CHANGE IN THE MEETING: Deletions/additional item

The following items will not be considered at the open meeting scheduled for Thursday, October 16 at 10:00 a.m.:

(1) Consideration of whether to approve rule proposals submitted by the American Stock Exchange, Inc. and the New York Stock Exchange, Inc. Both proposals would ease restrictions imposed on an approved person affiliated with a specialist if an adequate "Chinese Wall" were established between the approved person and the specialist. (2) Consideration of whether to issue a release adopting amendments to Securities Exchange Act Rule 15c3-1 that would expand the types of instruments that could be used to create a hedged position in highly rated corporate debt securities. The amendments would also lower the deductions from net worth in arriving at net capital for hedged corporate debt securities positions and would redefine the criteria for determining whether the maturities of two offsetting positions are close enough to consider the combined corporate debt securities position as hedged for purposes of Rule 15c3-1. CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

INJUNCTIVE AND OTHER RELIEF SOUGHT AGAINST LARRY B. GROOVER, OTHERS

The Commission today filed an action in the U.S. District Court for the District of Columbia seeking injunctive and other relief against Larry B. Groover, a financial planner in Salt Lake City, Utah, and eight other defendants. The Commission alleged violations of antifraud provisions of the Securities Act of 1933, the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, and the Investment Advisers Act of 1940; the registration provisions of the Securities Act in the offer and sale of a number of securities; the broker-dealer registration provision of the Exchange Act; the investment adviser registration provision of the Advisers Act; and the investment company registration provision of the Investment Company Act. Also named as defendants were Balanced Financial Management, Inc., a financial planning sales organization, and its affiliate, ProTech Accounting Corporation; two Nevada corporations, Quantum Financial Services, Inc. and QFS Productions, Inc.; G.C. Technologies, Inc., a Utah corporation; Dale F. Myers, an attorney; and two business associates of Groover, Marvin D. Haney and D. Neal Marlett. (SEC v. INJUNCTIVE ACTION FILED AGAINST K.A. KNAPP & CO., INC. AND KIRK A. KNAPP

The Chicago Regional Office filed a complaint seeking preliminary and permanent injunctive action on September 30 against K.A. Knapp & Co., Inc. and Kirk A. Knapp in the U.S. District Court for the Western District of Michigan, Southern Division.

The complaint alleged that for several months in 1985 and 1986 Knapp & Co., a registered broker-dealer located in Grand Rapids, Michigan, violated Sections 15(c) and 17(a) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 and Rules 15c3-3 (customer protection), 17a-3 (bookkeeping), 17a-5 (financial reporting) and 17a-11 (supplemental reporting). The complaint further alleged that Knapp, the founder and 98% shareholder of Knapp & Co., aided and abetted the above violations by entering false security transactions on the firm's books and records and by delivering to the firm personal checks drawn against insufficient funds to conceal the firm's customer reserve account funding deficiencies. (SEC v. K.A. Knapp & Co., Inc., et al., Civil Action No. G-86-905-CAL, filed September 30, 1986). (LR-11243)

COMPLAINT NAMES RICHARD HIGGINS, OTHERS

The San Francisco Branch Office filed a complaint on September 29 in the Federal District Court in Salt Lake City, Utah, seeking permanent injunctions, accountings, and disgorgement against Richard Ames Higgins, Paul E. Henderson and Lee R. Holt. Each served as an officer and director of Properties Limited Client Investment Corporation, a Utah corporation, now defunct. The Commission's five-count complaint charges one or more of the defendants with multiple instances of securities fraud, selling unregistered stock, operating as an unregistered broker-dealer, and operating as an unregistered investment adviser. One of the primary allegations is that the defendants paid amounts purported to be profits from investments to some investors when, in fact, none of the company's investments were profitable and the payments to investors, in reality, consisted of money received by Properties Limited from new investors. (SEC v. Richard Ames Higgins, et al., Civ. No. 86-C-886W, D. Utah). (LR-11244)

INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

GREATER WASHINGTON INVESTORS, INC.

An order has been issued exempting Greater Washington Investors, Inc.'s proposed acquisition of certain debt securities of a portfolio affiliate from Section 17(a)(3) of the Investment Company Act and permitting the concurrent investment by Greater Washington and Research Industries, Inc., an upstream affiliate of Greater Washington, in the offering of debt securities, and preferred stock warrants by the portfolio affiliate. (Rel. IC-15352 - Oct. 9)

HARTFORD LIFE INSURANCE COMPANY

An order has been issued exempting Hartford Life Insurance Company, Hartford Life Insurance Company Separate Account Two (Account), and Hartford Equity Sales Company, Inc. from the provisions of Sections 26(a)(2)(C) and 27(c)(2) of the Investment Company Act to permit the deduction of mortality and expense risk charges from the Account in connection with the issuance of certain flexible premium deferred combination fixed/variable annuity contracts. HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

ARKANSAS POWER AND LIGHT COMPANY; NEW ORLEANS PUBLIC SERVICE, INC.; MONONGAHELA POWER COMPANY; GRANITE STATE ELECTRIC COMPANY

Notices have been issued giving interested persons until November 3 to request a hearing on a proposal by the following companies under the same release: Arkansas Power and Light Company - subsidiary of Middle South Utilities, Inc., to amend its nuclear fuel leasing agreement; New Orleans Public Service, Inc. - subsidiary of Middle South Utilities, Inc., to issue and sell up to \$30 million in aggregate principal amount of secured notes under an exception from competitive bidding; Monongahela Power Company, The Potomac Edison Company, and West Penn Power Company - subsidiaries of Allegheny Power System, Inc., to issue and sell first mortgage bonds from time to time through December 31, 1987 in maximum principal amounts of up to \$105 million, \$70 million, and \$35 million, respectively. The proceeds are to be used primarily to redeem currently outstanding first mortgage bonds; and Granite State Electric Company - subsidiary of New England Electric System, to issue and sell to an institutional investor(s), on or before December 31, 1987, a long-term promissory note(s) in an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$5 million, under a Note Agreement to be negotiated. Granite has been granted an exception from the competitive bidding requirements of Rule 50, under Rule 50(a)(5) of the Public Utility Holding Company Act. (Rel. 35-24211 - Oct. 9)
