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## ENFORCEMENT PROCEEDINGS

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### COMMISSION DENIES MOTION BY MELVIN RICHARDS TO SET ASIDE DEFAULT

The Commission denied Melvin Lloyd Richards' motion to set aside a default that had been entered against Richards on May 30, 1973, barring him from association with any broker or dealer. In May 1972, the Commission had instituted an administrative proceeding against Richards, among others, alleging that Richards had engaged in the sale of unregistered securities, made false and misleading statements about certain securities, and had attempted to acquire a broker-dealer in an attempt to continue the operations of a second revoked broker-dealer.

Notice of the proceeding was sent to Richards' home address by certified mail. While Richards did not file an answer, he appeared as a witness at one of the hearings. His counsel subsequently informed the Commission's staff that Richards would not appear at subsequent hearings. The order of default was served on his counsel, and was referred to in complaints served on Richards in both a 1979 Commission injunctive action and a 1992 NASD disciplinary proceeding referred to in the 1973 default order. The Commission denied Richards' motion, concluding that Richards had adequate notice of the entry of the default order against him and had given no explanation why he waited over twenty years to set aside the default. ### IN THE MATTER OF BARRY SILVESTAIN, LAWRENCE GREENBERG, BENNIE SILVESTAIN AND WENNER, SILVESTAIN & CO.

Barry H. Silvestain, CPA, Lawrence L. Greenberg, CPA, Bennie Silvestain, CPA and Wenner, Silvestain & Co., a small accounting firm located in Denver, Colorado, have consented, pursuant to Rule 2(e) of the Commission's Rules of Practice, to the entry of an Opinion and Order by the Commission. The Opinion and Order censures each of them, denies Barry H. Silvestain the privilege of practicing before the Commission with the right to apply for readmission in two years, temporarily suspends Lawrence L. Greenberg and Bennie Silvestain for 60 days, and imposes certain requirements on the firm if it is to continue practicing or appearing before the Commission.

The Commission found that in connection with Wenner, Silvestain & Co.'s audit of the financial statements of U.S. Mint & Co. for the six month period ended February 28, 1990, Barry H. Silvestain, the engagement partner, Lawrence L. Greenberg, the detail review partner, and Bennie Silvestain, the concurring partner failed to follow generally accepted auditing standards by, among other things, failing to obtain sufficient competent evidence to support a transaction that was material to the financial statements, and thereby engaged in improper professional conduct within the meaning of Rule 2(e)(1) of the Commission's Rules of Practice. #### COMPLAINT FILED AGAINST DONNA TUMMINIA AND PHILIP TUMMINIA

The Commission announced filing of a civil injunctive action in the United States District Court for the Southern District of New York against Donna and Philip Tumminia. The complaint alleges violations of Section 17(a) of the Securities Act, Section 10(b) of the Securities Exchange Act and Rule 10b-5 thereunder and Sections 34 and 37 of the Investment Company Act and alleges that the Tumminias aided and abetted violations of Sections 206(1) and 206(2) of the Investment Advisers Act.

According to the complaint, while Ms. Tumminia was head trader at Shearson Lehman Advisors (SLA) and Mr. Tumminia was a direct access broker at the New York Stock Exchange, Ms. Tumminia concealed from SLA the volume of commissions that she was directing to her husband. The complaint alleges that defendants also caused SLA's clients to pay excessive imputed commissions on riskless principal trades, and that Ms. Tumminia falsified trading records to conceal the scheme.

Without admitting or denying the allegations, the defendants consented to entry of a Final Judgment permanently enjoining them from future violations and ordering disgorgement of \$617,314.62, including prejudgment interest, and civil penalties of \$617,314.62. The Commission acknowledged the assistance of the New York Stock Exchange in investigating this matter. [SEC v. Donna Tumminia and Philip Tumminia, 92-Civ. No. 6286 (CBM), U.S.D.C. - S.D.N.Y.] (LR - 14217)

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#### INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

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#### EQUITABLE LIFE INSURANCE COMPANY OF IOWA

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until September 26 to request a hearing on an application filed by Equitable Life Insurance Company of Iowa (Equitable), Equitable Separate Account A (Separate Account), and Equitable of Iowa Securities Network, Inc. (collectively, Applicants). Applicants seek an order under Section 6(c) of the Investment Company Act granting exemptions from the provisions of Sections 22(d), 26(a)(2)(C) and 27(c)(2) of the Act. Applicants request exemptive relief to permit the deduction or mortality and expenses

risk charges from the assets of the Separate Account in connection with the offering of individual deferred variable annuity contracts (contracts). The exemption would also permit the deduction of mortality and expense risk charges from the assets of any other separate account established by Equitable in the future to fund other variable annuity contracts that will be similar to the contracts and the waiver, under certain circumstances, of the contingent deferred withdrawal charge that would otherwise be imposed on certain variable annuity contracts. #### AMERICAN ENTERPRISE LIFE INSURANCE COMPANY

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until September 26 to request a hearing on an application by American Enterprise Life Insurance Company (American Enterprise Life), American Enterprise Variable Annuity Account (the Variable Account), and IDS Financial Services Inc. Applicants request an order pursuant to Section 6(c) of the Investment Company Act granting exemptions from Sections 22(d), 26(a)(2)(C), and 27(c)(2) thereof to the extent necessary to permit the deduction of a mortality and expense risk charge from the assets of existing and future subaccounts of the Variable Account or any other subaccounts established in the future by American Enterprise Life to support individual deferred fixed/variable annuity contracts (the Contracts). The exemption would also permit the application of the Waiver of Withdrawal Charges benefit under certain of those Contracts. (Rel. IC-20523 - September 1)

#### FIRST INVESTORS CASH MANAGEMENT FUND, INC.

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until September 26 to request a hearing on an application filed by First Investors Cash Management Fund Inc., et al. for an order under Section 6(c) of the Investment Company Act. The order would exempt applicants from Sections 2(a)(32), 2(a)(35), 18(f)(1), 18(g), 18(i), 22(c), and 22(d) of the Act and Rule 22c-1 thereunder. The order would permit certain investment companies to issue multiple classes of shares representing interests in the same portfolio of securities and assess, and under certain circumstances waive, a contingent deferred sales charge on redemptions of shares. (Rel. IC-20524 - September 1)

#### MUTUAL FUNDS FOR CREDIT UNIONS

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until September 26 to request a hearing on an application filed by Mutual Funds For Credit Unions, Inc. for an order under Section 8(f) of the Investment Company Act declaring that applicant has ceased to be an investment company. (Rel. IC-20525 - September 1)

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**APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGES**

The Commission approved a proposed rule change (SR-NSCC-94-12) filed by the National Securities Clearing Corporation establishing a permanent New York Window Service. (Rel. 34-34629)

**NOTICE OF FILING OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE**

On August 18, 1994, the Municipal Securities Rulemaking Board filed a proposed rule change under Rule 19b-4 to amend MSRB Rule G-37 on political contributions and prohibitions on municipal securities business and MSRB rule G-8 on recordkeeping. Publication of the proposal in the Federal Register is expected during the week of September 6. (Rel. 34-34630)
