## ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

### ORCHARDS ACCOUNTING AND TAX SERVICE, INC.'s APPLICATION TO BECOME INVESTMENT ADVISER DENIED

The Commission accepted the offers of settlement of Orchards Accounting and Tax Service, Inc. (Applicant), Orchards Accounting and Tax Service (Orchards), David A. Hunt of Vancouver, Washington, and Ronald G. Vogeltanz of Hillsboro, Oregon. Applicant consents to findings that it wilfully violated Section 207 of the Investment Advisers Act of 1940 and consents to denial of its application to become registered as an investment adviser with the Commission.

Hunt, Vogeltanz and Orchards consented to findings that they wilfully violated the registration and antifraud provisions of the Securities Act, the antifraud and broker-dealer registration provisions of the Exchange Act, and Section 207 of the Advisers Act. Hunt and Orchards also consented to findings that they wilfully violated the registration and antifraud provisions of the Advisers Act. Hunt and Vogeltanz consented to a 30-day suspension barring them from association with any broker, dealer or investment adviser.

As a further part of the settlement, the Commission, on April 17, sued Hunt, Vogeltanz, Orchards and Applicant in the Federal District Court for the District of Oregon seeking an injunction from further violations of the registration and antifraud provisions of the Advisers Act. Without admitting or denying the allegations of the complaint, the defendants stipulated to an order so enjoining them which was entered by Judge James A. Redden, Federal District Court for the District of Oregon on April 19. (Rel. 34-20904)

### PROCEEDINGS INSTITUTED AGAINST BURTON R. SAX AND ABLE MANAGEMENT, INC.

The Commission instituted public administrative proceedings under the Investment Company Act and the Advisers Act against Able Management, Inc., a previously registered investment adviser, and Burton R. Sax, its president. Simultaneously, the Commission accepted an Offer of Settlement in which Sax and Able Management, without admitting or denying the alleged violations, consented to the Findings and Order censuring them and requiring them to comply with certain undertakings.

Specifically, the Commission found that Able Management wilfully violated and Sax aided and abetted wilfull violations of the antifraud provisions of the Advisers Act. They employed schemes to defraud their client, Able Associates Fund, a registered investment company, by failing to obtain best price and execution for the Fund on its portfolio transactions. The Commission also found violations of the filing and books and records, pricing of Fund shares, advisory contract, and affiliated transaction provisions of the Investment Company Act. The undertakings provide that Sax and Able Management not register as, or become associated with, an investment adviser, and that Sax not serve or act in the capacity of officer, director or employee of a registered investment company without prior Commission approval. ## CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

### CIVIL ACTION FILED AGAINST PETROLEUM INVESTMENTS, LTD. AND THE EGOLF COMPANY

The Commission filed a civil injunctive action on May 10 in the U.S. District Court for the District of Columbia against Petroleum Investments, Ltd. (PIL) and The Egolf Company, both of Oklahoma City, Oklahoma. The complaint alleges that: PIL, as part of a continuing course of conduct in violation of the reporting requirements of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 and which extended over more than 18 months, failed to timely file reports on Forms 10-K and 10-Q; Egolf Co., as PIL's general partner, was responsible for the preparation and filing of such reports; and Egolf Co., as the general partner for five other oil and gas limited partnerships registered with

the Commission, was responsible for such other limited partnerships filing untimely reports on Forms 10-K and 10-Q within the last two years.

