowlands Inn Limited Partnership or any other securities unless a registration statement has been filed or is in effect with the Commission or unless an exemption from registration is available. The Order also froze the assets of FLIC, GEBCO, Plaza and Creative, along with the personal assets of Edward Boyer. FPSC was ordered to keep current and to preserve records relating to its broker-dealer business as required by law and a certified public accountant was appointed to review the books and records of defendants FLIC, GEBCO, Plaza and Creative and to file with the Court inventory and status reports and current financial statements.

The Commission filed a complaint on January 31 alleging violations of the registration and antifraud provisions of the securities laws by said defendants, and defendant FPSC failed to keep and maintain its broker-dealer books and records as required by law. (SEC v. First Pittsburgh Securities Corp., et al., W.D. of Pa., Civil Action No. 77-102). (LR-777)

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## INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

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### THE WILLOW FUND

An order has been issued on an application of The Willow Fund, Inc.
