ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

**MORTON PAUL KOMINSKY d/b/a MORTON KOMINSKY REVOKED;
KOMINSKY BARRED FROM PROPRIETARY, MANAGERIAL, PRINCIPAL
OR SUPERVISORY ROLE**

Administrative Law Judge David J. Markun has issued an initial decision revoking the registration as a broker-dealer of Morton Paul Kominsky, doing business as Morton Kominsky and barring Kominsky, the firm's sole proprietor and only principal, with a proviso that after a period of sixty days Kominsky may apply to become associated with a broker-dealer in a non-proprietary, non-principal, non-supervisory and non-managerial capacity upon a satisfactory showing to the Commission that he will be adequately supervised.

The sanctions were imposed on the basis of findings that Respondents, in late 1980 and early 1981, committed or aided and abetted the commission of numerous and extensive violations of the broker-dealer registration, net capital, bookkeeping, customer protection, margin, financial reporting, supplemental reporting, and finger printing provisions of the securities laws and regulations issued thereunder. On July 29, 1981, Registrant and Kominsky were permanently enjoined on consent without admitting or denying the allegations in the Commission's complaint, from further violating or aiding and abetting violations of numerous securities laws and regulations thereunder, on the basis of allegations that are in substance identical to the allegations contained in the Commission's order for proceeding in the instant administrative proceedings, by the United States District Court for the Eastern District of New York.

In assessing the sanctions imposed, Judge Markun took into account in addition to the findings of violations and the issuance of the injunctions by the U.S. District Court, among other things, findings that Respondents had had a ten or eleven year history of numerous similar violations found in investigations by the Commission and the NASD and that Kominsky, in February of 1981, when his firm was being examined by Commission personnel, attempted to mislead the Commission's investigator respecting the firm's net capital position.

The decision is subject to review by the Commission on its own motion or on petition of a party.

NORMAN KATES BARRED

The Commission announced that it has entered Findings and an Order Imposing Remedial Sanctions in connection with an administrative proceeding against Norman Kates of Downsview, Ontario, Canada. Kates was associated as a registered representative with a broker-dealer in Toronto that was registered with the Commission. The Commission's order was entered pursuant to an offer of settlement submitted by Kates in which he neither admitted nor denied the allegations contained in the Order for Proceedings, and in which he consented to findings of violations and the sanction imposed.

Based upon the Order for Proceedings and the Offer of Settlement, the Commission found that Kates wilfully violated the registration provisions of the Securities Act of 1933, and specified antifraud provisions of the Securities Act and Securities Exchange Act of 1934; and that he wilfully aided and abetted violations of the anti-fraud provisions of the Exchange Act, all in connection with transactions in the common stock of Temple Explorations, Inc.

Based on the above findings and the Offer of Settlement, Kates was barred from association with any broker or dealer; provided, however, that after five years from the date of the Commission's Order so barring him, Kates may apply to the Commission to become associated with a broker or dealer in a non-supervisory and non-proprietary capacity, upon a showing of adequate supervision. CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

CORDON INTERNATIONAL CORP. ENJOINED

The Commission announced that on February 2 the U.S. District Court for the District of Columbia enjoined Cordon International Corp. of Los Angeles, California, which engages in oil development and production and, through subsidiaries, the sale of logistic air support and helicopter services, from failing to file timely periodic reports with the Commission and ordered it to comply with certain undertakings.

The Commission's complaint, filed on August 19, 1981, alleged that as part of a continuing course of conduct extending over several years, Cordon failed to file certain annual and quarterly reports. Cordon, in consenting to entry of Judgment against it, admitted failure to file reports on 12 separate occasions. (SEC v. Cordon International Corp., U.S.D.C. D.C., Civil Action No. 81-1949). INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

MUNICIPAL FUND FOR TEMPORARY INVESTMENT, INC.

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until March 1 to request a hearing on an application filed by Municipal Fund for Temporary Investment, Inc., an open-end, diversified, management investment company, for an order pursuant to Section 6(c) of the Investment Company Act of 1940 amending a previous order dated December 19, 1980 (Rel. IC-11500). The prior order exempted Applicant from the provisions of Section 2(a)(41) of the Act and Rules 2a-4 and 22c-1 thereunder, to the extent necessary to permit Applicant to value its portfolio securities by use of the amortized cost valuation method. Applicant now seeks to (1) purchase and value at amortized cost variable rate demand notes maturing on a date more than one year after purchase and (2) consider the maturity of such notes to be the longer of (a) the notice period required prior to prepayment under the demand privilege (not to exceed seven days) or (b) the period remaining until the next interest rate adjustment (not to exceed one year). HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

MIDDLE SOUTH UTILITIES, INC.

A supplemental order has been issued authorizing a proposal by Middle South Utilities, Inc., a registered holding company, and its five subsidiaries, Middle South Energy, Inc., Arkansas Power & Light Company, Louisiana Power & Light Company, Mississippi Power & Light Company and New Orleans Public Service, Inc., for Middle South Energy to enter into an amendment to a previously authorized bank loan agreement for up to \$1.4 billion of borrowings for the Grand Gulf project. The amendment would revise, among other things, certain prepayment provisions of the loan agreement to conform with a foreign bank loan facility. Jurisdiction is released over the fees, commissions and expenses to be incurred in connection with the proposed transactions. (Rel. 35-22383 - Feb. 4)

NOTICE OF EFFECTIVENESS OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

A rule change filed by the Stock Clearing Corporation of Philadelphia, pursuant to Rule 19b-4, (SR-SCCP-81-4) has become effective in accordance with Section 19(b)(3)(A) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. The rule change adopts specific sanctions to be imposed on participants that fail to make timely money settlement. Publication of the proposal is expected to be made in the Federal Register during the week of February 8. (Rel. 34-18470)