The Commission requested that the Court enjoin PIL and Egolf Co. from future violations of the reporting requirements of the Exchange. (SEC v. Petroleum Investments, Ltd. and The Egolf Company, USDC DC, Civil Action No. 84-1469). (LR-10372)

#### CABLE/TEL CORP. INJUNCTIVE ACTION CONCLUDED

The New York Regional Office announced the conclusion of the civil injunctive action captioned SEC v. Cable/Tel Corp., et al., by the issuance of the following judgments: Benjamin Rabin, Continental Consultants Corp., Frank Van Arsdale, and Van Ron Inc. were enjoined from violating the registration provisions of the Securities Act; Irving Bersak, Michael Buzzeo and Haims & Co., P.C. were enjoined from violating the registration and antifraud provisions of the Securities Act, and the antifraud provisions of the Exchange Act; and Investors Planning Group, Inc., Tom Kaye and Arnold H. Bruck were enjoined from violating the registration and antifraud provisions of the Securities Act. These judgments were issued by Judge Morris E. Lasker, U.S. District Court for the Southern District of New York, and were entered upon the consents of the above defendants, who did not admit or deny the Commission's substantive allegations.

In addition, orders of voluntary dismissal were issued against Martin E. Hecht on January 27, 1984 and against Haims & Co. on July 31, 1981. The order pertaining to Hecht expressly noted that appellate review of an injunction issued against him in another Commission injunctive action had been concluded [SEC v. Aqua-Sonic Products Corp., 687 F.2d 577 (2d Cir.), cert. denied, 103 S.Ct. 568 (1982)]. (SEC v. Cable/Tel Corp., et al., 80 Civil 7170, SDNY). (LR-10365)

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## INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

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#### CRUSADER FUND, INC.

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until June 4 to request a hearing on a proposal of the Commission to declare by order on its own motion that Crusader Fund, Inc., a registered open-end, diversified, management investment company, has ceased to be an investment company. #### THE SECURITIES GROUPS GOVERNMENT INCOME FUND, INC. ; THE SECURITIES GROUPS MONEY FUND, INC.

Orders have been issued declaring that The Securities Groups Government Income Fund, Inc. and The Securities Groups Money Fund, Inc., registered open-end, diversified, management investment companies, have ceased to be investment companies. (Rel. IC-13935; IC-13936)

#### AUSTRALIA AND NEW ZEALAND BANKING GROUP LIMITED

An order has been issued exempting Australia and New Zealand Banking Group Limited and ANZ (Delaware) Inc. from all provisions of the Investment Company Act in their proposed issuance of commercial paper in the United States. (Rel. IC-13937 - May 9)

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## HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

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#### INDIANA & MICHIGAN ELECTRIC COMPANY

An order has been issued authorizing Indiana & Michigan Electric Company, subsidiary of American Electric Power Company, Inc., to extend until December 31, 1986 an increase in its unsecured debt limit. An order was previously issued authorizing the solicitation of proxies in connection therewith. (Rel. 35-23303 - May 9)

#### THE COLUMBIA GAS SYSTEM, INC.

A supplemental order has been issued authorizing certain intrasystem financing among The Columbia Gas System, Inc., a registered holding company, and two of its subsidiaries, Columbia Gas of Ohio, Inc. and Columbia Gas of Kentucky, Inc. Jurisdiction has been reserved over certain transactions by other subsidiaries as to which the record is not yet complete. (Rel. 35-23304 - May 10)

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### NOTICE OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The New York Stock Exchange, Inc. filed a proposed rule change (SR-NYSE-84-13) to permit members to bid for or offer all index options at intervals of one-sixteenth of \$100 regardless of the size of the premium. Publication of the proposal is expected to be made in the Federal Register during the week of May 7. (Rel. 34-20937)

### EFFECTIVENESS OF A PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

A rule change filed by the National Securities Clearing Corporation has become effective under Section 19(b)(3)(A) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. The proposed rule change (SR-NSCC-84-8) concerns NSCC's processing of information recorded by brokers executing trades on the New York Stock Exchange. (Rel. 34-20939)

Persons eligible to use the short form (Schedule 13G) may in lieu of filing a Schedule 13D file a Schedule 13G within 45 days after the end of the calendar year in which the person became subject to Section 13(d)(1). Companies and individuals making a tender offer must have on file at the time the tender offer commences a Schedule 14D-1.
