COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENTS

CONFERENCE OF SECURITIES REGULATORS

Officials responsible for regulating securities and securities markets throughout the world will gather in Washington next week to attend the VII Interamerican Conference of Securities Commissions and Similar Organizations. The Commission is hosting the Conference for the first time in the history of the event, which was first held in Caracas, Venezuela in 1975. More than 30 countries are expected to be represented.

The opening address will be given by Dr. Beryl W. Sprinkel, Under Secretary of the Treasury for Monetary Affairs, at a plenary session beginning at 10:00 a.m. Monday, May 24, in the Eugene Black Auditorium at the World Bank Building, Washington, D.C. Other plenary sessions, all in the Eugene Black Auditorium, will be held on Monday afternoon, on Tuesday morning and afternoon, and on Friday morning.

Space limitations preclude public observation of the Conference. A limited number of press representatives will be accommodated, but arrangements must be made in advance. (PR 82-30)

MARKET REGULATION APPOINTMENTS

Douglas Scarff, Director of the Division of Market Regulation, announced the appointments of Richard T. Chase as Assistant Director, Exchanges and Options, Office of Self-Regulatory Oversight, and Brandon Becker as Assistant Director, National Market System and Over-the-Counter, Office of Self-Regulatory Oversight.

Mr. Chase graduated from Macalester College in St. Paul, Minnesota in 1973. Upon graduation from Harvard Law School in 1977, he joined the Commission as a staff attorney in the Division of Market Regulation, and became Branch Chief for Options Regulation in 1980. As Assistant Director, Mr. Chase will be responsible for overseeing the self-regulatory programs of the national securities exchanges.

Mr. Becker received his LLM degree from Columbia University in 1979, his J.D. degree from the University of San Diego in 1977, and his B.A. degree from the University of Minnesota in 1974. He joined the Division of Market Regulation as a staff attorney and was appointed a Branch Chief in 1980. In February of 1981, he became legal assistant to Commissioner Barbara S. Thomas. As Assistant Director, he will coordinate a broad range of legal and policy matters in connection with the development of a national market system and its oversight of over-the-counter and municipal securities markets.

ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

AMERICAN CAPITAL CORPORATION OF DELAWARE AND DENNIS R. KITTLER CITED

> The Commission announced the institution of administrative proceedings pursuant to the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 against American Capital Corporation of Delaware, a Denver, Colorado SECO broker-dealer (Registrant), and Dennis R. Kittler of Liberty, Texas, Registrant's chief executive officer. Simultaneously with the institution of the proceedings, the Commission accepted an Offer of Settlement submitted by Registrant and Kittler in which each consented to the entry of the findings and the imposition of the sanctions described below without admitting or denying the Commission's allegations.

The Commission's Order found that Registrant wilfully violated and Kittler wilfully aided and abetted violations of, among other provisions, the broker-dealer filing, recordkeeping, and net capital requirements of the Exchange Act. The Commission also found that Registrant and Kittler wilfully violated the antifraud provisions of the securities laws in the offer and sale of limited partnership interests in the ACC-1980-1 Drilling Fund.

Based upon the above, the Commission has suspended Kittler from association with any broker or dealer for a period of three months. In addition, the Commission has barred Kittler from association with any broker or dealer other than as a supervised employee in a non-supervisory, non-proprietary capacity, provided, however, that at the end of a two-year period, Kittler may apply to the Commission for permission to associate with a broker-dealer in such capacity. Registrant undertakes to withdraw its broker-dealer registration by filing Form BD-W with the Commission within ten days following the date of the Commission's Order. (Rel. 34-18720)

CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

MORE UP THAN DOWN, INC. AND CHARLES FRIEDMAN ENJOINED

The Chicago Regional Office announced that the Honorable Judge White, U.S. District Judge for the Northern District of Ohio in Cleveland, entered Final Judgments of Permanent Injunction against More Up Than Down, Inc. and Charles Friedman pursuant to a complaint filed by the Commission on April 22, 1982. The defendants consented to the entry of the Judgments without admitting or denying any of the substantive allegations of the complaint. The Judgments enjoin the defendants from further violations of the antifraud provisions of the Securities Act of 1933 and the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, and the registration, recordkeeping, investment advisory contract and antifraud provisions of the Investment Advisers Act of 1940. The complaint alleged that the violations occurred in connection with the solicitation of funds from public investors and the investment of those funds in stock options. (SEC v. NOTICE OF EFFECTIVENESS OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGES

Rule changes filed by the following, pursuant to Rule 19b-4, have become effective in accordance with Section 19(b)(3)(A) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934:

The Philadelphia Depository Trust Company (SR-Philadep-82-4) which amends Philadep's Rule 22 (Bills Rendered) to refer to a separately published fee schedule. In addition, Philadep has made several changes in its rate schedules. In general, Philadep has designed the fee changes to offset increases in operating costs, especially in labor intensive areas. Philadep has also established a new rebate against its charges based upon individual participant's exchange trading volume and use of Philadep services. (Rel. 34-18746); and The Stock Clearing Corporation of Philadelphia (SR-SCCP-82-4) which amends SCCP's Rule 23 to remove the rate schedules of SCCP and the Philadelphia Depository Trust Company (Philadep) from the rule and instead to reference rate schedules published separately. In addition, SCCP has reduced the volume discount on trade recording in connection with offering a credit on Philadep charges based on trading volume. (Rel. 34-18747)
