CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

U.S. SECURITIES AND EXCHANGE COMMISSION

LONGLEAF, INCORPORATED, FRED R. LAWRENCE,
AND 21 OTHERS PERMANENTLY ENJOINED

The Atlanta Regional Office announced that on February 18 the Honorable Richard C. Erwin, U.S. District Judge, Middle District of North Carolina, entered a Final Judgment of Permanent Injunction enjoining Longleaf, Incorporated (Longleaf), Lee-Moore Mortgage Company, Lee Mortgage Co., Seven Lakes Financial Company, Seven Lakes Mortgage Co., Professional Investors Corporation, Seven Lakes Investment Group, Inc., F.R. Lawrence and Company (Lawrence and Co.), all North Carolina corporations; Peter V. Tufts & Associates, Seven Lakes Investment Company, Seven Lakes and Associates, Seven Lakes, Ltd., Seven Lakes Land Company, Seven Lakes-Longleaf Company, Seven Lakes West, Seven Lakes Shopping Center, Commercial Developers & Associates, Seven Lakes Townhouses & Associates, Seven Lakes Leasing Company, Lawrence Land Associates, Lawrence Investment Company (LIC), all North Carolina limited partnerships; Seven Lakes Funding Company, a general partnership; and Fred R. Lawrence (Lawrence), of West End, North Carolina, an officer and director of the defendant corporations and a general partner of most of the defendant limited partnerships either directly or indirectly through a corporation which he controls, from further violations of the registration and antifraud provisions of the securities laws in connection with the offer and sale of common stock, limited partnership interests, promissory notes, investment contracts, evidences of indebtedness (hereinafter, the securities), or any other security, issued by the defendant entities. In addition, the Final Judgment permanently enjoins Lawrence & Co., LIC, and Lawrence from further violations of the registration provisions of the Investment Company Act of 1940. The defendants consented to the entry of the Final Judgment, without admitting or denying the allegations in the Commission's complaint.

The Commission's complaint filed February 16, 1982 alleged, *inter alia*, that during the period 1973 to the present, and at various times therein, Longleaf, Lawrence, and the entities violated the antifraud provisions of the federal securities laws in the offer and sale of the securities by making material misrepresentations of fact and/or omitting to state material facts concerning: (1) the financial condition of Longleaf and another entity; (2) the value of collateral pledged to secure the investment; (3) the payment of commissions, and (4) prior operating losses sustained by the issuers.

In addition, the complaint alleged that at various times from 1973 to the present, Lawrence & Co. and LIC, aided and abetted by Lawrence, held themselves out as and engaged in business as investment companies while not registered with the Commission pursuant to Section 8 of the Investment Company Act. (SEC v. Longleaf, Incorporated, et al., Civil Action No. C-82-211-R, M.D.N.C. filed February 16, 1982.) (LR-9607)

CURTIS R. RICHMOND ORDERED INTO CUSTODY FOR WILLFUL CONTEMPT OF COURT

The Los Angeles Regional Office announced that on February 1 the Honorable Consuelo B. Marshall, Judge of the U.S. District Court for the Central District of California ordered defendant Curtis R. Richmond of Los Angeles, California into the custody of the U.S. Marshall based upon its prior order of November 9, 1981. That order held defendant Richmond in civil contempt for failing to pay fees to a special auditor appointed by the Court to prepare certain financial information for investors in Richmond's investment program.

Although Richmond appealed the order of civil contempt on December 9, 1981, he filed a motion in the District Court on February 1, 1982 seeking a stay pending appeal which the Court denied on that day. The Court stayed the order remanding Richmond into custody until February 4, 1982. On February 3, 1982, the Court denied Richmond's motion seeking to file a performance bond in the District Court providing for payment pending appeal. Also, on February 4, 1982, the Ninth Circuit Court of Appeals denied defendant Richmond's emergency motion for stay pending appeal. Immediately thereafter,

Richmond paid the outstanding balance of the fees to the special auditor, and the Court vacated its order remanding Richmond into custody. (SEC v. Curtis R. Richmond, U.S.D.C. C.D. Calif., Civil Action No. 80-3239-CBM.) (LR-9609)

SIPC TRUSTEE APPOINTED FOR INTERNATIONAL SECURITIES, INC.

The Denver Regional Office announced that pursuant to the consent of the defendant, an Order appointing a SIPC trustee to liquidate International Securities, Inc., a Denver, Colorado, broker-dealer, was entered by Chief Judge Fred Winner, U.S. District Court for the District of Colorado, on February 25, 1982. On that date, SIPC filed an Application seeking appointment of such a trustee. (SEC v. International Securities, Inc., USDC, Colorado, Civil Action File No. 82-W-276.) (LR-9610)

CRIMINAL PROCEEDINGS

PAUL F. KENDRICK CONVICTED OF SECURITIES FRAUD AND PERJURY

The San Francisco Branch Office announced that on February 26 a jury returned a verdict of guilty on three of four counts against Paul F. Kendrick of Atherton, California, after a federal criminal trial in San Francisco.

Kendrick had been charged with three counts of securities fraud and with one count of perjury. Kendrick, president of Paul Kendrick & Co., Inc., a securities broker-dealer, was charged with looting funds from customer accounts in 1976, and with lying to an officer of the Commission during an investigation concerning his handling of his customers' accounts. Kendrick was found guilty of two of the three fraud counts and the perjury count. (U.S. v. Paul F. Kendrick, Crim. No. 81-312-WWS, N.D. Calif.) (LR-9608)

INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

RENAISSANCE READY ASSETS TRUST

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until April 5 to request a hearing on an application of Renaissance Ready Assets Trust (Applicant) for an order conditionally exempting Applicant from the provisions of Section 2(a)(41) of the Investment Company Act of 1940 and Rules 2a-4 and 22c-1 thereunder, to the extent necessary to permit Applicant to calculate the net asset value per share of each of Applicant's two authorized series of shares of beneficial interest using the amortized cost method of valuation.
